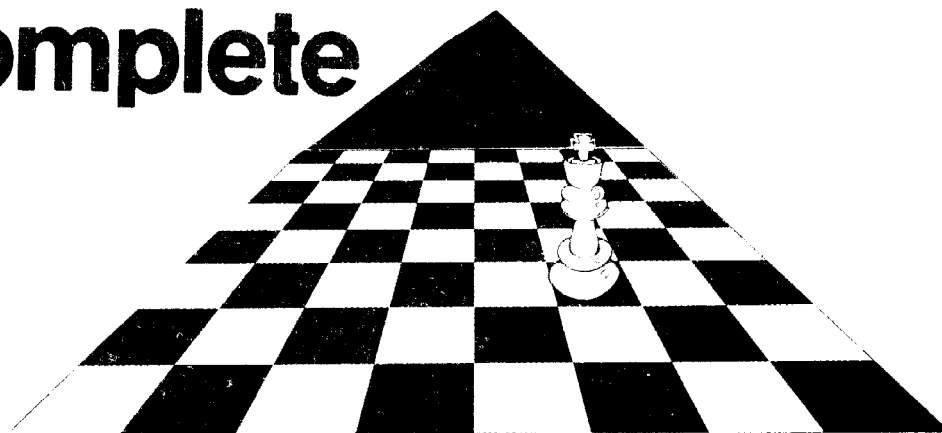

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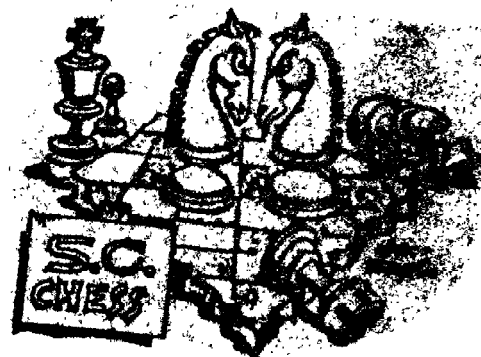
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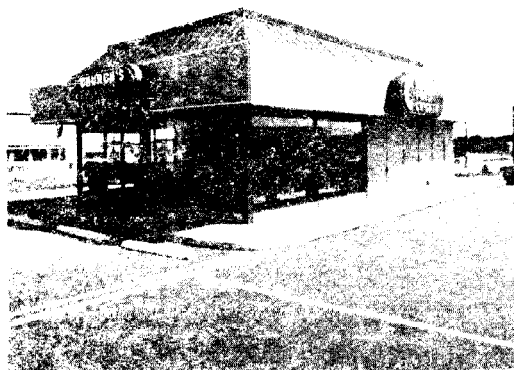
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SENIOR MASTER TO PLAY IN ATLANTA



While most companies of this size tend to crowd the sponsorship of golf, motor racing, tennis and bowling, it is Church's Fried Chicken's belief that a tremendous national and international bridge can be built through chess sponsorship. Chess is one of the few sports in existence that does not limit its participation to selected groups or individuals.

Church's has taken this giant step into the chess world by offering free exhibitions and lectures by Larry Christiansen, Grandmaster, and John Peters, Senior Master, to recognized chess clubs and academic institutions.

SENIOR MASTER JOHN PETERS

John Peters was born in Boston, Massachusetts, on February 10, 1951. He learned the rules of chess when he was eight years old but did not get interested in the game until high school. During high school he joined the school chess club, played in an interscholastic league and entered his first tournament. He attended MIT for two years, and participated in two Pan-American Intercollegiate Championships.

In 1971, Peters became New England champion by winning the New England Open. Shortly afterwards, he earned the master title and made the decision to drop out of school and be a full-time chess player. Slowly, he made progress. In 1974 and 1975, he was both the Massachusetts and New England champion. His rating climbed to 2400. The U.S. Chess Federation invited him to the 1975 U.S. Championship in Oberlin, Ohio, where he tied for tenth place. A year later, he moved to Los Angeles and won the title of Southern California champion. He played third board for the U.S.A. team which finished second in the 1976 World Student Team Championship in Caracas, Venezuela. He again finished in a tie for tenth place in the 1977 U.S. Championship. But his improvement was shown by two of the greatest successes in his career: a fine result at Lone Pine, 1977, which gave him his first norm for the International Master title and a tie for first place in the 1977 American Open.

Besides his chess play, Peters is known for his chess writing. He contributes articles regularly to *Rank and File*, the Southern California Chess Federation publication, and to *Chess Horizons* of Massachusetts, and occasionally to the USCF magazine, *Chess Life and Review*.

Mr. Steve Schneider of the Georgia Chess Assn has confirmed that Senior Master John Peters will stop in Atlanta on September 26, 1978 and remain in this area for at least three days.

The Church's Fried Chicken will be sponsoring his visit here and Atlanta plans to turn out for the good events planned.

Mr. Peters will be holding a Simultaneous Exhibition at the Riveria Hyatt House Motel on September 26, 7:30 PM. The first 30 players paying the entry fee \$5.00 to Steve Schneider will be allowed to participate. Each player will receive a special scorebook and any player with a win will receive a prize from Church's Fried Chicken.

