The recycling tour was very interesting and everyone was very engaged. We learned that there are two parts to the Transfer center: one is the recycling half and the other is normal landfill stuff and nothing stays at the Transfer station hence the name

We also learned the following

- All plastic bottles can be recycled and are sent to Mexico to return as a new bottle in the states
- If you are recycling glass, take off any lid and send it with the glass botch, otherwise, the glass might break
- if you are recycling aluminum, crunch it up into a baseball size ball, to give it more weight so it will be sent to the correct place
- do not put any recyclable into a plastic bag

Southwest Airlines - March 13th



SPERRY'S ON BOARD — The Avionics Division will supply standard IFR equipment for the new Bell 222, scheduled for production delivery beginning in 1979.

Bell makes Sperry standard on 222

A long-term production contract for single pilot IFR automatic flight control systems in the new Bell 222 helicopter has further solidified Sperry's dominance in the rotary wing avionics systems market.

The contract from Bell Helicopter Textron to the Avionics Division of Sperry Flight Systems makes Sperry IFR equipment standard on the 222. John Dietrich, Avionics Division marketing manager for OEM helicopter product sales, said that achieving a standard position on the 222 gives Sperry a base from which to develop and introduce ever more advanced and cost effective avionics systems for the full range of the helicopter market.

"The significance of this award goes far beyond the size of the contract itself," Dietrich said. "This is the first significant contract from a helicopter airframe manufacturer to an avionics supplier with a production quantity commitment for integrated automatic flight control and avionics systems over an extended period of years."

Dietrich said the Bell-Sperry contract extends into the 1980s and specifies that every 222 built with single pilot IFR capability will be Sperry equipped. He added that the 222 will be the first new helicopter to enter the corporate market designed with single pilot capability.

Bell plans to obtain FAA certification for the

222 this year and deliver the first production machine in early 1979. Bell has prospective buyers for more than 100 of its 222s in the business and commercial market. The 222 is also a competitor for the U.S. Coast Guard Short Range Recovery (SRR) helicopter program.

BO-105, 109A win single pilot STCs

At the end of 1977, Sperry doubled the number of helicopters certified for single pilot IFR operations with its HelCIS/Helipilot systems as the MBB Boeing Vertol BO-105 and the Agusta 109A received FAA approval for virtually unlimited all-weather operations.

On Nov. 28, STC SH2679SW issued to **Associated Air Center**, Dallas, cleared the BO-105 for full single pilot IFR, followed less than a month later by the award of STC SH2699SW to **Atlantic Aviation** for the 109A.

Thus, the BO-105 and 109A joined the Aerospatiale Gazelle and the Bell 212 in the stable of single pilot IFR helicopters. Both the BO-105 and 109A were certified for IFR operations with basic stability and attitude retencentinued on page 3


