Logline

Pug, a young boy growing up on a combative West Baltimore block, finds solace in a group of illegal dirt bike riders known as The 12 O'Clock Boys.

Short Synopsis

Pug, a thirteen year old boy living on a dangerous Westside block of Baltimore, has one goal in mind: to join the 12 O'Clock Boys; the notorious urban dirt-bike group. Converging from all parts of the inner city, they invade the streets and clash with police, who are forbidden to chase the bikes for fear of endangering the public. Pug looks to the pack for mentorship, spurred by their dangerous lifestyle and deep bonds. He narrates their world as if explaining a dreamscape—an action-packed world full of power and freedom. The film captures this world with unprecedented intimacy as the riders themselves guide us into a culture few get to access. The film presents the pivotal years of change in a boy's life growing up in one of the most dangerous and economically depressed cities in the United States.

The Story

Pug, a wisecracking thirteen year old living on a dangerous Westside block in Baltimore, has one goal in mind: to join the 12 O'Clock Boys, the notorious urban dirt-bike group (riding off-road motorbikes and four-wheelers). Converging from all parts of the inner city, they disregard traffic laws, roadblocks, and the police, who are a constant presence, yet are forbidden to chase the bikes for fear of endangering the public.

Pug's admiration for the riders falls sharply into focus with the death of his older brother—his last remaining paternal figure. Left to his own devices, and at constant odds with his mother Coco, Pug looks to the pack as a means of expression and mentorship, spurred by their dangerous and rebellious lifestyle. Pugs guides us through the treacherous streets of Baltimore as he searches to define himself and join the pack.

Pug's journey is interspersed with the revelation of the group as a whole. He narrates their world as if explaining a dreamscape—an action-packed world full of power and freedom captured with unprecedented intimacy as the riders themselves guide us into a culture few get to access. The founders of the pack share their motivations and self-define what it means to be a rider. As characters like Bam and Shawn Sean reminisce about their first experiences on bikes as children, we gain an understanding of the point of entry to this "group" and the important role it plays in their lives.

Juxtaposed against the sensationalized depiction of the dirt bike riders are the sobering and sometimes fatal consequences of their renegade sport. Pug characterizes the end of the age of innocence for children growing up in Baltimore; his youth and vulnerability show on his face, yet equally transparent are his efforts to imitate his hard-edge community.

Throughout the film, Pug tries to find a way in. Coco, frustrated to the brink with his recklessness, considers dropping him off at the police station. But Pug thrives on the chaos. He gets closer and closer to the action with every scene, honing his wheelie skills, searching for his own bike, and even witnessing a particularly brutal encounter as the police swarm the riders.

Background

The 12 O'Clock Boys are the renegade dirt-bike group of Baltimore. They take to the streets on Sundays, in packs of up to 100 off-road and ATV vehicles, converging from all parts of the inner city. Although they parade through the city at high speeds, brazenly disregarding traffic laws, the police are forbidden to chase the bikes for fear of endangering the public. This creates a catand-mouse game with law enforcement who employ helicopters and technology to try to suppress the dirt bike movement. The bikers revel in taunting the police. The urban dirt bike phenomenon has grown in recent years—Philadelphia and New York and other cities also have factions—but the most high octane and irreverent riders are indisputably represented in Baltimore's 12 O'Clock Boys.

For many of the Baltimore youth, the dirt bike community represents a way of edification and mentorship in a city that otherwise has few resources and promise for children. In a neighborhood rampant with drugs and violence, the dirt bike pack seems to be a way of escape.

Director's Statement - Lotfy Nathan

I was attending college in Baltimore and would see the dirt bike pack zoom by once in a while. Neither I nor anyone else in the protected bubble I was living in knew what they were about. I asked around and found that they congregated at Druid Hill Park on Sundays. I went there not knowing what to expect, but found that the riders were very receptive. I made some friends and went from there. Within about a year I was able to get in position to capture some very dynamic action coverage of the riders, thanks to a faction of the group called the WOWBOYZ, who I approached through YouTube after seeing how well they were able to keep up with the pack. They were veterans of the group, and they knew how to negotiate the chaos of following the group. In 2010 I met Pug and knew immediately that there was something very telling in his character, a young boy on the cusp of joining the group.

