Leaders are often defined by how they handle difficult situations and unexpected moments of crisis. Unfortunately, you often only have one chance to get it right, and few opportunities to consider different approaches. This session will give you an opportunity to reflect on the value of different approaches to particular leadership challenges. We will use short video vignettes of experienced leaders discussing a difficult challenge they have faced. After a short description by the protagonist of the challenge, you will be asked how you would react in the same situation. We will then watch how the leader handled it, and discuss alternative approaches.


Think Like An Explorer

She shares these insights with her corporate audiences through story driven expedition case studies. She is an internationally acclaimed motivational speaker who has spoken in over 40 countries.

Cathy remains an active adventurer and in spring of 2019 did a ski ascent of Mt Steele, a 5000 meter peak in the Canadian Yukon.

Federica is Director of the World Development Report 2019. Prior to this position, she was a Manager in the Development Economics Global Indicators Group. In that role, she was responsible for developing global programs with a focus on policies and regulations across a number of thematic areas, including agriculture and agribusiness, skills, information and communication technology, public procurement and PPPs. Under her intellectual leadership, nine World Bank global reports have been published since 2014, including the Enabling the Business of Agriculture (2015, 2016, and 2017), Benchmarking Public procurement (2015, 2016, and 2017) and Procuring Infrastructure PPPs (2015, 2017, and 2018). She has published in peer-reviewed journals, including studies on firm productivity, global value chains, and the impact of regulation ongrowth and competition. She has also contributed to a number of World Bank reports, including the Environment for Women's Entrepreneurship in the Middle East and North Africa Region; Golden Growth: Restoring the Luster of the European Economic Model; the Jobs Study-Assessing Private Sector Contributions to Job Creation and Poverty Reduction; and the Turkey Investment Climate Assessment: from Crisis to Private Sector Led Growth. She holds a PhD in Economics and a Laurea in Political Science from the University of Rome, la Sapienza.
