To insure yourselves of a decent turnout, pre-register as many *local* players as possible. And *Remember* — while it is always nice to talk about how many Class A or higher players you may draw, it is the B-C-D-E and UR players present that will make or break your tournament. Aim for them and treat them just as you would an expert!

***The 1977 South Carolina Championships will be in Camden this year. Look at the tournament announcement elsewhere in this issue. Let us make this event a real success. Plan now to attend.

****Tournament Directors* — Remember that the manner in which you conduct a tournament can either make a player feel at ease, or scare them from future events. *Tournament Players* — It is your duty to know the laws and rules of chess. The Clemson Chess Club has been awarded the right to conduct the 1978 Carolinas Open Tournament. This tournament alternates year-by-year between North Carolina and South Carolina. In 1976 it was conducted by the Charleston Chess Club. Next year it will be held at Clemson, June 24th and 25th.

SCCA accepting SC Championship bids

The South Carolina Chess Association is now accepting bids from chess clubs to host the 1978 South Carolina Chess Championship Tournament. SCCA is also now seeking bids from local clubs to host the 1978 S. C. Junior Championships.

National Chess Day

NATIONAL CHESS DAY will be observed again this year. The date is October 8th, and all chess players and chess clubs are urged to set up open tournaments and exhibition matches, and publicize them.

Chappel wins 1st Chess "O" Quads

Play in the three sections of the First Chess "O" Quads at Rock Hill, on August 21st, produced two clear winners and a tie.

In Section A, Marvin Chappell (1853) scored wins over J. King (1531) and Deland Fuerstman (1797) and accepted a forfeit from R. Grady Brown (1785) to score 3-0. In Section C, Andrew Pendleton (848) defeated Jeremy O'Connor (1142), Bruce Bowman and H. Brandon to score 3-0.

In Section B, Robert Moore (1445) and Edward Brass (1469) tied for tops after their thirdround draw.

Soviet Grandmaster Returns

Viktor Korchnoi, the Soviet-exile International Grandmaster is returning to Augusta, Georgia on Monday, September 19.

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Three years ago Korchnoi defeated Henry Mecking of Brazil in a world titlest candidates' elimination match, in Augusta. Now his is the semi-finalist contender for the right to oppose A. Karpov for the World Championship.

Korchnoi is returning to Augusta to play a simultaneous exhibition and deliver a talk on grandmaster play.

It will start at 7 p.m. on Monday night, September 19th, in the Embassy Towers Motel on Augusta's main street. That's where Korchnoi beat Mecking.

The admission fee is \$5 for the lecture and to watch the simultaneous play. The fee to play one of the 50 boards against the Grandmaster is \$15. Boards will be assigned on a first-come basis.

Dunning Wins Southern Open

John Dunning of Greenville, with a score of $6\frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$, won the 56th Southern Open/Region IV Championship held July 1-4 at Clemson. Other winners in the 84 player event incuded USCF Master Charles Powell, who tied for second with Bill Kilpatrick at 5-2. Edward Kitces won 1st expert with $4\frac{1}{2}-2\frac{1}{2}$, while Greg Samsa's 4-3 took 2nd expert. In addition, Mack Garner and Henry Robinson tied for 1st with $4\frac{1}{2}2\frac{1}{2}$.

In the Amateur Section Justin Morrison and Peter Hudson tied for 1st with scores of 6-1. Equal 3rd was shared at 5-2 between Ken Murr, John Molino, and Jere Roland. Top C was Stephen Choatie at $4\frac{1}{2}-2\frac{1}{2}$, while 2nd C was Otto Estenger, Jr. with 4-3.

In the Novice Section, Doug Price and James Hyatt both had 6-1 to tie for 1st. A tie for 3rd took place between Carl Rogers and Rick Likens with scores of 5-2. A 3-way tie for Top E developed among Robert Hudson, Robert Parry, and John Campbell, all at 3-4. Top unrated was Danny Diamantstein at 4-3, while Don Wing took 2nd unrated with $3\frac{1}{2}-3\frac{1}{2}$.
