

What's Up with the Building?

When you read this, it will be the start of a new year and let's all pray it will be a good one for RUMC filled with the blessings of what we can do for others.

The Trustees want to thank KC Wulf, Dan Davis and Mark Lukasick for their help this past year with projects that had to be done on a ladder as the rest of us are at the point we have to limit the amount of work we do on ladders. They've been invaluable installing gutter guards at the parsonage and checking the gutters at church to prevent leaks and fixing a leak when it was found.

As of the time I'm writing this we still don't have hot water available. After doing some digging in the Trustees' records, we find that our present tankless water heater was installed in the fall of 1997, some 26 years ago! That might explain why our plumber is having difficulty finding a part. After much discussion, the Trustees authorized a new water heater if the part can't be found. Frankly, with an appliance that old we don't have much choice.

Finally, Trustees are also going to have the outdoor locks re-keyed on our three outside doors. We've talked for some time about getting a handle on how many keys are out there and who has them. Early in the new year we will be getting the locks done and getting keys to distribute to those who need them on a regular basis. The new keys will be numbered and folks will be asked to sign one out so we can keep track of them. Be patient as we're going to get an initial number made to start and if we should run out then you might have to wait until we can get more. So, watch the bulletins and listen to the announcements in services for when this will happen. The plan now is to have the keys in the office and have folks return their old key and sign out a new one when they arrive.