Filmmaker Lotfy Nathan Discusses the Cast of Characters

Pug: I met Pug as he was turning thirteen. I was introduced to him in early 2010 as I was filming the 12 O'Clock Boys. He was rather soft spoken at the time, though he seemed to be taking note and emulating the manner of the older men around him. Pug, who was riding his little four-wheeler in a field near his house immediately stood out to me. He seemed to embody the character of a lot of kids in Baltimore. He was at the end of an age of innocence and would have to declare the kind of person he was going to be in his environment very soon. In the years that followed, I witnessed Pug gravitate more and more to dirt bike riders, and even as he opened up to me, I saw that he was developing a harder shell. Pug is an extremely intelligent and witty child. His sensibility has been cultivated by living in a community that forced him to come to grips with harsh realities that many people go their whole lives without seeing. He is simply obsessed with riding a dirt bike. For him it is the ultimate validation.





Coco: Pug's mother, Coco, has lived in Baltimore all of her life. At 38 years old, she has found herself a single mother with five kids, struggling against the odds. During the course of production, her eldest son, Tibba, has an asthma attack and dies. Coco finds purpose in becoming a registered nurse, but her path as a single mother of four children isn't any easier. Coco has a very strong personality and needs every bit of it to raise her children with the constant challenges of day-to-day living in inner city Baltimore.



Steven AKA Moe: Steven grew up in circumstances similar to Pug's. His father was never around. He was raised in part by the streets, with a mother who tried her best to keep him on track. He worked his way out of the inner city, and now lives in the county in a nice home with a stable job as a longshoreman at the Baltimore harbor. His son, Steven Jr., attends a private school and has things Steven didn't have as a kid. Still, he believes that it's important for his son to see how the hood functions, and where his roots are. He sees dirt bike riding as a positive outlet for children growing up in Baltimore and

brings his son out every Sunday to watch the pack's parade. He also sees something in Pug and helps him explore the dirt bike world by taking him to safe open spaces to practice his riding.

Lotfy Nathan - Director, Producer, Cinematographer

Lotfy Nathan, 26, is a fellow of the Garrett Scott Foundation, IFP Lab, IFP Spotlight, and a recipient of the Grainger Marburg Grant. His first film: "12 O'Clock Boys" has had preview screenings at Lincoln Center, IFC Center, Rooftop film festival, and Full Frame Festival. He was recently accepted to the Columbia University MFA Film Program.


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High Noon: Taking it to the Streets with the 12 O'Clock Boyz

It's a cool spring evening, and Druid Hill Park is jumping. Cars and motorcycles are parked all along a narrow road near Latrobe Pavilion. Everyone's hanging out by their rides, listening to car stereos and chatting up their neighbors. The road itself is jammed: freshly washed cars, SUVs, and motorcycles, all going back and forth, up the road to the basketball courts and down to the statue of George Washington. It's the kind of slo-mo cruise you'd find at any decent beach, except here the nearest body of water is the reservoir at the bottom of the hill.


The distinct high whine of a two-cycle engine calls from the other side of the reservoir, along Druid Park Lake Drive. It's a dirt bike. First one, then another, then a dozen or more young guys on motorcycles hit the park, weaving along the cruise route and zooming across the grass. The weekly Sunday gathering is hardly quiet, with the sound of the hornetlike motors cutting through the crowd, yet the roadside gauntlet erupts with laughter and shouting. The 12 O'Clock Boyz have arrived.

One rider hits the circuit, leans back on his Honda CR85R, and pulls the front forks high into the air—popping a wheelie. But Wayne, the rider, holds the bike this way for a good stretch of road, turning the handlebars slightly to keep balance and gently nudging the throttle to keep his speed and position in the queue of cars around him. He hits 12 o'clock—vertical, nearly 90 degrees perpendicular to the pavement—and scrapes his plastic back

fender. A few "Yeah!"s and "Goddamn"s fly up. But it's hard to hold, in this stop-and-go traffic, so Wayne drops the front end and cuts to the shoulder, where some of his buddies idle.

Pee Wee's not far behind. He has a little more open road before him, so he's comfortably 12 o'clock on his yellow four-wheel Yamaha ATV, his 5-year-old daughter nestled in his lap. One hand's on the throttle, twisting in quick, herky-jerky bursts that elevate the motorcycle when it starts to flag. The other hand is in the air, a steady fist that punctuates the stunt. He scrapes his fender.