John Peters originally is from Boston but now comes from Los Angeles. At the Lone Pine Tournament in 1977 he earned his first norm for the International Master's Title. He tied for 1st place in the 1977 American Open.

While in Atlanta John will give a free lecture and it will be open to questions and answers, at a chess club in the Metro area to be designated. He plans to give a simul at the US Penitentiary. Then on Thursday, September 28 he will appear at one or two schools in Metro Atlanta.

MIAMI MEMORIAL DAY CLASSIC

As in great sports events where the outcome of the game hangs in the balance until the final moment, the outcome of the Miami Memorial Day Classic, held over the Memorial Day weekend at the Ramada Airport Inn, was uncertain until the final moves of the last game between David Brummer and Henry Garcia. The Miami Chess Club a new and exciting force in South Florida chess founded by Charles Turk, Jay Lewis, Alan Powers and Howard Gittelsohn, had promoted the First Annual Miami Memorial Day Classic of Chess with Florida's largest guaranteed prize fund ever of \$2,250 including a \$500 first place prize in the Open Section. A strong field of 105 players had entered in four sections to play 5 rounds of competitive chess under the Swiss system. The Open section featured no less than eight players rated

2000 or higher. Ronald Henley (2193) was top-seeded. At 21 he is already an international master rising rapidly on the American chess scene. His competition was formidable and included Arnold Denker (2360), a former U.S. champion and a legend in American chess, Dr. Juan Gonzalez (2200), Miami's Master Emeritus, and David Brummer (2114), a strong local expert and current Florida State Open champion.

Round I, Saturday May 27

Early rounds of Swiss tournaments usually favor the top seeded players. This tournament was no exception. Henley, Gonzalez, Brummer, and David Dukes (2059) all scored wins. Denker, playing black against Luis Alfonso (1873), was held to a draw and trailed the leaders by ½ point.

Round II, Sunday May 28

The leaders continued to win. Denker rebounded from his first round draw and scored a nice win. Steve Andrews (1837) joined the leaders with 2 wins one over Luis Alfonso who had drawn with Denker. The standings after two rounds were Henley, Gonzalez, Brummer, Dukes, and Andrews 2 Denker 1½.

In contrast to the steady Open section the other sections were scrambles. The high seeded players were being upset. Only Jeff Morra (1592), seeded second in the Reserve section and Neil Markovitz (1395), seeded first in the Novice section, remained undefeated. The Amateur section was a real shambles. Every player had lost or drawn a game except Douglas Walker (1654) who was ranked tenth and, as an omen of things to come, Walker did not win or draw another game.

Round III, Sunday May 28

The first pairings of the leading players occurred in this round. Denker was paired as white against Andrews. Draw. Dr. Gonzalez played a book draw as white against Dukes. The longest game of the tournament pitted Henley playing white against Brummer. The winner would possess a clear ½-point lead in the championship. Both men wanted this game and they played hard to win it. With this draw the log jam in the Open section continued. Henley, Gonzalez, Brummer, Dukes, and Andrews all had 2½ and Denker remained close with 2. It was becoming clear that the tension and pressure that was building would continue right down to the final moves of the final game.

Round IV, Monday May 29

Surprises were not long in coming on this final day of the tournament. But first, Denker won as white against Carlos Alvarez (1786) and Henley had little trouble with Dukes in gaining his full point. Entering the race for the first time was Henry Garcia (2011) with consecutive wins over Mark Solomon (1844) and Steve Andrews. This gave Garcia 3 points for the championship. Andrews and Dukes had succumbed to the pressure. In another game, Brummer was paired as white against Dr. Gonzalez. The winner would share the lead with Henley. A draw would give Henley a clear lead. A disappointing loss for Dr. Gonzalez and a welcome boost for Brummer. After four rounds nothing was clear. Henley and Brummer shared the lead with 3½ and Denker and Garcia had 3. No less than five players were at 2½.

In the other sections of the tournament, the winners were even less apparent. The Amateur section had been filled with so many upsets that five players shared the lead at 3 points. Clear advantages were held by Stephen Press (1552) in the Reserve section and Chris Williams (1327) in the Novice section as a result of their perfect scores.

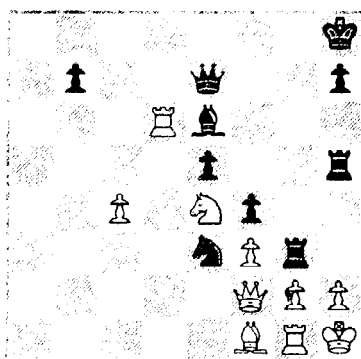

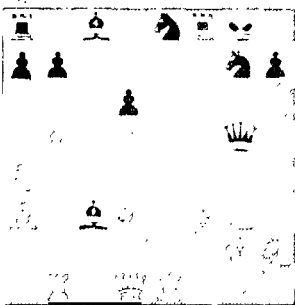
