Perhaps nothing in South Carolina chess has brought the state such favorable attention as the two U. S. Women's Championships held at Converse College in Spartanburg the last two summers. In honor of these two events, Dr. Spencer Mathews, the organizer, and the Spartanburg Chess Club, we are proud to present this special issue on these two championships. Thanks to David Williams and Mickey Bush, we are able to present all the games, and Mathews and Williams have been kind enough to contribute their story of the tournament.

THE PLAYERS FOR 1990:

The competitors in the 1990 U. S. Women's Championship were as follows:

Elena Donaldson, the winner, holds the title of Woman Grandmaster and a rating of 2590; she is a Candidate for the Women's World Championship to be played in 1991. This is the first time she is eligible for the U. S.

title, as she has been resident in this country (in Seattle) for just over a year.

Esther Epstein, from Brookline, Mass., has been an International Master since 1972, and has won five international tournaments. Like Donaldson she is originally from the USSR. Her rating is 2364.

Vesna Dimitrijevic, from Cambridge, Mass., received her Women's International Master title at the 1989 U. S. Women's Championship. Her current rating is 2106.

Pamela Ruggiero, from Danville, California, has played in four U. S. Women's Championships. Her current rating is 2097.

Shernaz Mistry-Kennedy, from Middle Village, NY, also received her WIM title at the 1989 Championship. She was Intercollegiate Women's Champion for six years in her native India. She has a rating of 2096.

Sharon Burtman, of Stoughton, Massachusetts, won the 1989 Women's Interzonal playoff against Dimitrijevic and Kennedy, and received her WIM title at this event. Her current rating is 2152.

Liz Neely, from Santa Cruz, CA, won the 1987 Under-20 Girls' Championship. She is a WIM with a rating of 2185. p73

Alexey Root, the defending champion of this event, is from Los Angeles. She also is a WIM with a 2236 rating.

The 1990 U. S. Women's Championship

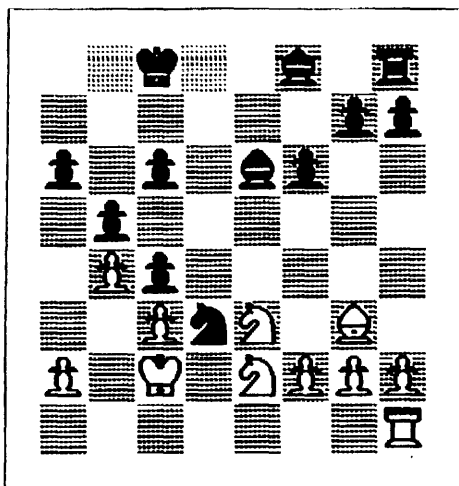
For the second year in a row Converse College in Spartanburg played host to the U. S. Women's Championship. This year's event, with an average rating of 2195, was possibly the strongest ever U. S. Women's Championship. As expected, Elena Donaldson, a Soviet emigre now living in Seattle, Washington, dominated the field from the outset, winning her first six games before yielding "grandmaster" draws in the final three rounds. Donaldson's 7.5 points was a full point ahead of second place Esther Epstein. Vesna Dimitrijevic and Pamela Ruggiero scored 5 1/2 to share 3rd and 4th. Shernaz Kennedy finished 5th with 5 points. Last year's winner, Alexey Root, could do no better than a tie for 6th - 9th place with 3.5 points. Tying with Root were Sharon Burtman, Liz Neely, and Krystyna Wieckiewicz. Diana Gherghe finished last with three points.

Donaldson's play was, for the most part, characterized by a willingness to trade off heavy pieces early, and then outplay her opponent in the resulting simplified position. In the following game from Round One Donaldson, playing the black side of a Ruy Lopez, gives Alexey Root a lesson in how to win with the two bishops.

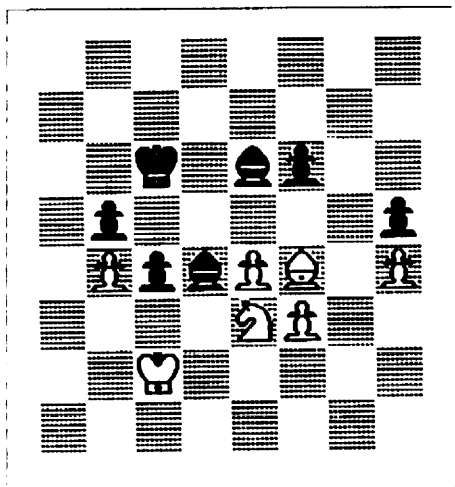

The authors challenge the interested reader to find where White went wrong.

