# What's Up With the Building? December

Some of you may be frustrated that the Building Committee is taking so long to come up with solutions for our sagging sanctuary. What happened in November will serve as a good example.

At the beginning of November, we contacted Schmelling Construction, a long-time and respected firm in Rockford. They suggested an exploratory demolition which would open up parts of the ceiling so they (and, eventually, so could an engineer) could look at the covered joints and rafters and just generally examine the structure of the roof and ceiling. By the time we got their proposal, accepted it, waited for them to schedule the work, do the work, and write a preliminary report, everyone closed their offices for the holiday, and, well, November was pretty much over.

What we found out was that the roof structure was pretty much what the old blue prints said it should be and, except for some bowing of the rafters, was in better shape than they thought it would be. None the less, the ceiling still sags and the south wall still bows out much more than it should. They did confirm that the lighter ceiling materials, originally called for in the old blue prints, had been replaced with much heavier materials (most likely when the sanctuary was extended in 1967) which was what other engineers and an architect had suspected.

We're done with the exploration, the "what's wrong" phase, and now we will be working hard to sign on an engineer to get to the "what do we do now" phase. We've narrowed it down to a couple of engineers that will work with us and we'll be negotiating with them to see who has an approach we trust and can still afford. Once that's done, that person will need time to go over the structure and develop plans and do drawings for the contractor who will do the work. I'd like to be able to say that by the "What's Up January" report that has been done but, with the two major holidays in that period, we'll just have to wait and see.
