

Hart Snows Them Under At the Snowstorm Open!

Patrick Hart Wins 19th Annual Snowstorm Open

Charleston's own Patrick Hart led all the way, and won the 1991 Snowstorm Open with a score of four wins and one draw. The tournament was played in Charleston over the weekend of February 23-24. Hart, who is also the SCCA Treasurer, conceded a draw to Brad Jeffers in Round 4, but won the event with a defeat of Paul Tinkler in the last round. Jeffers gave up another draw to John Vonderlieth, and so finished tied for second with James Chaffin.

Twenty-eight players participated in the annual event, which was directed by Doug Holmes. A notable performance was turned in by high school junior Bryce Harrison, who could play only three rounds, but scored two wins and a draw with Tinkler in those three.

Crosstables of the event are elsewhere in this issue. We regret we have no games, but invite contributions from the participants for our next issue.

The Spartanburg club held a one-day event January 19 that included a set of quads and a junior tournament. 1991 Scholastic State Championship

-- Harrison Shows His Talent --

The 1991 South Carolina Scholastic State Championship was held in Charleston on March 9th. There were a total of 50 participants making up two divisions.

In the high school section there were 37 students, mostly represented by Stratford High, the Governor's School, and Saluda High. Other schools participating in this section were Bishop England, St. Andrews, and Burke from Charleston County, Battery Creek from the Beaufort area, and one student from Southside High.

Bryce Harrison won the high school section for the second consecutive year. Just a few weeks earlier, Bryce played in the first three rounds of the Charleston Classic. He won his first two games in that tournament, including a win over expert Paul Tinkler in the second round, and drew his third game against Kyle Oody. He was unable to participate on Sunday because of his religious obligations. In the Scholastic Tournament Bryce continued his outstanding results with a 5-0 score.

Bryce has shown that he has no competition among his peers in school, and he has a year left! His USCF rating should now be above 1900, and his USCF postal rating is above 2100 after 17 games.

Second place in this section went to Kim Turok, who scored 4.5-0.5. Third on tiebreaks went to Daryl Dowty, who lost only to Harrison and scored 4-1. Tied with Dowty were Eli Wiggins of Southside (who won the top under 1400 trophy), Brian Thrumond of Governor's School, and David Kline of Battery Creek. Harrison, Turok, and Dowty are all from Stratford; needless to say, Stratford won the team championship with 16.5 of 20 on the top four boards.

The middle school section (K-8) was lightly attended; there were 13 entrants, and nine of these were from College Park Middle School. Other schools participating were Pinewood School and Alston Middle School from Charleston County, and Jessie Boyd Elementary from the upper state.

The middle school championship was won by 1989 champion Sattelmeyer, with a perfect 4-0 score. His only competition was from his own College Park Middle School. defeated 3rd place finisher Lorenzo Binns, 2nd place Jonathan Dowty (Daryl's brother), pre-tournament favorite Cliff Chapman, consistenly high finishing Trey Moten. All of these are from College Park, as was Michael Peterson, who tied for 3rd with Binns. Naturally, College Park won the team competition! Peggy has in her school the three best high school players in the state, and her son is the middle school champ. Enough said!

Due to the lack of help by fellow chess players from our SCCA community, and a lack of student support, one has to wonder if there will be a scholastic state championship next year. If middle school attendance is a sign of the future, then we are in serious trouble. One also has to wonder where it will be held if it is held. What effect would moving it to Columbia have? Personally, I must say that I am losing interest.


