**Filled/Closed** Southwest Airlines Tour - Back by Popular Demand

Friday, January 19, 2024 10:00 a.m. Sky Harbor Airport

Several members have requested this tour again so here goes. This is a unique opportunity to tour inside Southwest Airlines Maintenance Facility at Sky Harbor Airport. The last tour we had was one week after Southwest had an engine exploded so we spent time looking at engine compressor blades and discussed the inspection process.

What I have found interesting is that all of us have worked in some way to design and build avionics hardware, APUs and jet engines but have not seen them installed. Here you can poke you head in the electronics bay, undercarriage bay, jet engines and if you are lucky sit in the cockpit.

Every tour is different. You may be able to walk through an aircraft and sit in the cockpit then tour the maintenance and operation areas in a two-hour guided tour. You will find out why the first aircraft were painted those colors, how to fit an aircraft that is too tall into the hanger and maybe debate the correct part numbers of the APU we see in the store rooms.

One time we sat in an aircraft only 5 flight hours old and not yet entered service. Yes, it had the new aircraft smell.

This free tour is planned for Friday, January 19th at 10:00 a.m. but names of all attendees are required in advance for security purposes. This will be our 7<sup>th</sup> tour and spaces fill quickly. I have to limit the group to 40 for practical reasons.

# The Arizona Gold Mining Experience

Cave Creek Museum 6140 East Skyline Drive Cave Creek, Arizona

January 27, 2024, 10:00 a.m.

Ever wondered how gold was extracted from rock in the early days of mining?

The Cave Creek Museum's ARIZONA GOLD MINING EXPERIENCE™ is unique with its display of the complete hard rock ore extraction process, with the mine shaft, tramway, ore carts, crushing and extraction, that are always on display but operated on 2nd Saturdays. The highlight is Arizona's only fully operational ten-stamp ore crushing mill. The ten 1,000 lb. stamps slam down in synchronized motion to pound the ore removed from the mine into a fine gravel. The stamp mill was brought from its former location at the Golden Reef Mine on Continental Mountain to where it sits today.

This is the only operational mining stamp mill in Arizona today that sits only 5 miles from its original site on the mountain.

Hawaiian Cruise

### March 16 through March 30, 2024

My husband and I have traveled to Hawaii three times by cruise ship and four times for hotel stays. It is a lovely state to visit! All of the islands are beautiful: however, my favorite has always been Maui. News of Lahaina's fire was very upsetting. Every trip to Maui meant some time spent in Lahaina almost every day, lunch, dinner, shopping, and sightseeing. The town is organizing and planning for housing, shops, and restaurants. They will rise again!

Princess sent our cruise group E-mails to announce a change to our itinerary. They cancelled our stop in Maui and substituted an additional stop in Kona. Later Princess changed other cruises that had stops in Lahaina with a stop in Kawii, another beautiful island. Princess really has kept its cruisers aware of their changes.

Our cruise is still 15 days long. We leave the Port of San Pedro at 3pm on Saturday March 16<sup>th,</sup> 2024. We spend March 17<sup>th</sup>, 18<sup>th</sup>, 19<sup>th</sup> and 20th at sea. What is there to do at sea for so many days?. There are ukulele lessons, a choir looks for volunteers (it's fun), dance classes. Movies Under the Stars, jewelry store sales, and the casino is open while at sea.

Next we spend two full days in Honolulu. There is a lot of history in Honolulu. Princess offers many tours for their passengers including whale watching and hop on-hop off. There are also tours that you can arrange yourself. I recommend the tour of the ship USS Arizona. You can make reservations at the Pearl Harbor Visitor Center at <a href="https://www.recreation.gov">www.recreation.gov</a>. From anywhere in Waikiki or the Ala Moana Shopping Center, take the #20 or #42 public bus (called TheBus), which will take you to the USS Arizona Memorial Visitor Center. If you're not sure where to get off, just ask the driver. A ticket costs \$2.50.

The Polynesian Culture Center offers travel through time and space as you experience thousands of years' worth of culture from six different island nations.

Our last port is Kona on the big island of Hawaii. There is one Hawaiian historical site we enjoyed which was The Place of Refuge. It tells stories about the culture of the earlier Hawaiians and their gods. Another private tour is to the Hawaii Volcanoes National Park & Black Beach.

The return trip home starts on March 25<sup>th</sup>, 26<sup>th</sup>, 27<sup>th</sup>, and 28<sup>th</sup> This segment is slower to give you time to recover from the long Hawaiian ports. There are leis making classes and Hawaiian entertainment in the common areas of the ship.

On March 29<sup>th</sup> there is a quick stop in Ensenada, Mexico. Several excursions are offered by Princess. Then it's back to our Port of San Pedro early on March 30th. There is still time to join us! Call our travel agent at Ford's World Travel at (623) 933-8256.




