In addition to these events, we are planning new outreach opportunities for November and December. For much of the past few decades, churches have hoped to draw new people by offering

styles of worship that they hoped would appeal to young people. This is called attractional worship. We can and should be aware of what makes worship meaningful to people. younger generations are However, looking for deeper spiritual connections and their questions and challenges were not often embraced or welcomed by established churches, so they left. New forms of outreach focus not on drawing people into church worship services, but instead connecting with people outside of the church. We have a group of people who are working to plan an outreach event the day before Thanksgiving, when kids are out of school. Our plan is to host an event where local children can make a craft and cook something fresh! We are also exploring the idea of providing an occasion for older adults to gather and connect—maybe a game night or afternoon of cards and fellowship. 
