#### Southwest Airlines Tour- Full

Several members have requested this tour again so here goes. This is a unique opportunity to tour inside Southwest Airlines Maintenance Facility at Sky Harbor Airport. The last tour we had was one week after Southwest had an engine exploded so we spent time looking at engine compressor blades and discussed the inspection process.

What I have found interesting is that all of us have worked in some way to design and build avionics hardware, APUs and jet engines but have not seen them installed. Here you can poke you head in the electronics bay, undercarriage bay, jet engines and if you are lucky sit in the cockpit.

Every tour is different. You may be able to walk through an aircraft and sit in the cockpit then tour the maintenance and operation areas in a two-hour guided tour. You will find out why the first aircraft were painted those colors, how to fit an aircraft that is too tall into the hanger and maybe debate the correct part numbers of the APU we see in the store rooms.

One time we sat in an aircraft only 5 flight hours old and not yet entered service. Yes, it had the new aircraft smell.

This free tour is planned for Friday January 19th at 10 am but names of all attendees are required in advance for security purposes. This will be our 7<sup>th</sup> tour and spaces fill quickly. I have to limit the group to 40 for practical reasons.

# The Arizona Gold Mining Experience

#### **January 27, 2024**

Ever wondered how gold was extracted from rock in the early days of mining. The Cave Creek

Museum's AZ GOLD MINING EXPERIENCE<sup>™</sup> is unique with its display of the complete hard rock ore extraction process, with the mine shaft, tramway, ore carts, crushing and extraction, that are always on display, but operated on 2nd Saturdays. The highlight is Arizona's only fully operational ten-stamp ore crushing mill. The ten 1,000 lb. stamps slam down in synchronized motion to pound the ore removed from the mine into a fine gravel. The stamp mill was brought from its former location at the Golden Reef Mine on Continental Mountain to where it sits today.

This is the only operational mining stamp mill in Arizona today that sits only 5 miles from its original site on the mountain.

Cave Creek Museum 6140 E Skyline Drive, Cave Creek, AZ.

This experience gets booked up well in advance so the AAC has purchased 20 tickets so book early to avoid disappointment. Tickets are \$15 each.

# **Desert Botanical Gardens**

Free admission days, Second Tues of each month - 8AM - 6PM



The Desert Botanical Garden has free admission on the second Tuesday of the month from the hours of 8-6 PM. The garden and the neighboring Phoenix Zoo are accessible from the bus line; however, not by the light rail.

Best advice is to check the bus schedule, as times and bus numbers are subject to change.

Desert Botanical Garden is a 140-acre botanical garden located in <u>Papago Park, at 1201 N. Galvin Parkway in</u> <u>Phoenix, central</u> <u>Arizona.</u>

Founded by the Arizona Cactus and Native Flora Society in 1937 and established at this site in 1939, the garden now has more than 50,000 plants, in more than 4,000 taxa, one-third of which are native to the area, including 379 species, which are rare, threatened or endangered.

All guests (members or general admission guests) are required to register and have a timedentry ticket prior to entry to the Garden.