"He carries the beat!" someone yells. "That man carries the beat!"

Within a half-hour, the group has gathered on the empty promenade along the reservoir, down the hill from the pavilion. Nearly 20 dirt bikes circle the stretch of pavement, each guy taking turns going vertical. Guys on ATVs whiz by, their legs

outstretched in an almost balletlike display. A moped goes vertical, looking more like a begging, squatlegged dog than the more elegant beasts that pass him, but the rider gets plenty of cheers. Then the party breaks up with a couple shouts of "Five-oh." Sure enough, a police cruiser, blue lights flashing, has stopped at the top of the hill. Half the crew zips off to meet on the other side of the park, white exhaust smoke wafting into the young green foliage. The remaining bikers wait it out.

With the warm weather, it's like this all the time. Summer is fast approaching: When snoball stands break out the marshmallow pumps and ice-cream trucks endlessly loop that electronic "Turkey in the Straw" tape, the dirt bikes come out of storage. Follow the drone and smoke trails along North Avenue, Reisterstown Road, wherever, and you might catch a glimpse of the 12 O'Clock Boyz.

Young guys have ridden dirt bikes on city streets for years. For many Baltimoreans, it's an annoyance. It's definitely illegal. Though police are instructed not to chase the bikes after a number of hot-pursuit accidents, there are still confrontations. It's also dangerous, with or without police chases. A kid on a dirt bike with no helmet against a truck—guess who wins? There have been a handful of fatalities in the past few years, yet hundreds of local teenagers and young men take the risk.

But the 12 O'Clock Boyz aren't your ordinary dirt bikers taken to asphalt. Their numbers are small—they estimate 15 to 20 core members, with plenty of tagalongs. They laugh at the guys who ride dirt bikes in the woods or on trails—they call them "wingworms," which is "a better word for a dirty person," Pee Wee says. They stick to the streets and the parks, looking for places to ride vertical, practice their form of motorized ballet, impress the crowd—especially the girls—and try to avoid the police. Nor are they into speed, like the street racers—the Boyz prefer urban acrobatics.

The idea is simple: Take your dirt bike, learn how to pull back the handlebars and stay there. You're at 12 o'clock. A scraped fender gets a cheer. Find ways to balance and move around on the bike. Be elegant, be flashy, but don't look like you're trying too hard. "It's just balance and control," a biker called Moe-Town says, belying the amount of practice it takes.

It's another spring day; clouds and a threatening storm keep most of the 12 O'Clock guys home. A few have shown up to ride a stretch of Reisterstown Road for the benefit of a group hanging out in front a car wash and a photographer who's shown up. After a half-hour of pulling stunts, a police cruiser arrives. After the cruiser rapidly backs off the curb, nearly hitting Pee Wee's ATV, he and the cop exchange harsh words. The bikers dissipate.

Pee Wee returns all fired up. The cops should leave them alone, Pee Wee, 27, says. "I'm not doing any drugs or any alcohol. . . . When's the last time you saw a bunch of black people, smiling, without any guns, drugs, or alcohol?" Pee Wee defends his sport, and motorcycles in general, which he and his fellow 12 O'Clock Boyz say is a good outlet for kids in a city that offers few recreational choices. He goes on to list library closings, the lack of basketball courts, dwindling rec centers, the temptation of drugs and alcohol, and the crime that goes along with them. "There wouldn't be any bodies if you let these kids ride bikes," he says.

Moe, 27, echoes the sentiment, saying there's just not enough stuff for kids to do. "Not everybody can play basketball or get into music," he says.

Pee Wee and Moe-Town produced a video in 2001 that captures many of the 12 O'Clock Boyz performing stunts and cutting up for the camera. They've just finished a second video, which they hope will further publicize their group. *Don Diva* magazine recently filmed them for an urban-lifestyle documentary, and the Boyz have been invited to participate in a new motorcycle stunt show called Baltimore Bike Blast, slated for the M&T Bank Stadium parking lot in July. The show is scheduled to feature the motorcycle stunt groups the StarBoyz and the Ruff Ryders. But until then, the show goes on whenever the Boyz hit the streets.

