We Are Gathering To Worship!

Come and join us as we gather to share Sunday morning worship in our Rockton UMC parking lot!

When: **Beginning this Sunday - August 9th**

Where: **The parking lot at Rockton UMC**

Time: **9:00 am** (lasting 30-35 minutes)

Rain?: If it is raining, or it is questionable, the decision whether to go to “live stream only” worship will be made by 8:30am. Please watch your email on those days for service information.

We are excited to come together to worship in our own church parking lot, but it is important that we consider our safety as we gather.

As you enter the parking lot from either driveway:

- You will drop off your weekly offering envelope in the designated container.
- You will park in every other parking space. (Someone will help direct you.)

The worship committee has set up guidelines for your protection:

- ◆ There are two options for worshipping “in person”:
 1. Stay in your car and tune the radio to 87.9 FM - no mask required in your car
 2. Bring a lawn chair, sit outside in front of your car - **mask required**
If you wish to sit outside your car with no mask, you will need to place your chair(family unit) 15 feet away from anyone else.
- ◆ If you are wanting to visit with friends, please make sure you are wearing your mask and you stay 6 feet away from the other person.



What's Up With the Building?

August

On July 21st the proposal for repairing and stabilizing the south wall of our sanctuary was finally approved by a special Charge Conference/Ad Council Meeting. Sjostrom and Sons, Inc. has been notified of this approval and we have received the necessary documentation so we can finally begin the work to fix the wall! The insurance looks good and by the time you read this, the contract will have been signed and sent. It will take some time for the steel parts that will be used to stabilize the wall to be fabricated but Sjostrom hopes to finish the project in about sixty-days once the parts are finished. Barring any unforeseen problems (which is never a sure thing with an older building), we have a chance of the building being ready for us by, hopefully, Halloween but with a better chance by Thanksgiving. We will have been out of our Sanctuary for about a year due to the need for repairs and, sadly, Covid-19, as we had our work day to remove the pews and furnishings on October 14, of last year. The day may soon be here when there will be no more need to ask "What's Up with the Building?", you'll be able to go in and see for yourself and worship together once again!

We'll be needing lots of help to get things back in order so please watch your email and future Newsletters/Bulletins for work parties. We will also need your contributions to help support the repairs and allow for programs to continue. Please see this Rocktonian for articles about fund raising.

Other Projects

As a result of all the discussions and evaluations of the building, other church projects have been suggested and have been on our wish lists for years. Some of these were covered in the July Rocktonian in the What's Up with the Building article. They include:

Re-carpet the sanctuary

Replace projector with flat screen TV's


Digital-Sign out front

Better enclose the lift entrance

Repaint the sanctuary entrance

Build a ramp from the south parking lot

Of these, re-carpeting the sanctuary would best be done before we put the pews back in place after the repair work is done. A committee is already looking into this and has some estimates ranging from \$10,000 to \$20,000. The other projects are still on the "wish" list. Sjostrom will be doing some painting as a part of the repairs and that work is included in the contract. It is important to note that these projects are included as they have been a part of conversations about the building over the past few months but they are **not** part of the fund-raising campaign for the building repairs. These projects will be attempted only when a large number of congregation members let it be known they want these improvements and are willing to work for the funds to make them happen.



Funding Campaign for the Sanctuary

The contract for the Sanctuary repairs is for \$115,616. You can play an important role in this project by helping to provide the resources to pay for the project and keep our church resources in a viable condition. With this in mind, the Resources Group has set a fund-raising goal of \$50,000. Your pledge or donation can be sent to the church. If sending a check, please make the check payable to RUMC. In the memo line, please include your envelope number and “Church Campaign Fund Drive”.

You may notice that our campaign thermometer is already **above zero** as some members as of this writing have contributed close to \$2,500! We hope you will consider making a donation and it will be a blessing that will allow us to once again worship in our Sanctuary and continue God’s work.

Our Fund Raising History

As we discussed this funding campaign to help with the Sanctuary repairs, the question often came up as to, “. . . when was the last time we had a funding campaign??” After some “less than exhaustive” research, it would appear the last major “capital” campaign was around 1963 when we extended the Sanctuary and built the parsonage. Many of us “old-timers” can still see Pastor Bob Elliot standing in front of a campaign poster on a tripod in front of the Fire-place Room, pledge-card in hand. We’ve had some minor campaigns and have been very fortunate to have families donate towards major improvements as memorials. Some examples include: the Manley family and the carpeting in the Sanctuary in 1964, the handbells in 1984, the organ in 1990, and carpeting in the lounge area/bell room by the Sunleaf family in 2006 and, of course, the lift. This list is by no means exhaustive, and other folks may have contributed to these projects as well but, hopefully, you get the idea.

In the last Rocktonian we explored the history of the famous “fried-cakes” and its role in the church and fund raising. There have been Italian Dinners and other events that have not only helped with projects but have been a blessing in church fellowship over the years. The fact that we may have trouble remembering these events may be due to the fact we apparently haven’t had to have them all that often. While a church always asks for pledges and donations to maintain our services, facilities and apportionments, we have been fortunate not to have had any major fund raising in over fifty years. What do you remember about these events in the life of the church? Dig through your memory and church folder and see if you can recall some of the fund-raising events that enriched the life of the church both in terms of funds and fellowship and let us know. We’d love to share your memories or newspaper clippings! (And frankly, we have a not-so-hidden agenda here as we’d love some good ideas to help support this campaign).




August 2020