The spectators and organizers were disappointed that Donaldson was content to draw in Rounds 7-9, as they were deprived of the opportunity to see more of the lucid, clinic-like games she had produced in the first six rounds. Perhaps future U. S. Womens' Championships should be organized around a knock-out system as the U. S. Mens' Championship was this year.

The tournament was covered by local print and broadcast media as well as the USA Today Sports Center computer network. A public radio listener heard an interview with some of the players and called to extend an invitation for the players to visit his "Paintball" field near Woodruff, S. C. Six players and guests gave it a try and had a wonderful time. (For the uninitiated, Paintball is an army game played with special guns that shoot paint pellets.) On another excursion several of the players went to a minor league baseball game and sang "Take Me Out to the Ballgame" during the seventh inning stretch. (For Kennedy and Epstein this was the first baseball game of any kind they had attended.)

On a bizarre note, Jim Meyer, the tournament director, received a preliminary notice of intent to recall him to active duty (He is a retired naval officer) two weeks prior to the Iraqi invasion of Kuwait. Fortunately, his final orders did not come

through during the tournament.

FIDE awarded the Womens' Candidates' Tournament scheduled for this October to Moscow. The USCF was pushing for Spartanburg to get the bid. It is an open question at this point whether or not Donaldson will compete. She is not likely to receive a warm welcome should she return to the Soviet Union.

NEWS FROM AROUND THE STATE

CHARLESTON

Paul Tinkler, the highest rated player in the Charleston Classic, defeated Doug Holmes in the final round to win the August tournament with a score of 4 1/2 to 1/2. Tinkler gave up a draw to George Melton, Jr. in the third round. Finishing half a point behind Tinkler were Bijan Khalegi and Lindsay Blanks; Melton, Holmes, John Vonderlith, and John Rogers each scored 3 1/2 to tie for fourth. Twenty-four players joined in the tenth annual Classic.

SPARTANBURG

Once again, it's Mathews! Spencer scored 7-0 to win the 1990 Spartanburg Club Speed Championship in an eight man round robin. His win over Harold Bush was decisive, as Bush won all the rest to finish second at 6-1. Ronald Rutledge lost to both these stars but won all the rest of his games to finish third.

In an earlier club tournament "Pfister-hammer's Return", Mathews and Mario Schenkel each scored 2 1/2 of 3 to tie

for first among eight players.

COLUMBIA

Klaus Pohl became the first South Carolinian to stop Charles Walter this year, defeating the Columbia player to take the first Warm-up Tournament in Columbia in early September. Pohl himself gave up a draw to B-rated Keith Eubanks in the first round, but won the rest of his games to finish with 3 1/2 of 4. Eubanks covered himself with glory, winning two further games with higher-rated players before drawing with Expert Leland Fuerstman in the last round. Eubanks' three points tied him for second with Walters, Fuerstman, and Harold Bush, Jr., and, of course, won him the Class B prize. Bijan Khalegi scored 2 1/2 to take the A prize; Ricky Dale Evans, with 2, won the C prize, and Daniel Baisden, with a score of 2 1/2, won the D/E/Unrated prize. Don Lemaster directed the 20-Player event.

Cross-Tables of these events, and of the Midlands Open earlier this summer, are elsewhere in this issue.

CHESS COMPUTER UPDATES

We have not received the promised second part of Mr. Schuh's comparison of chess data bases from the July Issue; but another expert reviewer, Senior Master Rick Bauer, has done a long, careful, and very helpful comparison of the three major databases in Chess Horizons. For the benefit of our readers I quote here his conclusions: (See p. 30)

COMPUTER UPDATE, CONTINUED

"For the advanced chess player and experienced computer user I think that the NIC-Base program comes out well on top. It is very similar to ChessBase in concept, but far superior in price and performance. It takes some time to get used to, but is an exceptional program. This is the one that I have chosen to use.