The following Sunday at Druid Hill Park the Boyz are back. Their numbers are fewer, but they ride the gauntlet as usual, provoking shouts and cheers. Down on the promenade, a couple of dirt bikes whiz back and forth. One guy is giving younger kids rides on his ATV. He's going pretty slow, but they love it. After each of the four kids takes his turn, he hops back on his little motocross bike and tries to hit 12 o'clock. Someone suggests they take off their front wheels, to help the balance, but they laugh it off.

After one young bike rider gets vertical for maybe two seconds, he shouts, "We're 12 O'Clock Boyz, too!"

Something's been happening in Baltimore. Massive crews are taking their "off-road only" toys to the streets. The boys in blue are out in



full force on the hunt for street riders, but on a warm Sunday afternoon, the Wildout Wheelie Boyz—numbering in the hundreds—can be found poppin' up front wheels at full speed, whether it's a park hill, a city block or a highway.

Steven, a.k.a. "Honda Moe," created Wildout Wheelie Boyz five years ago with his brothers Hoon and Scony in an effort to unite their love of street riding. "The name came from our style of riding," Steven says. "It's the sickest, wildest style around." The popularity doesn't surprise him. With YouTube giving the world access to their wild ways, some Wheelie Boyz videos have more than 800,000 views. This ain't no amateur hour, though. This is dangerous. It's illegal. And people have died.

While stuntin' on dirtbikes and guads is dope. it's more a statement than anything when it's on public roads. They'll do whatever it takes to stop things from getting rowdy, but when you're dealing with groups of this size and riders of this skill level, it can get out of hand fast. "I've seen people get killed running from the police -crash into parked vehicles and poles. I've seen Baltimore City Police run people right off the road," Steven says regretfully. "We just want Baltimore City to give us a safe place to ride." But that doesn't look like it's happening anytime soon. However, the crew is on the rise, and the lifestyle around these Boyz is intoxicating enough to keep it going strong. Even the kids come out; they hit 12 o'dock on their bicycles while making two-stroke engine noises as loud as their young voices will allow. The Wheelie Boyz are role models of a sort, and that's a more dangerous thing than anybut inevitable nonetheless in a community so tightly knit.

The "wildout" style is part of the culture in Baltimore. "Any rider who can handle their business and not get caught by the police is a Wowboy," Steven says sternly. So if you think you've got what it takes, get your ride ready and head for the 443.

Riding dirty -- Dirt bike culture: Menace to society or art form?

Stopped at a traffic light at Martin Luther King Boulevard in the summer of 2009, Towson resident Jim Gregory watched in disbelief as a teen riding a dirt bike careened across the intersection and slammed into the front of his car.

"I was just sitting there and all of a sudden this guy comes flying," recalls the 55-year-old marketing manager for Safeway. "The bike didn't even stall."

The errant rider picked up his bike and rode away, leaving Gregory to foot the \$700 bill to fix the bumper of his 2004 Chevy Impala.

The experience didn't leave Gregory with much appreciation for the packs of dirt bike riders who speed across Baltimore's residential streets unfettered by traffic lights, speed limits, protective gear — or the law.

"These guys are suicidal, one wrong move and they're dead," he says. "It's dangerous."

But now a newly formed organization of city dirt-bike riders is seeking not only to change the perception that riding dirt bikes is the reckless purview of out-of-control youths, but to turn the activity into a legitimate sport.

"We have the best wheelies riders in the world, hands down," he says. "You got guys who can wheelie with one hand, no hands."

Armed with a raw expository DVD titled "Raise it Up," featuring footage of dozens of riders showing off their homegrown penchant for gravity-defying wheelies, the group is getting the word out about Baltimore's street-bike culture, Bahar says.

"The love of the bike is a worldwide phenomenon and Baltimore is the dirt-bike capital of the world," he proclaims. "I'm getting messages from New York, Miami and even France, who have seen how we do it."

In fact, Bahar argues that in a city where spending on recreation centers has been slashed and a new \$100 million jail is in the offing, dirt-bike riding could serve as a productive outlet for the city's youth and as a way to curb violence.

"I say, put the gun down and pick up the bike," he argues. "At least from the bike we can do things constructive. We can teach how to build a bike; it's teaching them a skill or trade. We can teach them how to ride; they can become a professional athlete."

To be sure, when Bahar speaks about the need for constructive alternatives for city youth he knows of what he speaks, having several of his own brushes with the law.

"I know how to reach the youth because I've been there," he says. "This not just about bikes; it's about human development."

