Wrigley Mansion Tour on February 15th, 2025

The Wrigley Mansion in Phoenix, Arizona, has a fascinating history! Built between 1929 and 1931 by chewing-gum magnate William Wrigley Jr., it was a 50th wedding anniversary gift for his beloved wife, Ada. The mansion is also known as La Colina Solana, meaning "Sunny Hill," and features stunning views of the city and mountains.

One unique aspect of the mansion is its floor tiles, which were made from clay sourced from Wrigley's own factory on Catalina Island. These tiles were transported to Phoenix by mule, adding a personal touch to the mansion.

The mansion boasts ornate ceilings and beautifully detailed interiors, reflecting the opulence of the 1930s. Additionally, there's a charming story about the chair height being adjusted to accommodate Ada's shorter stature, ensuring her comfort.















Southwest Airlines - March 13th



TERN 100 CERTIFICATION has been completed in Grumman Gulfstream II demonstrator (aircraft serial #173) at Page Gulfstream, San Antonio. This and just-completed certification in Lockheed JetStar II owned by Schlumberger at Continental Radio, Houston, bring to five the

number of aircraft types in which TERN 100 automatic navigation system is certified. Certifications gained in four different FAA regions include -731 JetStar, E-90 King Air, and Boeing 707.

Sperry to equip new MU-300 jet

The newly announced Mitsubishi MU-300 business jet will have a Sperry integrated AFCS, flight and air data instruments and gyroscopics aboard when it makes its U.S. debut in early 1979.

The Avionics Division is providing its new SPZ-900 flight control system, based on the SPZ-200A/500 series autopilot, for the first two prototype MU-300 aircraft. First flight of the MU-300 has been scheduled for August in Japan, with airframe certification flights in that country planned for completion by the end of the year.

Both prototypes will then be disassembled and shipped to the Mitsubishi plant in San Angelo, Tex., where first U.S. flights are planned beginning in April 1979. A decision on proceeding into production of the MU-300 is expected later this year.

Flight director instruments in prototype No. 1 will be the four-inch Sperry HZ-444 ADI and

RD-444 HSI. Aircraft No. 2 will be equipped with the five-inch Sperry AD-600 ADI and RD-600 HSI on the left side.

Other Sperry equipment in both prototypes will include C-14 compass systems, VG-14 remote vertical gyros, air data computers driving servoed baro altimeters and altitude alert/preselect units, and RH-444 RMIs.

SPZ-900 autopilot certification flights will begin from San Angelo about July 1, 1979, with certification expected by mid-October.

When complete, it will be the first production certification of a Sperry automatic flight control system in a Mitsubishi aircraft. The SPZ-200 system has been certified under STC in the MU-2 series for several years.

With the MU-300, Sperry's Avionics Division has captured the last four competitions to become standard flight control systems supplier on new business jets.





Desert Botanical Garden is a 140-acre botanical garden located in Papago Park, at 1201 N. Galvin Parkway in Phoenix, <u>Central Arizona</u>.

Founded by the Arizona Cactus and Native Flora Society in 1937 and established at this site in 1939, the garden now has more than 50,000 plants, in more than 4,000 taxa, one-third of which are native to the area, including 379 species, which are rare, threatened or endangered.

All guests (members or general admission guests) are required to register and have a timedentry ticket prior to entry to the Garden.
