TWO CAROLINAS OPEN CHAMPIONSHIP, FRANCIS MARION HOTEL,

CHARLESTON, S.C.

JULY 29, 30, 31.

This big event will be managed through the joint efforts of the NORTH CAROLINA CHESS ASSOCIATION and the SOUTH CAROLINA CHESS ASSOCIATION. This OPEN championship is for the title of CAROLINAS CHAMPION FOR 1960, but players from outside these two states may compete with players from the two Carolinas on an equal basis. The first round will start at 1 P.M., Friday, July 29, in the Sky Terrace Room, on the 12th floor of the FRANCIS MARION HOTEL, in downtown CHARLESTON, S.C. All persons taking part in this tournament will find the FRANCIS MARION HOTEL to be the very best place to spend the nights of July 29 and 30. The hotel is very generously permitting us to use one of their finest ball-rooms at no cost whatsoever to the Chess Association. The hotel is doing this mainly for the prestige it will bring them, but we can show our appreciation by staying at this fine centrally-located hotel. CADET HOMER M. DOTSON -- 1960 CITADEL CHESS CHAMPION

Play in this event began in Sept. 1959 with the opening of school, at which time there was an entry list of 14, including 2 faculty members, 1 outside friend and 11 cadets. Each contestant was supposed to have played two games in a round-robin with every other contestant. Since no contestant completed all his games, the results were considered to have been inconclusive as far as the general tournament was concerned. The four contestants making the best showing had been Maj. Robert F. Brand and Cadets John L. Wilson, Homer M. Dotson and Ernest O. Hunt. Since faculty members are not eligible for the title of Citadel champion, the three top-rating cadets were then entered in a smaller contest, in which each one played two games apiece with the other two. Homer M. Dotson, the 1960 winner, was runner-up in 1959 next to John L. Wilson. Wilson, on the other hand, becomes the 1960 runner-up. Money was collected from among the membership to purchase a suitable trophy for Homer Dotson.

CORRECTIONS REGARDING TOURNAMENTS AS REPORTED IN LAST ISSUE

In our last issue of the BULLETIN three errors were made, which our good friend Alex Edelsburg has very obligingly corrected.

(1) The S.C. Open Tournament in Georgetown, S.C. in the summer of 1951 was won by Mr. L.N. Enequist.

(2) The S.C. Open Tournament in Columbia, S.C. (not in Beaufort) in 1952 was won by Mr. M. Wiener of Washington, S.C. Mr. Edelsburg participated in both of the above tournaments, so he knows whereof he speaks.

(3) The 1958 TWO CAROLINAS CHAMPIONSHIP was won by Kit Crittenden of Raleigh, N.C. (Not by Hans Berliner, as erroneously reported).

****There are two other errors which have been called to the attention of the Editor. The 1955 CLOSED S.C. CHAMPIONSHIP (won by Ernest Hoenck) was held in Columbia, S.C. at the HOTEL WADE HAMPTON, not at the Foster School of The Dance.

****The 1959 SOUTHERN CHAMPIONSHIP was won by DR. ROGER A. CARLYLE, not by Prof. Steven Shaw.

****P.J. Walker, a four-time winner of the SOUTHERN CHAMPIONSHIP was reported as having been a resident of Varnville, S.C. each time he won the title. It is now thought that Walker was a resident of Savannah, Ga. on all four occasions, and that he resided in Varnville, S.C. only during the year of 1932, when he won the S.C. State title. We shall find out more about P.J. Walker by checking with others who were in Southern Championship tournaments at the same time.