"For someone with less time to spend on chess or with their computer. I think that Bookup 7 would be a better choice. It is easier to learn and works perfectly well for storing openings. The players that I know who have bought it are well satisfied.

"I cannot recommend ChessBase at this time due to its bugs, price, and lack of support. For those with the first version of ChessBase, however, I do recommend the (recent) upgrade. It does away with the key disk copy protection scheme, and allows alternate lines to be entered. By backing up my files before I use them, I have been able to get more use out of my ChessBase."

Some other chess software has come to our attention through mail solicitations, and I report it here for interested persons:

The GEOS compatible chess diagramming and database tool
30 "ChesSecretary" is being sold
by Kent L. Smotherman, 13912

Meadow Ridge Road, Omaha NE 68138. It allows chess games to be entered into a database via a graphic board display. Stored games may be replayed automatically or manually. It can create GEOS photo scraps of positions, and a record of the game in algebraic notation. The price is a modest \$10.

PEP-CAL Software, PO Box 4131, Manchester NH 03108, has a series of programs for the IBM computer. TRANSLATOR translates game scores from descriptive to algebraic, or vice versa. TUTOR is a teaching tool for the main lines of many openings. SAVER/PLAYER is a program for saving games and playing through them on the screen. INDEXER is a file of games for the student. CORRESPONDER is a computer record of correspondence games than can be updated as play proceeds. There is also a series of PRAXIS disks giving main lines of many openings. The programs are competitively priced.

Computer Office Solutions, 2820 Old Canoe Creek Rd., St. Cloud, FL 34772, has a program DIAGRAM 1.0 for the IBM that makes--you guessed it. It's designed to be used with recent versions of WordPerfect and Microsoft Word; the price is just over \$20.

picked up from the USA Today Sports Network. For the uninitiated, we note that a 25 MHz 386 machine is near the top of the IBM compatible spectrum; but also note that one game does not make a true test of a chess computer's ability.

The following notice was posted by Walter Wood:

M Chess--CAVEAT EMPTOR

I recently had an opportunity to test M Chess, a new software program which is claimed by the Computer Chess Gazette to have strength equivalent to a USCF rating of 2405 when run on a 25 MHz 386 machine. The present version has no graphics or mouse support, but claims to play a master strength game. As the following game shows, my initial skepticism has proven correct.

THE USCF CONVENTION

The USCF's annual convention occurred in Jacksonville, Florida in early August; both the U.S. Championship and the U.S. Open were held along with it. The U.S. Championship was on a unique knockout system this year, with the eliminated Championship players transferring directly into the Open across the hall. Lev Alburt won the U.S. Championship, while Yasser Seirawan--eliminated early from that tournament--went on to take the Open.

The Open was poorly attended, thanks largely to poor South-eastern participation. There were fewer than 300 players, translating into a \$10,000 loss for the USCF. The low turnout was ironic, since the tournament was in one of the most beautiful sites it has ever been, right on the river in downtown Jacksonville. Those who did go saw a meeting of the generations, as Reshevsky, Byrne and Evans were there, associating with all the young grandmasters of today.

The business part of the convention occurred during the workshops and the delegates' meeting. Following is a summary of the highlights of those meetings:

Money was a somber and depressing topic. The delegates, for the first time in years, could not balance the USCF's \$4,000,000 budget. The budget they passed contains a deficit of nearly \$50,000; and that was based on optimistic projections.

The money situation has been declining for several years. The basic problem is a failure to build adult regular membership. This lack of membership growth (actually a decline) is hurting the USCF's book and equipment sales as well as costing in membership dues. The only bright spots are the current membership drive, which is slowly halting the decline, and the phenomenal success of scholastic tournaments. (South Carolina, thanks largely to Gary Sheets and Doug Holmes, is among the national leaders in growth in these two areas.) However, the scholastic successes are not paying off yet financially, as few of the free tournament memberships for kids are being converted into paid scholastic or youth memberships.

Because of these problems, the USCF will be offering a new promotional membership for \$15.00 for three months (for new joiners only). That membership can be converted to a full year upon payment of the remaining \$15.00. In turn, the adult tournament membership is being abolished; many felt that it was being abused, and was failing to bring people into regular membership.

