October, 2020




Our Parking Lot Services have continued to go well and it has been a blessing for us to have the connection in that space as well as those that join us online. Again, we don't know how long the quarantine will continue, but we are excited to be moving forward with completing our building project and looking forward to when we will be back in our own space.

With the cold of the season approaching and the building project nearing completion, we will look to the possibility of continuing socially distanced and masked worship within the building when the Sanctuary work is completed.

With concerns for the higher positivity rate in Winnebago County, it is a reminder for us to continue to be diligent in following the guidelines and measures to keep each other safe during this pandemic. We have already been under the restrictions of gatherings not larger than 25 with the number of people that have left their cars for the parking lot during our Sunday services, but something we'll need to consider going forward for when we go inside the Sanctuary if the number is still the same when that happens.

I am excited about our new series based on the book, "Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations". I encourage you to get the book and read it along with our 7-week series. And as we consider both our short-term and long-term futures both as a church and for each of our lives, let us be reminded of these words from Jesus in providing for us:


Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they?

We Are Gathering To Worship!

Come and join us as we gather to share Sunday morning worship in our Rockton UMC parking lot at 9:00am. Communion will be served on the first Sunday of every month.

If it is raining, or it is questionable, the decision whether to go to “live stream only” worship will be made by 8:30am. Please watch your email on those days for service information.

Just a reminder about arrival and parking:

If you are planning to stay in your car, please enter the west parking lot from Chapel Street and park facing the church. Tune your radio to 87.9 FM and sit back and relax.

If you are bringing a lawn chair and will join the group up near Howie for worship, please enter the south parking lot from Blackhawk Blvd., park your car, and remember to use those great “social distancing marks” when bringing your chairs to join the group.

Do We Have Your Latest Email Address?

There are several things that have all come together to make communicating with you, the congregation, more difficult. Covid-19 has meant that we see each other less and we have to depend on email or bulletins to keep you up-to-date on the latest church events. Our church office has been closed and we have been without an administrative assistant for several months so keeping track of everything has been done by volunteers (bless them) when they can find time. During the early part of the office closure the office computer had a problem (storm or power surge) and had to have a new hard drive. What's Up With the Building?

October

As I write this month's "What's Up?" article things are proceeding really fast and what I write will probably be out of date by the time you read it. And that is good news! I encourage you to continue to monitor the progress of the project on the Happening Page of the website as Ron feeds me pictures almost every day. The jacking is done, the structural work is done, and now the cosmetic work to cover over the new structural reinforcements is close to done as well. As of Friday, Day 28, the drywall is all up and the plaster crew was hard at work filling in the gaps and patching up the cracks. You can tell that things have gone well as we are on Day 28 of what was originally thought to be a 60-day project. Thanks to Ron Zoeller's monitoring of the site, this patching will include cracks in the narthex which were not originally a part of the project. We were able to get Sjostrom to fix the ceiling in the stairway down to the Fellowship Hall and add in the plaster work in the narthex.

Due to the quick work by Jerry Ruff, Jim Johnson and Ron, the Trustees were able to get Superior Roofing on-site Thursday (Day 27, September 24th) so they could patch the leaky roof on, and around, the bell tower. There was quite a bit to be done but they were on schedule to have finished it in a couple of days to protect the new drywall from the rains forecast for Sunday. The Trustees are also going to have the carpet cleaned in the Fellowship Hall once all the work is finished and there will be no more chance of it getting construction dirt.

For those of you who have already donated to Fund the Fix, bless you! Its hoped that many of you will consider making a pledge to support all that's been done and allow for some of the other projects to take place as well. As you can tell, there's been a priority put on doing those things which are much more easily done while the Sanctuary was being fixed. These include getting the cracks repaired and putting in some cables in the walls so we have the potential to go to flat screen TVs for worship. We will be waiting on replacing the carpeting, the TV equipment, and any other improvements until the bills come in and we can get a clear look at the state of our finances.

Do you remember last October, the 14th specifically? We spent that day taking out the pews and storing things away and praying that the winter of 2019/20 would be kind to the building. Well, here we are almost a year later and the Sanctuary is now **safe and solid** and only waiting for some more of the plaster and painting mentioned above to be done. It's a big empty room just longing for the instruments of worship and the pews to return. But more than anything, it is a place waiting for the faithful to return and fill its spaces with music, hymns, prayer and the Word of God! We're getting close to when we'll need folks to get things out of storage and back in their proper place so watch the bulletins. Covid-19 doesn't seem as though it will be letting us get back in to have our normal worship any time soon but, when it does, it looks like our Sanctuary will be ready and waiting.