But in a city where dirt bikes have been linked with out-of-control teens, flouting of the law and, worse yet, drug-dealing, can Bahar's plan work?

"It ain't to cause no trouble, it's a way of life, having fun with your peers; no trouble, no drama," says Antoine Oliver, a city resident and former rider himself who is more than familiar with the sense of daring and camaraderie that "Raise it Up" espouses.

"It's like playing basketball; it's a release."

And Oliver is not a casual adherent to the cause. The four-wheel ATV he was riding at 60 mph down Monroe Street this past September hit a patch of gravel, then descended into a pothole and flipped.

"I just lost control," he says, sitting in the living room of his North Baltimore home, a huge snake-like scar over his left eye last week.

When the four-wheeler stopped, Oliver was catapulted like a cannon headfirst onto the street. The bike flipped over, coming to rest on his chest.

"[It] fell on me and then I was snoring for a while, like I was asleep," says the 22-year-old, who spent a week in the intensive care unit at University of Maryland's Shock Trauma Center with a fractured skull, broken eye socket and collapsed lung.

Still, while the accident has given him pause about riding on the street again, it hasn't diminished his support for the young men who do.

"It's more positive than people think," he says.

But not everyone agrees, to say the least.

Eastern District Police Commander Melvin Russell says he is constantly fielding complaints from residents in his district about the bikers. To him, bike riders are a vexing nuisance, not athletes participating in a sport.

"The community believes they are a menace," says the veteran cop.

In a district that spans from the city's East Oliver neighborhood west to Federal Street, Russell says he has been forced to use increasingly creative tactics to confiscate bikes that are illegal to ride, but dangerous to catch while on the road.

"It's a cat-and-mouse game: They hide them inside houses," Russell says. "But you can't store gasoline-powered bikes inside a home."

Thus police accompanied by housing inspectors knock on the doors of homes where authorities have been tipped off that illegal dirt bikes are stored, Russell says. The bikes are then confiscated.

But simply removing the bikes from the community is missing the point, says J. Wyndal Gordon Brown, an attorney who represents a dirt-bike rider suing the police.

"It doesn't really solve the problem," he says.

Brown filed a civil lawsuit last year on behalf of 17-year-old Deon Johnson alleging three plainclothes police officers hit the up-and-coming junior boxer, who was training for the 2012 Olympics, with their car as he sat on his dirt bike on Pennsylvania Avenue in August 2009.

The lawsuit seeks \$3 million in damages for pain and suffering, but Brown says conflicts like these could be avoided if the city set aside a legal area for the bikers to operate.

"They really need to create a dirt-bike park," he says. "Give them a legal place to ride. That would begin to solve the problem."

The idea to build a city dirt-bike park was floated in 2007 by then-Councilman and now City Council President Bernard C. "Jack" Young.

Young introduced a City Council resolution to explore constructing a park on the city's East Side. The measure died, however.

But a new resolution introduced in 2010 seeking to revive the idea has garnered the support of seven council members, including 7th District Councilwoman Belinda Conaway.

"I think it would be a good idea for dirt-bike riders to have a safe and legal place to ride," Conaway says.

The lack of a legal place to ride frustrates Bahar, who says his group would stay off city streets if they had a place to go.

"We've been chased out of every legitimate place," he says.

Thus running red lights and disobeying traffic laws becomes a way to prove a point, Bahar says.

"In any type of revolution or civil disobedience there are going to be some elements of man-made law that are going to be broken," he says. "Look: They handed us this mess to fix ourselves. This how we can fix it." SPECIAL TO B

AUCTION NO MORE

Walk up an overpass that dissects the city's Pulaski Highway impound lot and you'll get a bird's-eye view of some of the spoils of the police department's war against Eastern District dirt-bike riding.

In a dusty lot surrounded by chain-link fence and shrouded with barbed wire sit dozens of confiscated bikes. The city used to sell them at auction, pocketing the proceeds to offset the costs of enforcement, towing and storage.

But not anymore.

"They just crush them now," says Fred Maduro, private tow truck driver and impound-lot regular.

"There are \$2,000 bikes down there and they just throw them away. It's a real waste; the city is losing money," he says.

In 2007 the city made the switch from auctioning off seized bikes to crushing them and selling the scrap metal. Since then, the city has destroyed 2,160 dirt bikes.

