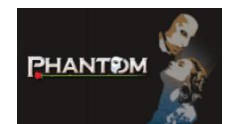

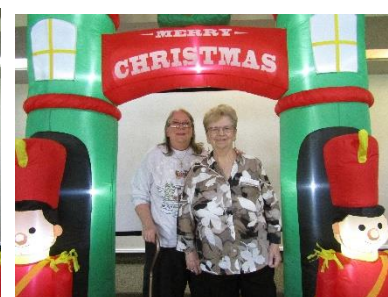
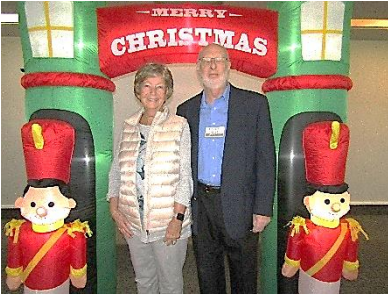

Zero Waste Team Education

The City of Phoenix has goals to reach 50% waste diversion by 2030 and zero waste by 2050, consistent with the goals set by the City's [Climate Action Plan](#). To reach these goals, Phoenix seeks to develop the circular economy and maximize recycling and reuse efforts to further divert resources away from the landfill. Our efforts will lessen environmental impacts by reducing the amount of greenhouse gases entering the atmosphere, while creating healthier communities, and spurring economic activity.

In order to reach the city's zero waste goal by 2050, the Zero Waste team provides education and community outreach to teach the community about waste diversion. These methods include group tours of the city's North Gateway Transfer Station and Materials Recovery Facility (MRF), educational presentations to schools, neighborhood and community meetings and hosting informational booths at community events.

These aircraft are used to test and develop various new aerospace technologies, from turbine engines to advanced avionics and high-speed



connectivity solutions. You will get to meet some members of Honeywell's team, which includes highly skilled engineers, technicians, mechanics, and pilots who work together to push the boundaries of aviation innovation.

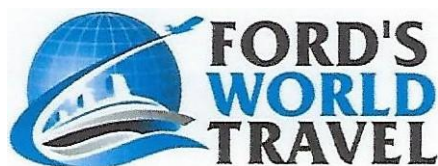

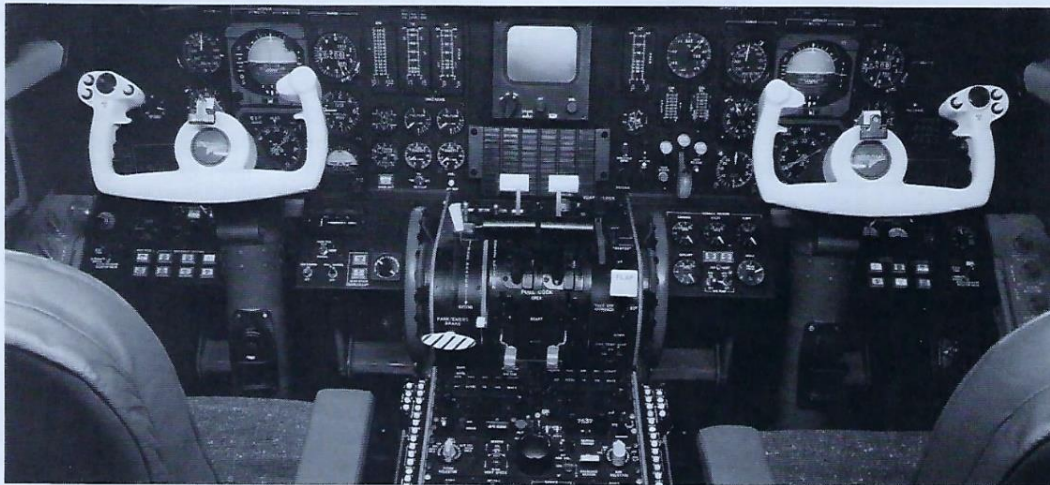

SOLID PERFORMER — All Sperry components in this Grumman Gulfstream II performed flawlessly during installation, checkout and flight test at Executive Aircraft Services, Redbird Airport, Dallas, where work was done. N903G, G-II serial 172, was delivered Mar. 19 and is based at Toledo (Ohio) Express Airport. Installation, first in a G-II involving a full SPI-80 flight director system, was

supervised by E. L. (Johnny) Miller, VP, avionics; and Charles Etheridge, general manager, avionics, for the division Cooper Airmotive, Inc. It also includes: SP-50G autopilot, dual Sperry air data computers, dual C-11B compass system, C-6 RMIs, VG-311 vertical gyro, altitude preselect and alerter.

New AA-100: high quality, low price

For the first time, distributors will be able to offer their customers both a low-priced radio altimeter and Sperry quality performance, reliability, and unsurpassed product support.

One of only two radio altimeters on the market priced under \$3,000, the complete Sperry AA-100, with three-inch pointer dial indicator, R/T unit, antenna with RF cable, and all required connectors lists for \$2,990. It provides 40 to 2,500 ft. coverage with an expanded 40-500 ft. scale.

Weighing under six pounds, the AA-100 system offers precision radio altimetry at a price compatible with light twin and single engine aircraft installations. It has many features of systems priced \$2,500 to \$3,000 more. These include continuously settable decision height (DH) bug, a DH light and provisions for aural DH warning.

The AA-100 indicator uses a standard 3AT1 panel cutout and has a maximum panel depth of less than five inches to facilitate installation in limited panel space of smaller aircraft.

The AA-100 R/T unit will provide output for a flight director rising runway display. The system uses one antenna and operates on 14 or 28 volts DC without modification. Extensive flight testing has demonstrated accurate and steady performance over the full altitude and temperature range under widely varying terrain conditions, including glassy water. Lock-on is maintained at up to 40 deg. of roll and 30 deg. of pitch.

The AA-100 system will be available this summer with volume deliveries commencing in July. The system carries a one year, 1,000 hour warranty.

Desert Botanical Garden is a 140-acre botanical garden located in Papago Park, at 1201 N. Galvin Parkway in Phoenix, Central Arizona.

Founded by the Arizona Cactus and Native Flora Society in 1937 and established at this site in 1939, the garden now has more than 50,000 plants, in more than 4,000 taxa, one-third of which are native to the area, including 379 species, which are rare, threatened or endangered.

All guests (members or general admission guests) are required to register and have a timed-entry ticket prior to entry to the Garden.

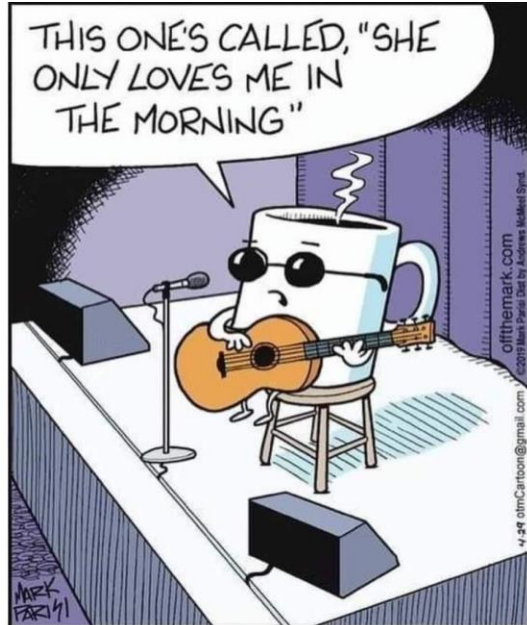
