INCREASE YOUR 401(K)

Regretfully most of you do not have a Pension plan for your future. You will be relying on your 401(K). Therefore, this would be a great time to make a small increase in your 401(K) deduction. Years from now you will be thankful for what you did.

UNION REMINDERS:

NEW HIRES YOU must stay on top of your insurance coverage. There are many choices for you to review and time limits for you to apply for these benefits. You are now eligible to join the insurance between days 0-30 of your date of hire. This is the only 30 days to execute access to the health plan. If you do nothing you will automatically get medical but will not receive dental, extra eye care, and additional life insurance. If you are married or married with children, they will not be covered. It is important to enroll as soon as possible. Do not be late. I suggest that you call to make arrangements for health insurance since all calls are recorded. In the past, there were problems with online enrollments. There are many options to choose or reject. Contact General Dynamics Service Center (1-888 432-3633) Monday – Friday 9am to 9pm. As usual, I would like to ask my more senior members to please help the newer members around the yard. We're all brothers and sisters in this together. Let them know about the monthly meetings and encourage them to attend.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS OF PHONE NUMBER? PLEASE inform a union representative. The company is not allowed to share this kind of information with us, so we only know if you tell us.

In case, there is anyone that does not know where they can check their paystub online, you need to login to your fidelity netbenefits page. On the home page, halfway down, click on the link titled "GD ESS". On the next page click "Go to GD ESS". This will bring you to the Employee Self Service homepage where you can find a link to your paystub.

INSURANCE UPDATE: If you are out for more than 30 days and need to pay insurance, the General Dynamics Service Center will mail you a form and instructions. If you do not receive this letter in a timely manner, please call (888)432-3633.

Before you retire, please contact the union, and let us know. You DO NOT need to submit a withdrawal card. Retirees can receive a union jacket and/or watch. 40 years or more will receive both. 15-40 years will receive a watch.

Make sure to inform the union if you will be out of work for an extended amount of time so that we can make sure your dues are adjusted.

If you are a Military Veteran, please see Christopher Wasilewski on first shift for support.

New Members: Between days 0-30 days after your date of hire you must log onto the General Dynamics Service Center website at www.gdbenefits.com to enroll yourself, and your dependents, in the benefits package.

As always, do not forget to use the safety boot and eyeglass program that was negotiated by the MTC. A list of the different shoe manufacturers and times that they will be outside the front gate is available. The eyeglass store is open on both the inside of the main gate and the outside entrance for your convenience, check bulletin boards for the times they are open.

IMPORTANT: If you are put on notice, going to be disciplined, or sent to Security to give a statement of any kind, you have the right to have a steward present. Your first words should be, "I want to talk to a Steward".

IMPORTANT: Members who are out of work on any leave of absence such as Workers Compensation, Sedgwick short term disability insurance, FMLA, etc. it is your responsibility to pay your portion for medical, dental, and vision. You can be dropped from your benefits if you don't keep up your payments.

Please don't forget to notify the Union Hall (860-442-8281) if you change your address, phone number, or name. We need to have the correct information! When you notify the company of these changes they do not give the Union this new information. We appreciate your cooperation in this matter.

REMINDER: If you are out of work on compensation or accident & sickness insurance or any unpaid leave it is your responsibility to pay your dues. If your dues fall behind more than three months, your membership could be suspended. If you are out of work and have any questions regarding your dues, please call the Union Hall at 860-442-8281.

IMPORTANT: It is advised that you notify me one week in advance or as soon as you know when you will be returning to work from any Medical, Compensation or unpaid leave. The company doesn't know if you kept your dues paid up while you were out. It is important that I know your return date so I can submit a letter to the company to have your dues zeroed out under non collected. Once the company takes out your dues it will take me at least a month to return your money.

I like to begin by congratulating our recent Cohort 4 Apprentice Graduates. Angela Gibbs, David Kendall, Samuel Kinsman, and Shelby McNeely all were successful in completing the academic and working hours requirements needed. Congratulating / Well Done!

I am pleased to report that the Union Leadership has begun their planning for negotiations. This is discussions on how to proceed and make proposals. First on the agenda is designing our survey questioner which we hope to be passed out in March. This is how we expect it to work: The International of the Machinist have a computer program that will provide the survey sheets. Our Stewards will make sure that everyone will receive the questionnaire. There will be a one (1) week period for everyone to fill it out and return it to their steward who will then give it to me, and I will process it back to the Machinist program which will tabulate the results. As we said this will be essential for us to set our priorities when we start meeting with the Company. It is very important that you complete the survey in a timely manner with legitimate and reasonable requests. Names are optional and not required.

The Union has recognized that we have a serious problem with harassment in the shipyard. All types, sexual, gender preference religion, disabilities, etc. The Company also knows we have problems. They have policies and regulations that carry some very stiff discipline. We also recognized that it is a problem with salary as well. I deal with an average of two per month some locals twice that amount. It must stop, and the culture must change beginning now. We need to learn to respect one another and their differences. I would like to think if we had a better culture our work environment would be easier and less stressful, and we actually could like coming to work. I would like to hear from anyone who could offer some ideas.

Its hard to be a newby, and remember, we all were new at one time. With that being said, its okay to not know everything at first, there is a learning period. But after awhile, if someone is not catching on, it's a problem. Such is the case with some of the newer supervisors. We trust that when a supervisor, management, assigns a job to our members , that it is ready to work. There is nothing wrong with questioning something you do not understand.

I want to remind everyone that it is your responsibility to contact the main office in Meriden about paying your dues upon going out on A and S, workers comp, leave of absence, military duty, retirement, or, any other reason for absenting the payroll deduction process.

The Company continues to keep hiring large numbers of people. We are currently working out details where our own members would help in the hiring process called "Ambassador Program". More info will be put out at a later date.

We have been having a problem with management, mainly ship superintendents, doing our work. This is an Article II violation of our contract. I get the Safety angle of moving something that could cause harm, but there is a line that get crossed way to often. If you see anyone from management doing our work, please ask them to stop and tell them that is our job. (they sure don't want us to take their work!). If you don't feel comfortable confronting a member of management, please talk to a steward. That's our job.

Electric Boat nearly had a catastrophic incident with the failure of the 263 basin pontoon. If that failed with a submarine on it, it could have been fatal to our some of our workforce as well as Navy personnel. I am not sure as to how severe this will impact our schedules. I hear there is on going construction on a new one that is being pushed aggressively. Hopefully that gets here in a timely manner and no one building it gets hurt. You may be hearing a lot of rumors about this affecting our workload, but that is all just rumors. We have a SHIPload of work coming and the company is struggling to get people who want to work here.

Our regular monthly meeting is held on the 2nd Tuesday of the month at 2:45 PM at the Union Hall at 33 Sacred Heart Drive, Groton. I have seen many new faces recently at the meetings. That is great. You young guys (and girls) are our future! This Union is Your Union! Let's keep it strong!