"We wanted to send a message," explains Jamie Kendrick, deputy director of the city's Department of Transportation, the agency that runs the impound lot and supervises the auctioning of unclaimed and seized vehicles. "We don't want them on the streets of the city. We learned that too often the bikes were ending right back on city streets. Now we know that won't happen."

Still, before the switch, auctioning dirt bikes was big business.

Between 2005 and 2007 the city netted \$155,000 auctioning off 1,673 bikes, money that went into the police auto-forfeiture fund.

Now the scrapping process yields much less, acknowledges Kendrick, except the certainty a confiscated bike won't end up on the streets again.

The DOT's scrapping policy doesn't faze Munir Bahar, 29, leader of a loose association of city dirtbike riders named Raise it Up.

"We don't care," he says, "bikes are always going to come through." **STEPHEN JANIS, SPECIAL TO B**

BIKING BY THE BOOKS


Baltimore is not lacking laws regulating dirt bikes. Four different sections of city code are devoted to the subject.

- •••• Owing a dirt bike, by itself, is not illegal, but riding any "unregistered motorcycle or similar vehicle" is punishable by up to a \$1,000 fine and 90 days in jail.
- •••• City residents are not allowed to be in possession of such a bike, unless it is properly secured, making a bike not locked down subject to seizure.
- •••• Baltimore gas stations are banned from providing fuel to a dirt bike, under threat of a \$1,000 fine.
- •••• Parents could be thrown in jail for three months for allowing a son or a daughter to ride such a bike, city law states.

In the year since Lotfy Nathan first unveiled his debut "12 O'Clock Boys" to a near rapturous response at SXSW in Austin, Texas last year, he has traveled the globe with the documentary about the dirt-bike riding African-American community of Baltimore, introducing their high-flying hijinks to audiences in Australia and Russia.

"It's funny because it didn't seem exotic to me anymore, [because] I spent enough time [with them]," says Nathan, who had worked on "12 O' Clock Boys" for the last four years. "But this past year has reminded me that it is that. Maybe it sparks something of the initial interest that I had in other people."


Credit for that may not only go to the lively Baltimore bikers, who eschew the rules of the road to take over the city's streets en masse, but the way Nathan presents them in a similarly incendiary fashion as he primarily follows a young boy named Pug as he seeks entry into the titular crew. The first-time filmmaker doesn't sit on the sidelines as the 12 O' Clock Boys ride high, burrowing himself into the pack with his camera and catching all of the visceral thrills that come with it, but he also keeps perspective in the low-income neighborhood he likens to "parts of remote towns outside of Cairo" nearly reduced to rubble where opportunity is limited and creative outlets become precious.

For the British-born Nathan, who jokes he lost his accent "on the school bus" when he moved to America at 10, the project also allowed him to find an ideal way to channel his creativity, watching what was initially conceived as a video piece for a documentary class grow into a feroclous portrait of a fascinating subculture. Shortly before the film opens across the country, Nathan took the time to talk about how he first stumbled onto the 12 O'Clock Boys, relishing his status as a first-time director and getting in trouble with the law over filming.

How did this come about?

I was going in school in Baltimore, studying painting at Maryland Institute College of Art. I'm not from Baltimore originally, so I think that added to my intrigue when I saw these guys riding around the city, maybe a few times over the course of my first few years living in Baltimore. I finally approached them with the camera. I was very wary at first, but they were very receptive to being filmed, so it just barrel rolled from there. It was a matter of exchanging phone numbers and getting more acquainted and then the project got bigger.



The way that you both were able to give dignity to them while portraying the danger of what they're doing is quite striking. Was it a difficult thing to balance?

It required a lot of sensitivity on the editor's part, and he was great. Thomas Niles was cutting his teeth on this film, [his first] where he was really in the drivers seat, but that was something I was juggling with as I was filming and as I was getting to know them more. I was seeing the consequence and the danger and the emptiness of it sometimes because it's fleeting. The freedom, or the sense of freedom that they get is limited.

You actually get the sense that the camera is liberating for them because they're able to broadcast themselves to the world on YouTube, in both what tricks they perform and also when you see a police beating stop because an iPhone is there to document it. Was that something you thought about as you were filming?

