Message from the Pastor

When I am afraid, I put my trust in you.
In God, whose word I praise—
in God I trust and am not afraid.
Psalm 56: 3-4

Many of you know that back in September, I found a kitten in a ditch. She weighed only a little over half a pound, and I think had become exhausted from trying to keep up with her mother. A warm bed and good food (plus de-worming and de-fleaing) soon restored her to health. She was frightened for the first couple days we had her, but quickly realized no one was going to hurt her. She began to enjoy ear rubs and chewing on fingers with her tiny teeth. It wasn't long before a surprisingly raucous purr emerged. We named her Pumpkin, because she seemed like our Halloween kitten.

Pumpkin has thrived. She turns most ordinary tasks in our house into a 3-ring circus with her energetic antics. But she is also a cuddler. When she finally wears out, she loves to find a warm lap and be stroked into a stupor. She was feral—born wild and unaccustomed to human touch. But with love and nurture, she has come to depend on and trust her human family.

So I've had ample opportunity to ponder trust lately. As Pumpkin lays with such faith in my lap, knowing that I have only good for her, it convicts me. I wonder if I trust God half as much as she trusts me.

As the church, we face uncertain times. Our culture is increasingly secular. Our denomination is wrestling with issues of human sexuality and division. Our congregation isn't growing as we would like it to. The temptation is there to focus on the negative and give up efforts to grow the Kingdom of God among us. I get that; but, we need to keep in mind that this is the opposite of the trust and faith we are called to.

When Lazarus was sealed in the tomb, his sisters thought it was over, but Jesus changed that. When Jesus died on the cross, his disciples thought it was over, but they couldn't have been more wrong. When the early church was persecuted, many thought it was lights out for the faithful, but they were mistaken.

Our God is one of reversals, transformation and new life. All he requires from us is faith—faith of heart and action. So we worship and pray and read scripture. We minister and serve and call forth the Kingdom with our love. And we trust in our God of mercy and redemption.

In an act of faith, we continue to reach out to our community. The Vision Team is working on two new projects to accomplish this. On Sunday, December 17, we will be offering a parents' day out to our local grade schools. We are partnering with the retired adults at D'Agnolo apartments to entertain children from 1 to 5 in the afternoon while parents take a rest or make holiday preparations.

Also coming up, John Carlton and I are meeting with the Administrative Team at Hononegah High School to discuss working together on a caring network. Our vision is that we could be a hub of giving in our community that engages students and neighbors to donate to disaster relief in our country, and local projects as well.
