Pastor's Note - November

So then neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but God who causes the growth. – 1 Corinthians 3:7

We will spend November wrapping up an old year, giving thanks for its abundance and blessings, and looking forward to what God has in store for us in this next year.

It is right of us to spend these last days of the Christian year focused on stewardship, our right and faithful response(ability) to all the many and abundant gifts God has blessed us with. On the first Sunday of November (the 7th) we will gather as one family to celebrate Harvest—to feast and give back a percentage of the bounty that God has blessed us with. That day we will offer our financial pledges to the ministry and mission of our church for the new year and celebrate the creativity of those within our congregation with our Spiritual Gifts Art Show after worship in Spring Hall on November 7th.

Pastor's Note - December

Come, thou long expected Jesus!

Christmas is coming soon, always before we know it, and when it arrives, it does so in full stereo mode—surround sound really! The messages of the season come to us from all directions, and they are loud!

There are plenty of stories to pay attention to during December. Department stores would like to tell you the story of Christmas as a time of materialism on steroids. There's the story of Santa Claus that captivates every child's heart and lends magic to Christmas. There's the story of family and friends gathered around tables and Christmas trees, passing around bowls of food and cookies, and opening presents.

We take part in these Christmas season celebrations, but for us, at the heart of the season is the story of Advent. The story of Advent gives purpose to these Christmas festivities. In the season of Advent that culminates with Christmas Day we join the shepherds and wise men in their celebration of Christ's arrival.

The weeks leading up to Christmas Day are for us. In them hold the opportunity to give ourselves to the spiritual practice of waiting and watching for Christ, to prepare Him room until we see the Messiah and say Yes to inviting Him into our lives and hearts. This December let's be people of a different narrative. Instead of being overwhelmed by the chaos of Christmas, let's focus ourselves on the ways God invites us into the new life that Christ's arrival brings at Advent.

Zechariah was the father of John the Baptist. I love the first words out of Zechariah's mouth when he was told he'd be a father:

Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel; he has come to his people and set them free. He has raised up for us a mighty savior, born of the house of his servant David. Through his holy prophets he promised of old that he would save us from our enemies, from the hands of all who hate us. He promised to show mercy to our fathers and to remember his holy covenant. This was the oath he swore to our father Abraham: to set us free from the hands of our enemies, free to worship him without fear, holy and righteous in his sight all the days of our life.

You, my child, shall be called the prophet of the Most High; for you will go before the Lord to prepare his way, to give his people knowledge of salvation by the forgiveness of their sins. In the tender compassion of our God the dawn from on high shall break upon us, to shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death, and to guide our feet into the way of peace.






