FRI Face Obstacles, Opts For Growth A Letter from the President

There are many great stories about FRI and its impact over the last dozen years, but the one that seems to stick with people is the origin story -- My new bicycle was stolen from our home, leaving Rob and me with a choice. Would we move from our home? Would we stay, accept that this was a neighborhood that couldn't have nice things? Or would we do something to effect a change?

We chose that latter path. We were fortunate enough to find hundreds of our neighbors ready to make the same stand. Our decision to stay and work to change things made a big difference in our community.

Today, we all face the same decision. Something has been taken from us, and we must decide whether to accept, flee or fight.

For much of the last decade, federal Weed and Seed programs provided most of the funding for FRI's work. This means that we've been able to focus all of our energies on our mission of eradicating crime, building community and bringing important amenities to an otherwise forgotten corner of the city. Our new library and a safer community are testaments to the success of that work.

But in April, the federal money went away for good. The Weed and Seed program itself was killed in Washington, meaning that we could not, as we'd done twice before, add another federal grant to fund our operations.

We began preparations for this new reality last year with our "Everything's Comin Up Roses" gala celebration, raising more than \$27,000 in our first-ever fundraiser. However, actual termination of our federal funding came even sooner than we had anticipated.

This was a major setback. We had to lay off our full-time staff, keeping our Executive Director, Alice Zaccarello, on a few days a week to help us try to find a way forward. As we struggled to keep up our services with a drastically reduced budget, there was serious discussion about shutting down FRI.

But, just as the community rallied to form FRI 13 years ago, I am pleased and touched that our community is "rising up" to ensure that our good work continues. In addition to the board, a group of business leaders has gathered and launched the FRI Community Connection membership program. This program seeks to bring together our residents and businesses in a more meaningful way, while at the same time raising the funds we need to be selfsustaining.

These are still the early days, but an impressive Founder's Circle of the FRI Community Connection stepped forward and voted with their wallets -- providing seed funding that we need you to feed with your participation as well. Just watch us grow!

We will continue to consider every resident and business a member of our community. But in order for us to continue to serve and grow, as a minimum we need you to register online as a Registered Member (it is free), so that you can receive important messages from us and from the local businesses who support our mission. 

Remarkable Transition in White Rock East

Maybe just changing the name from 2-Points to White Rock East has had some kind of transformational influence, but there is definitely a change for the better in our part of far East Dallas. The word this week from Principal Megan Barringer at George W. Truett Elementary is upbeat. She reports that while there are definitely tight places in the new budget, Truett will get to keep its full-day Pre-K program. Those students will allow the

school to have two Assistant Principals and several new staff positions. She also reports that according to her calculations, Truett missed achieving "Recognized" status by only 3 points in science and achieved "significant gains" in both reading and math. This from a school that, a little over a year ago, was fluctuating between "Unacceptable" and "Acceptable" status! This past school year has also produced the first PTA Truett has had in more than 12 years with a current paid membership of over 80 parents and community supporters, and the first graduated group of parents from Concilio, a wonderful program to help parents become active advocates for their children. FRI brought 12 workshops from the Museum of Nature

and Science to 672 students at Truett, focusing on science and math to reinforce classroom instructions. Ms. Barringer also states that she is planning a "Truett Makeover" day soon to add some new color to the walls and a wider range of decor for classrooms. Anyone who would like to help at Truett at any time is welcome. Our overall crime rate remains low. We have experienced one or two burglaries and some of the usual summertime mischief and vandalism. Truett Crime Watch membership continues to increase with a number of new members found among our Hispanic residents. Our work on an Area Land Use Study- Redevelopment Vision is wrapping up. The first draft is with the City of Dallas. A community-wide meeting in the fall helped finalize the plan before it goes to the City Council in September. We are thinking ahead to projects we can use to pave the way for larger changes over time. We are seeing some hopeful signs already. For example, Save-a-Lot Grocery Store has opened a "training" grocery store in what was the Tom Thumb center at Buckner and John West. This is a convenience that residents here have not

had in years. We can also offer several attractive spots for retail development on Ferguson Road, at North Buckner, and in the small industrial areas near I-30 and Chenault. As we begin to work toward the redesign and redevelopment of our neighborhoods and retail centers, this is a community on the move.



Recreation Center Gets Update

The Harry Stone Recreation Center (2403 Millmar) closed at the end of August for renovation. The design and remodeling includes a circular, glass-enclosed office at the front of the building, a 1500 square foot, state-of-the-art fitness center, commercial kitchen with adjacent dining, new meeting rooms, and landscaping and lighting that will offer greater safety as well as a more attractive setting. The two gymnasiums will be refurbished, and the dance studio with its special flooring and mirrored walls will be rebuilt. The Center is expected to reopen in a year.







Avoid Becoming a Victim of Fraud

The U.S. Postal Service provides guidelines on how to avoid fraud:

Warning Signs

Sounds too good to be true.

Pressures you to act "right away." Guarantees success.

Promises unusually high returns. Requires an upfront investment

-even for a free prize.

Buyers want to overpay you for an item and have you send them the difference.

Doesn't have the look of a real business. Something just doesn't feel right.

Play It Safe

Never click on a link inside an e-mail to visit a website, type the address into your browser instead.

If you have any doubts about a company's legitimacy, verify them with the Better Business Bureau.

Report online fraud to the Federal Trade Commission at ftc.gov/complaint.

Retain and review your receipts and statements for accuracy.

Shred confidential documents instead of discarding them in the trash.

Fraud Facts

Your bank will never e-mail or call you for your account number.

Don't wire money to people you don't know. Be cautious of work-at-home job offers.

There are no legitimate jobs that involve reshipping items or financial instruments from your home.

Foreign lotteries are illegal in the U.S. You can't win no matter what they say.

Check your monthly bank statements for charges you don't recognize.

Order a copy of your credit report once a year from annualcreditreport.com.

Greater Casa View Kicks Off Land Use Study

Greater Casa View (GCV) held town hall meetings in January and May of this year to develop a vision for the Upper Ferguson Road Corridor from Oates Drive to LBJ Freeway. Omniplan, a 55-yr-old architectural and planning firm, is guiding the community through the development of the study.

In January, the attendants broke into focus groups, identifying the Casa View Shopping Center, Sidewalks, Art, Gateways Into the Community, Development, Beautification, the Casa View Library Building, DART, Lighting, Better Retail, and Community Identity as their primary interests.

Councilmember Sheffie Kadane supported GCV's efforts, saying that when we work for a better quality of life, we make people want to come here to live.

Omniplan collected and compiled input from that meeting and prepared responses and design concepts, which they presented at the May meeting. They presented GCV's challenges and assets, gateway locations, development, green space opportunities, the connecting of pedestrian areas along the corridor, and community priorities.

Omniplan also presented conceptual drawings of Ferguson Road which included narrowing the road to 2 lanes in each direction in residential areas, adding bike lanes, adding room for landscaping by sidewalks, and adding underground power lines.

The community then broke out into groups to supplement Omniplan's presentation. Topics discussed included finding a new use for the Casa View Library Building, Neighborhood and Business Signage, DART Shelters, Mobility, and Community Identity.


