

In December's article, I provided some context for the increasing presence of The United Methodist Church in the news. Several regions of the UMC in America have recently determined pathways for congregations to disaffiliate in order to join the new Global Methodist Church or become independent.

The new denomination published a series of short videos which explain their thinking behind leaving the UMC as their most faithful option. Another series of videos was published soon after, offering alternative thinking or rebuttals to the original videos.

Methodists have a long history of questioning and thinking critically about what it means to understand the bible and follow the teachings of Jesus. Our denomination has a tradition of embracing diverse theological opinions.

Starting January 8, we will meet after worship in the Library for a new discussion group. We will watch one video from each

side and spend time discussing our reactions and faithful biblical My approaches. intention is to reinforce our commitment to respectful dialog (Methodists call this "holy conferencing"). I believe this information will help us better understand the decisions of our brothers and sisters across the denomination. We should be able to speak knowledgeably about these issues in our denomination. respecting differences while being able to clarify and communicate our own views.

I believe this series will also serve to highlight various elements central to Methodism. Even if the issue of human sexuality is of little interest to you, these discussions will broaden your perspective and teach you about how Methodists approach faith. This is a unique opportunity

Memorial Committee

The RUMC Memorial Committee meets several times during the year to discuss requests and opportunities to honor loved ones whose families and friends have donated to the church in honor of their loved ones who are no longer with us.



The committee decides how donated funds are used. Last year purchased included a new chalice and paten for communion, new offering plates, and banners for the sanctuary and entrance. Occasionally, memorial funds are used for repairs or repairs. In 2022, for instance, memorial funds were used to update the carillon so church bells once again can be heard on the hour! The front doors of our sanctuary were also refurbished with funds donated in honor of loved ones.

Some wonderful musicians are also provided for church services during the year thanks to memorial donations. Jim Hendricks and Dan Holmes led memorable and meaningful worship services. Tidbits of Our History —Rockton Herald, Edson Carr, Editor—

1878



*"The disgusting 'gawkers' were out in full force on Sunday evening last, completely filling the walk in front of the Methodist church in Warren, compelling every person who attended that church that evening to run the gauntlet of 'gawking' eyes and leering faces."

*"We are requested to say that the officers of the Baptist church have determined to have no more 'gawking' on the walk in front of their edifice and if it is persisted in, the guilty ones will be promptly punished. A cordial invitation is extended to all to attend church and seats will be provided for those who may come but no more of the abominable behavior of staring church goers out of countenance, smoking cigars, and using profane language will be tolerated. We understand, though not officially, that the same rule is to be enforced at the M.E. church.

"It is a shame that enough of the young men of this vicinity have no more respect for themselves, their friends, or the Church of God than to congregate in front of our churches in such numbers as they did in front of the Method-ist church last Sunday evening.--*Warren Sentinel.*"

*"Personal – Will the young man in a blond overcoat and a liver colored hat, who sang 'The heart bowed down with grease and hair' out on West Hill at 1 a.m., please repeat his concert this evening at the same place, and stand a little away from the lamppost, so the audience can get a good crack at him with a lump of coal, without endangering the property of the gas company."


*"Rockford is infested with gypsies."
