What's Up With the Building? <u>September</u>

The scaffolding is up and as of Friday, August 28th, the ceiling is up by half an inch more than it was the previous day. Sjostrom is hard at work and it's hard to believe that last Friday was the tenth day of working on our sanctuary! Our Structural Engineer was out that day to inspect the scaffold and bracing and gave the go ahead to begin jacking up the sagging ceiling in the hope it will begin to pull in the wall.

Trustee Ron Zoeller has been checking things out, taking pictures every other day or so and sending them on to be posted to our church website. Check out a couple of the pictures below.We encourage you to go to <u>https://rocktonumc.org/happenings</u> where you can see Ron's pictures and check in on what's up with the building each week. Ron had put in a semi-permanent plumb line last fall and when he checked it at the end of the work day on Friday, the wall had retreated by a quarter of an inch! Not much, but, as he said, "...in the right direction"! There will now be periods where they increase the tension on the jacks and then wait to see how the building responds so progress may not be as obvious as it has been in the past couple of weeks.

The contract for the Sanctuary repairs is for \$115,616. We hope you will consider making a donation and it will be a blessing that will allow us to once again worship in our Sanctuary and continue God's work.
