

PACE Running Club PRIVACY NOTICE FOR MEMBERS

We are committed to respecting your privacy. This notice is to explain how we may use personal information we collect before, during and after your membership with us. This notice applies to you if you have registered to become or are a member of our club. This notice explains how we comply with the law on data protection, what your rights are and for the purposes of data protection we will be the controller of any of your personal information.

Our lawful basis for processing your personal data is that we have a contractual obligation to you as a member to provide the services you are registering for. You will have given us consent to use your Personal Data for the purposes outlined in Table 1 by agreeing to the declaration provided during the membership registration process.

1. PERSONAL INFORMATION WE MAY COLLECT FROM YOU

You may initially provide us with or we may obtain **personal information** about you, such as information regarding your:

- o personal contact details that allows us to contact you directly such as name, title, email addresses and telephone numbers;
- o date of birth;
- o gender;
- o membership start and end date;
- o records of your interactions with us such as telephone conversations, emails and other correspondence and your instructions to us;
- o records of your attendance at any events hosted by us;
- o images in video and/or photographic form and voice recordings;
- o your marketing preferences so that we know whether and how we should contact you.
- o details of next of kin, family members, coaches and emergency contacts;
- records and assessment of any rankings, grading or ratings, competition results, details regarding races attended and performance;
- o any disciplinary and grievance information;

2. SPECIAL CATEGORIES OF PERSONAL INFORMATION

We may also collect, store and use the following "**special categories**" of more sensitive personal information regarding you:

o information about your health, including any medical condition, health and sickness records, medical records and health professional information; and

In relation to the special category personal data that we do process we do so on the basis that you have provided your explicit consent.

3. WHERE WE COLLECT YOUR INFORMATION

We typically collect personal information about our members when you apply to become a member of the club, when you purchase any services or products we offer, when you make a query and/or complaint or when you correspond with us by phone, e-mail or in some other way.

If you are providing us with details of next of kin and emergency contacts they have a right to know and to be aware of how what personal information we hold about them, how we collect it and how we use and may share that information. Please share this privacy notice with them. They also have the same rights as set out in the "Your rights in relation to personal information" section below.

4. USES MADE OF THE INFORMATION

The table below describes the main purposes for which we process your personal information, the categories of your information involved and our lawful basis for being able to do this.

For some of your personal information you will have a legal, contractual or other requirement or obligation for you to provide us with your personal information. If you do not provide us with the requested personal information we may not be able to admit you as a member or we may not be able to properly perform our contract with you or comply with legal obligations and we may have to terminate your membership. For other personal information you may not be under an obligation to provide it to us, but if you do not provide it then we may not be able to properly perform our contract with you.

Where you have given us your consent to use your personal information in a particular manner, you have the right to withdraw this consent at any time, which you may do by contacting us as described in the "Contacting us" section below.

Please note however that the withdrawal of your consent will not affect any use of the data made before you withdrew your consent and we may still be entitled to hold and process the relevant personal information to the extent that we are entitled to do so on bases other than your consent. Withdrawing consent may also have the same effects as not providing the information in the first place, for example we may no longer be able to provide certain member benefits to you.

The club has a Facebook social media page. If you join this page, please note that provider of the social media platform has their own privacy policies and that the club do not accept any responsibility or liability for these policies. Please check these policies before you submit any personal data on the club social media pages.

5. **DIRECT MARKETING**

Email, post and SMS marketing: from time to time, we may contact you by email, post or SMS with information about products and services we believe you may be interested in.

You can let us know at any time that you do not wish to receive marketing messages.

6. **DISCLOSURE OF YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION**

We share personal information with the following parties:

- Athletics NI: to allow them to properly administer the sports on a local, regional and national level.
- Commercial Partners: for the purposes of providing you with information on any tickets, special
 offers, opportunities, products and services and other commercial benefits provided by
 commercial partners as part of your membership package where you have given your consent for
 us to do so.

- The Government or our regulators: where we are required to do so by law or to assist with their investigations or initiatives.
- Police, law enforcement and security services: to assist with the investigation and prevention of crime and the protection of national security.

7. TRANSFERRING YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION INTERNATIONALLY

The personal information we collect is not transferred to and stored in countries outside of the UK and the European Union.

8. HOW LONG DO WE KEEP PERSONAL INFORMATION FOR?

The duration for which we retain your personal information will differ depending on the type of information and the reason why we collected it from you. However, in some cases personal information may be retained on a long-term basis: for example, personal information that we need to retain for legal purposes will normally be retained in accordance with usual commercial practice and regulatory requirements. Generally, where there is no legal requirement we retain all physical and electronic records for a period of two years after your last contact with us or the end of your membership. Exceptions to this rule are:

- o Information that may be relevant to personal injury or discrimination claims may be retained until the limitation period for those types of claims has expired. For personal injury or discrimination claims this can be an extended period as the limitation period might not start to run until a long time after the event.
- o Information about race results and grades to ensure historical sporting records are maintained.

It is important to ensure that the personal information we hold about you is accurate and up-to-date, and you should let us know if anything changes, for example if you change your phone number or email address. You can contact us by using the details set out in the "Contacting us" section below.

9. YOUR RIGHTS IN RELATION TO PERSONAL INFORMATION

As a data subject you are not obliged to share your personal data with the Club. If you choose not to share your personal data with us we may not be able to register or administer your membership.

You have the following rights in relation to your personal information:

- o the right to be informed about how your personal information is being used;
- o the right to access the personal information we hold about you;
- o the right to request the correction of inaccurate personal information we hold about you;
- o the right to request the erasure of your personal information in certain limited circumstances;
- o the right to restrict processing of your personal information where certain requirements are met;
- o the right to object to the processing of your personal information;
- the right to request that we transfer elements of your data either to you or another service provider; and

 the right to object to certain automated decision-making processes using your personal information.

You should note that some of these rights, for example the right to require us to transfer your data to another service provider or the right to object to automated decision making, may not apply as they have specific requirements and exemptions which apply to them and they may not apply to personal information recorded and stored by us. For example, we do not use automated decision making in relation to your personal data. However, some have no conditions attached, so your right to withdraw consent or object to processing for direct marketing are absolute rights.

Whilst this privacy notice sets out a general summary of your legal rights in respect of personal information, this is a very complex area of law. More information about your legal rights can be found on the Information Commissioner's website at https://ico.org.uk/for-the-public/.

If you are unhappy with the way we are using your personal information you can also complain to the UK Information Commissioner's Office or your local data protection regulator. We are here to help and encourage you to contact us to resolve your complaint first.

10. CHANGES TO THIS NOTICE

We may update this privacy notice from time to time. When we change this notice in a material way, we will update the version date at the bottom of this page. For significant changes to this notice we will try to give you reasonable notice unless we are prevented from doing so. Where required by law we will seek your consent to changes in the way we use your personal information.
