Raised beds have been assembled and will be brought on site and filled with logs, then leaves before receiving new soil. The Roscoe Gardening Club is very excited about this project. 
Potluck Brunch on April 13 after worship service! Please bring your food to the kitchen prior to the service and we will work together to have everything ready to share the meal after the service.
