This month's "What's Up?" is hard to write as many of the things may already be done by the time you read this. And, as always, there are those things we'd like to get done but we have to wait for meetings and vendors to get back to us. Here's what's up as of the end of March.

Sink Hole: Hopefully, by the time you read this there will be a gravel patch where the sink hole and depression used to be. It may be gravel for several weeks as the contractor waits for the rock to settle so they can be sure its firm and level before any blacktop covers it.

Lift: The idea of putting in stair/chair lifts or ramps did not pan out. Fire regulations and cost didn't make these options any more feasible than fixing the lift. We will explore more options with the lift company to try to get it fixed.

Parsonage: The renter is mostly moved out and did a nice job cleaning. He still had a few things left as of this writing. We will recruit a team from Sisters-in-Christ to go in and do the finishing touches and then have the carpets shampooed. The Trustees already have a few things they know of that will need fixing and there will be others on the "to-do" list. We'll be inviting our new pastor and family up for a walk-through.

LED Lights: Trustees are going to slowly begin moving towards LED lighting in the Education Wing as the lights last much longer, use less electricity and run cooler.

Thanks too to Jerry Green for all of his long hours in setting up all the sound and AV tech in the Sanctuary. A very difficult job after everything was dismantled and stored during the fix.
