

A Rock River Sweep Thank You

Once again, the weather cooperated and we had a fine group of volunteers turn out for a morning of community service, picking up trash from our sector of the beautiful Rock River. The 53 helpers included a returning contingent



from Maria Montessori School of Rockford led by teachers Amy Orvis and Kent Holden, and firsttimers from Hononegah High School Leo Club led by advisor Justin Wieman. It's always good to see the younger generation get involved with such enthusiasm! Retired teacher Rich Muniz served as registrar. Marianne Mueller is providing photography and reportage for the Herald. Thanks to all the new and repeat helpers and my co-coordinator Tricia Davey Nelson for their wonderful support. Our ten-mile sector of the river yielded an estimated 1,050 lbs. of refuse, including 9 old tires, 3 shopping carts, 3 plastic traffic cones, the wreckage of a plastic child's wagon, a plastic lawn chair, miscellaneous steel objects, and the usual massive amounts of plastic, styrofoam, sporting goods, cloth and tarp material, etc. A couple of vintage Watkins brand glass bottles. We recycled 271 lbs. of steel and 3 lbs. of aluminum. plus some of the cleaner bits of cardboard and plastic bottles. One traffic cone was in good enough shape to be reused by the village. The rest of our haul went into the dumpster provided by Rock River Disposal. Several participants noted that our "harvest" of junk is diminishing from year to year, and the shorelines are looking cleaner. The water quality itself is another issue entirely; it looks very muddy and murky as usual from agricultural runoff and general erosion. Volunteers reported seeing 2 bald eagles being pursued by smaller birds, an abundance of small frogs, turtles (sliders and snapping), and fox snakes. Mosquitoes were not much of a problem and we managed to stay clear of the profuse patches of poison-ivy. Wild cucumber and jewel weed seem to be super-abundant this year. We all enjoyed attendance prizes from local businesses, and pizzas from Mark's in Rockton, plus watermelon, sodas and snack items. The Rockton Lions Club traditionally pays for our Rock River Sweep t-shirts. Thanks to all our supporters! We'll be back next year. Don't forget to pick up trash wherever you see it! Loren Floto
