(3) The 1958 TWO CAROLINAS CHAMPIONSHIP was won by Kit Crittenden

of Raleigh, N.C. (Not hy Hans Berliner, as erroneously reported).
****There are two other errors which have been called to the attention of the Editor. The 1955 CLOSED S.C. CHAMPIONSHIP (won by Ernest Hoenck) was held in Columbia, S.C. at the HOTEL WADE HAMPTON, not at the Foster School of The Dance.

****The 1959 SOUTHERN CHAMPIONSHIP was won by DR. ROGER A. CARLYLE,

not by Prof. Steven Shaw.

****P.J. Walker, a four-time winner of the SOUTHERN CHAMPIONSHIP was reported as having been a resident of Varnville, S.C. each. times he won the title. It is now thought that Walker was a resident of Savannah, Ga. on all four occasions, and that he resided in Varnville, S.C. only during the year of 1932, when he won the S.C. State title.
