The weather is starting to cool down, and that means we can start looking forward to our upcoming fall activities! We've got an exciting schedule ahead with plenty of opportunities to learn, explore, and enjoy time together.

We kick off **November** with a visit to the **Commemorative Air Force Museum**, home to several restored planes and fascinating military artifacts. Our docent will be a former Honeywell pilot who does an excellent job explaining the displays and sharing his experiences.

December, we'll attend the **Arizona Broadway Theater** for their production of *A Christmas Story*, based on the beloved classic film. This is always a popular event, and tickets sell quickly, so don't delay!

We've finalized details for our **Holiday Lunch**, which will be held at the same location as last year — still the best value we could find. February brings two wonderful opportunities. First, we'll revisit **Tovrea Castle**, one of our most requested tours. Since COVID, tickets have become so limited that a lottery system was introduced, but thanks to a Garrett Club member whose daughter is President of the Tovrea Carraro Society, we're able to schedule our own private group tour! Let me know early if you'd like to attend.

We'll also visit **Manistee Ranch Park**, listed on the *National Register of Historic Places*. The ranch features four historic buildings — a garage, office, barn, and house — that offer a glimpse into Glendale's past. The 7,000-square-foot home includes antique furnishings, vintage photos, and historic farm equipment that tell the story of the area's rich history.

<u>In March</u>, we'll tour the **Palo Verde Nuclear Power Station** — a rare and fascinating opportunity to see one of the largest power plants in the country. Space is very limited, so sign up quickly if you're interested!

In March we will be attending a musical – **Always Patsy Cline** - at the popular Hale Theater in Gilbert. This an opportunity for members who reside in southeast Phoenix.

Ping Factory Tour Success

Our two-hour Ping Factory Tour started with an introduction to Ping history, mostly about Patriarch, Karsten Solheim, and how a GE engineer ended up in the golf equipment manufacturing business! Ping has expanded significantly over the years and is still a family-owned business. One interesting fact that amazed me is that Ping has only borrowed money once in its entire 66-year history and that was to buy its initial milling machine.

We visited the new club manufacturing factory floor. For anyone who was involved in a Quality Black Belt project this was particularly fascinating as our excellent guide described in detail the flow of materials from incoming to shipping and the attention to quality control throughout. We were also shown several other areas of the factory that support or supplement the golf business.

Our group was also permitted to enter the "Putter Vault" which contains a gold platted putter, inscribed with the golfer's name and date, representing every Ping putter used to ever win a sanctioned event. White gloves were given out for those of us who wanted to touch or handle the golden putters. Yes, it really is a huge locked vault!

Back by popular demand, we are revisiting the Phoenix Recycling Plant. Ever wondered what happens to all your trash and how it gets recycled? Well now you can find out





Zero Waste Team Education

The City of Phoenix has goals to reach 50% waste diversion by 2030 and zero waste by 2050, consistent with the goals set by the City's <u>Climate Action Plan</u>. To reach these goals, Phoenix seeks to develop the circular economy and maximize recycling and reuse efforts to further divert resources away from the landfill. Our efforts will lessen environmental impacts by reducing the amount of greenhouse gases entering the atmosphere, while creating healthier communities, and spurring economic activity.

In order to reach the city's zero waste goal by 2050, the Zero Waste team provides education and community outreach to teach the community about waste diversion. These methods include group tours of the city's North Gateway Transfer Station and Materials Recovery Facility (MRF), educational presentations to schools, neighborhood and community meetings and hosting informational booths at community events.

Now you can experience the sight, sound and smell of recycling at the North Gateway Transfer Station.

Ever wanted to visit the building near Sky Harbor Airport that looks like a wedding cake? This place has become so popular that they had to institute a lottery system for tickets. Fortunately, I was able to get group tickets for two tours each with 12 people. If you go the engineers in you will realize why they had to strengthen the floors and see if you can find the eggs.

Tours are approximately 2 hours and include the historic Castle's main floor and basement, extensive grounds and cactus gardens surrounding the Castle. Most of the tour is outside riding a tram so dress warm. The tour starts at 10.30 am and the grounds are cool. The tour is wheel chair accessible but no electric scooters are allowed. There are seats inside the building to rest so it is not a strenuous tour.

Guests are greeted by Tovrea Carraro Society volunteers at the Visitor Center and taken through the Carraro Cactus Gardens on a tram with a docent. The tour winds through the beautiful 44 acres, viewing the outer buildings, before arriving at Tovrea Castle.

The Society has increased the price to \$25 each.

Only a limited number of tickets are available, so book early to avoid disappointment.

Manistee Ranch Park

Private tour Saturday Feb 28, 2026, 10am - 11:30am

Built in 1897 by a wealthy lumber baron from Wisconsin named Herbert W. Hamilton, Manistee Ranch began as a 320-acre spread along what is now Northern Avenue. Hamilton sold the place to Louis M. Sands, a prominent Arizona businessman and rancher, in 1907, and it stayed in the Sands family until it was sold to the Glendale Historical Society in 1996.

Today the ranch is on the National Register of Historic Places, and its four buildings – a garage, office, barn and house – can be visited to get a taste of Glendale's rich history.

Attendees will tour a 7000-square-foot home decorated with antique furnishings that are original to the home or that were collected from within the city. The basement houses a collection of photographs, Glendale grammar school items and old farm equipment used on the ranch.

Palo Verde Nuclear Power Station Tour

March 5th and March 10th, 2026



This is a unique opportunity to get up close to a nuclear reactor. However, this tour requires a lot of walking across a very large 4,000-acre campus so you must be physically fit. Palo Verde is located 45 miles West of Phoenix off the I10 and is the largest nuclear power plant in the United States serving about four million people.

The Palo Verde Generating Station is located in the Arizona desert, and is the only large nuclear power plant in the world that is not located near a large body of water. The power plant evaporates the water from the treated sewage from several nearby cities and towns to provide the cooling of the steam that it produces.

Each tour is limited to 20 people and starts on site at 9am. It starts with an overview briefing before a walking tour. Considering the remote location we might want to organize ride share. I will limit the tickets to 2 per member.

Free admission days, Second Tues of each month - 8AM - 6PM



The Desert Botanical Garden has free admission on the second Tuesday of the month from the hours of 8-6 PM. The garden and the neighboring Phoenix Zoo are accessible from the bus line; however, not by the light rail.

Best advice is to check the bus schedule, as times and bus numbers are subject to change.

Desert Botanical Garden is a 140-acre botanical garden located in Papago Park, at 1201 N. Galvin Parkway in Phoenix, Central Arizona.

Founded by the Arizona Cactus and Native Flora Society in 1937 and established at this site in 1939, the garden now has more than 50,000 plants, in more than 4,000 taxa, one-third of which are native to the area, including 379 species, which are rare, threatened or endangered.

All guests (members or general admission guests) are required to register and have a timed- entry ticket prior to entry to the Garden.






