"I'm gonna make old cool," says Curtis, the original founder of Georgetown's Fogue Studios, a 6,000-square-foot creative space for artists who have successfully crossed the half-century mark. "I wanted to do something for people over 50 to make them feel relevant. I lost my job at 53," Curtis says. "A lot of people at my company got let go because we 'aged out'." She decided to embrace her age by calling it Fogue, a take on being an "old fogey." Her idea was to give each artist, musician, or writer a voice, plus have gatherings so the artists could share their art.
