From the Pastor's Pen

Our Worship Committee has been going over the guidelines from the Conference ReTurn Team for considering options for in-person or continuing online-only worship. Because we are currently in Phase 3 that does not allow gatherings of over 10 people, requires masks for gatherings and prohibits singing, we will not be looking to meet in person again until we move out of this phase. We will be continuing to hold Live-Stream online-only services through at least mid-July, but will continue to meet to evaluate on a regular basis. And the plan is that once we do begin in-person worship services, that we will continue Livestreaming our services for those not able to join us in person.

You may have seen the emails about it, but I am excited about our new study that we are doing as a church that is reflected in our Sermon Series on *Gospel Discipleship: 4 Pathways for Christian Disciples*. We have a few groups that will be meeting for this study, including the Prayer Team and the Sunday School group with Mark Alcorn on Sunday mornings at 8:30AM via Zoom. I will be leading a group for the study on Thursday Mornings at 10AM via Zoom that will take the place of our previous Thursday Zoom Check-In time.

Several have commented to me that the assessment is really eye opening in understanding different approaches to discipleship. So I encourage everyone to take the assessment to get a better understanding of our differences in this. Here is where you can find the assessment:


"And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." Matthew 28:20.

What's Up With the Building? June



Last month the engineer finished the drawings/plans for stabilizing the wall and we sent those out to various contractors for bids to do the work. The project has three basic phases and a phase must be completed before the next one begins:

1) Erect temporary supports and then slowly jack the ceiling up to as close to its original height as possible (hopefully pulling the wall in with it).

2) Install a beam across the top of the wall and hardware to connect bigger and better rods to stabilize the wall and roof.3) Repair/cosmetic work to patch up the wall and return the interior to how it originally looked.

We received bids from three general contractors that bid on all three phases and one additional group of three individual contractors that will work together and bid separately on each phase. All of the three general contractors made inspection visits and were comprehensive but their bids were higher than expected. The group of three individuals has undergone some changes so we are still waiting for one of the bids to be submitted. As it looks now, this group will have the lowest bid due to some of the work being donated so we are waiting to see how this all works out. Once we have a clearer picture of all of the bids, the Engineering and Contracting Group will study them and make a recommendation to the entire Building Committee. They will also need to approve that recommendation or send it back for more work. The Resources Group has done its job to determine what we have to pay for the project and will set up a funding campaign once they have a clear picture of how much it will cost.

Thanks to Ron Zoeller and Pastor Howie for their help with letting contractors in for visits. Thanks to Mark Alcorn for working with the group of three. Once we have a clear picture of who we want to do the work, and if we can afford it, then we'll go to the Northern Illinois Methodist Conference Building and Location Committee to seek their approval to hire the work done.

Before the work can begin, we will need to have some of the pews relocated and covered up. We'll need to coordinate that with the selected contractor. The Storage Group will put out a call when that needs to be done and it should take less time than back last October when we moved everything out of the sanctuary. Praying that will happen in early July.


