### Message from the Pastor

Summing it all up, friends, I'd say you'll do best by filling your minds and meditating on things true, noble, reputable, authentic, compelling, gracious—the best, not the worst; the beautiful, not the ugly; things to praise, not things to curse. Put into practice what you learned from me, what you heard and saw and realized. Do that, and God, who makes everything work together, will work you into his most excellent harmonies.

Philippians 4: 8, The Message

No one could miss the construction on Blackhawk Road. At the moment, it's a giant jumble of machines, gravel and gaping holes. And it has caused some challenges. We can't use the front entrance to our parking lot or even our front door. The parking along Chapel Street, so convenient for those who are using the lift, is also blocked. It's a headache we all wish would be over soon!

It has disrupted my walking habit as well. Now that the weather is nice, my dog, Lupi, and I like to take long ambulations around Rockton; but, I can no longer cross Blackhawk Road as a pedestrian. So, we are limited to two routes on the east side. I'll admit to some frustration and resentment!

But, I notice as I walk, that the sun still shines on me. The breeze still flows by, the birds still sing. And Lupi still sniffs everything in his path! Really, am I all that inconvenienced? Is it really such a big deal, especially when I will get to enjoy the fruits of this labor in the coming years? Instead of complaining and focusing on my resentment, wouldn't it be a better idea to focus on the sky and the trees and the budding lilacs?

In the scripture above, Paul is writing to the church in Philippi from prison. He certainly has many things to complain about and be resentful for! And yet, from this dark setting of suffering and uncertainty, he speaks of joy and blessing.

The Philippians had been squabbling among themselves, breaking into factions, perhaps divided over how to face some challenge to the church. Paul breaks into this situation with encouragement to keep their focus on their blessings, to come together in unity so that they can experience the good things of God. Especially, they should keep their minds on things that are true and gracious, the best, not the worst, and things to praise, not things to curse.

I'm going to do my best to follow Paul's advice. I'm going to enjoy my walks, no matter the route. And whenever I see the construction zone, I'm going to pray. I will pray that the work goes smoothly, that the workers stay safe, and that their labor is a blessing to us and our community. I know my prayer will reach God, and maybe it will soften my heart during an inconvenient time.

What has been annoying you lately? Is there anything you are resentful of? What might be a more profitable focus? Is there some way you can turn it into prayer?

## The 179th Northern Illinois Annual Conference June 3-5, 2018 at Pheasant Run Resort in St. Charles

The theme for annual conference this year is "Navigating Uncharted Water" based on Romans 5:3b-4: "trouble produces endurance, endurance produces character, and character produces hope. Since we are all navigating uncharted water within our communities, churches and our denomination, there will be conference discussion on how to draw on our faith and continue to share the gospel of hope.

Each year the Bishop puts before the congregations of our Northern Illinois Conference a special appeal, asking for donations to support a cause that affects our denomination worldwide. This year Bishop Sally Dyck has designated that the Bishop's Appeal Offering go for Global Migration. Worldwide, 65.5 million people have been forcibly displaced. Even though our country isn't receiving as many refugees, United Methodists around the world, especially in Europe, are accepting them and they need our assistance!

During the month of May, you may make a contribution to the Bishop's Appeal by putting your special offering in one of the pew envelopes, marking it BISHOP'S APPEAL, and dropping it in the collection plate. During the Annual Conference, Karen Fysh and Pastor Megan will present the contributions on behalf of our congregation. 75% of the offering will go to the Global Migration Advance to assist international migrants and refugees. 25% will go to local organizations in Northern Illinois working with immigrants and refugees such as Refugee One and World Relief.