The money situation can be helped only if we all pitch in. I personally keep my two daughters enrolled as scholastic members; and I never buy a chess book from a store if I can get it through USCF instead. I donate to the U.S. Chess Trust, the tax-deductible arm of the USCF. (Make donations payable to "U.S. Chess Trust" and send to the USCF Office). Whenever a new player appears at your club, or even

around the office, show him the USCF catalog; there is a big market for chess computers among casual players, and the "Novag Solo" might be an excellent choice for him. Be proud of your membership! Our society is declining culturally, as the drug-using "party animal" becomes the new social ideal; this cultural decline may be one real reason behind the USCF's failure to grow. The USCF has a new bumper sticker called "Push pawns, not drugs." Write them and ask for one!

FIDE Affairs were discussed, with the full U.S. delegation in attendance. FIDE and the GMA have reached an awkward accord on the World Championship. Reportedly, Kasparov has been pressured from within the GMA to relinquish his tight control of GMA policy, a fact that perhaps helped the cause of compromise. The USCF has also gained some participation in the New York part of the World Championship, by being allowed to hop its promotional bandwagon. The USCF will not support the reelection of Compomanes, although his substantial support among third-world nations will give him good chances. GM Larry Evans discussed at length his belief that Compomanes has allegedly misused FIDE funds.

Chess Life editor Julie Desch announced that she is taking a six-month leave of absence. She did not give her reasons; but she told me that she is definitely returning to the magazine. She and GM Evans have been having a dispute over her right to edit his column. Evans decried her editing as "censorship", but did not say what he thought her motive was; one got the impression that he was omitting part of the story. Julie refused to discuss details as well, except to say that it is "up to GM Evans" if the column is to continue.

Rating-class norms may soon be developed. Under such a system, a player could gain a "Class A" norm (perhaps under a different title) the same way one gains a GM norm. This idea seems strange, but it has some merit. For one thing, it might help players at lower-than-expert skill levels gain some sort of formal recognition, removing some of the negative connotations of those levels. Also, it will help deal with the growing "sandbagging" problem.

The USCF Elections

This was a major election year, with five of the seven seats of the Policy Board up for grabs. The winners were as follows (elected to 3-year terms):

Max Dlugy became the first grandmaster to be elected USCF president. His election was surprising, as he has not participated in USCF politics before. He has, however, been active in the GMA. He promises to strive for better relations between the two organizations. To his credit, Max seems comfortable working with players of all backgrounds in a cooperative way.

Vice-president Frank Camarratta of Alabama is one of the top U.S. correspondence players. He is also a leading expert on the history of Staunton sets, and preceded me as Hall-of-Fame chairman. He has since been ratings chairman, and has headed the computer rating agency.

Secretary Randy Hough is a former USCF staffer. Treasurer Gary Sperling is a past USCF president (1978-81), and past FIDE official. He is also a successful investor and a gifted orator.

Member-at-large John Donaldson is well-known to readers. He is quite personable, thoroughly knowledgeable of chess history and culture, and married to the new U.S. women's champion. He joins members-at-large Dave Sapanora (1988-91) and Bill Goichberg (1989-92), who remain on the Board. Past president Harold Winston will also serve one more year on the Policy Board.

South Carolina Shines Again

At the annual awards banquet, that is. Last year it was Spencer Mathews being honored for Spartanburg's excellent organization of the U.S. Women's Championship. This year, Gary Sheets was named at the delegates' meeting as one of the national leaders in the membership drive.

Our state's biggest moment, however, came when our native son, Lee Hyder, received the Outstanding Career Achievement Award. All the banquet participants, drawn from the elite of U.S. chess, listened attentively as Lee's long list of accomplishments was read. Foremost of these, of course, were his serving as USCF Secretary (1975-78), and as organizer of the Korchnoi-Mecking Quarter-Final Match for the World Championship in 1974 (only the second Candidate's Match in U.S. history). Lee's many achievements in South Carolina were also listed, including having been SCCA president, editor, and champion. The standing ovation he received from the roomful of great players and leaders was heartfelt and sincere.

This writer gave his annual speech for the Hall-of-Fame induction, to conclude the Awards Banquet. Dr. Hans Berliner was inducted for his achievements in correspondence chess and computer development.

Thus concludes this account of the USCF annual convention. Unfortunately, it may be the last Southeastern U.S. Open for a while, thanks to our region's poor support of the event. But a wonderful event, nonetheless.