That's something that I'm thinking about always now. The way that social media functions as well, now, the most dynamic and used forms of social media are about a quick-fix or validation for an image of yourself, or something that presents your personality. It's like everyone feeds off of that. Everyone is a creator to that level. Instagram, you put something out there and you get these likes and it's very warm and the ability to show disapproval and to complain and to protest online and to protect yourself. Everybody takes part in it. It's the same as Yelp, actually.

Did you see this as a collaborative film? Of course, you do utilize footage shot by the 12 O' Clock Boys themselves.


It matched the concept of the film and the approach. Even in terms of perspective, we tried to give perspective to Pug. With documentary, you can do that in a very tactile, very real way because people film themselves and you can make that authentic. There's nothing like knowing that the first person view you're looking at is actually the character, which can only exist in documentary.

I read you didn't think this would take anywhere near as long as it did, but Pug's maturation becomes the spine of the film. How did what you end up with compare with what you initially had in mind?

It's like being stuck in an elevator for four years. It's funny because it started off very passive, and I think you can see this in the movie itself two-thirds of the way through, there's more steering what's going on in the story. I couldn't have imagined what it was going to be. For documentary, it's a character is delivered through change over time, by definition. It has to take time. Someone can change a lot in a day, but it's hard to get all of that, so you just have to keep going until you're starting to see change and you also push that and accentuate that change in the editing. It was a long learning process, and I can really say I learned the ropes of that kind of independent filmmaking.

One of the things that I really loved about it was the way you moved between some of the more personal stories of Pug and Coco to the community at large, but was it challenging to find a shape?

Yeah, but even that was a lot of push and pull because I didn't like talking head interviews. It's a fine line. We interviewed Department of Transportation, the police department, Department of Public Affairs, city council members we went to town hall meetings,

interviews with victims. Ultimately, it was the verite moments and the real moments that spoke to me more.

When I started the editing with Thomas, there was maybe like 250 hours of footage. I had a messy assembly of two hours of Pug and his family and [about] two hours of the dirt bike riders and culture. I knew that we needed to finesse those together. In terms of balance and proportion, what note to stop on and what note to start on, it was really a lot of Thomas' great work.

Stephen, the guy in the van who films the 12 O'Clock Boys, has this really clear-eyed perspective of what is going on. How did you meet him and did he serve as a guide to you as he does in the film?

I met him pretty early on through YouTube. [In] 2008, I saw he had this YouTube page where he was filming all this really dynamic action stuff with a camera phone and a little handycam out of his truck. He seemed to be in the middle of the whole group and it was incredible. I wrote him, we met at a car wash in East Baltimore, I got in his truck and the rest is history.

Ultimately, what he was saying was so sincere, I think that really helped. When we were editing, I was trying to reduce all these people who I'd gotten to know still into characters. We were calling Stephen, comparing [him to] Charon the Ferryman of Hades in Greek mythology, who carries the souls of the newly deceased across the river. He brings you into hell. Not that [Baltimore] was hell, but he had this great wisdom and he'd seen it and retired from it, but still reports there.

Did you actually ever get on a bike to shoot?

Sometimes. For the most part it was filming out of Stephen's truck.

Was there a particularly crazy day of shooting?

There's a shot in the film where you see this guy, Kevin, at night on top of a four-wheeler, and the camera goes up to him and then slightly below his head and you see this police helicopter light shine into the camera, which is one of my favorite shots that I've ever gotten. But that night, Stephen and I both got a court summons for the Baltimore Police for filming illegal activities, so that was a crazy day for us because the police were starting to take note of this truck that was trying to film what was going on. It was kind of a grey offense because there is certain illegal activity that you can film and be an accessory to, despite virtue of filming. But this is something that really is going on all the time.

Was this four straight years of filming?

It wasn't four years of straight filming. In fact, to be honest, I really tried to run away from it at the end of every summer and say that it was done.

What kept you coming back?

What I had was a real piece of work that I was really passionate about. I felt that it was bigger than me. That was a reason to keep going. I felt it was bigger than me, yet I was trying to hold it up. Very talented, dedicated people also came and did the same. That just made it even stronger.

What drew you to taking that documentary class in the first place?

I really have no idea. I wasn't figuring it out with paintings.

Does this form make more sense to you?

Yeah, it does. I'm a failed artist.

I think you're an artist as is. You're probably the worst person to ask this, but do you think the fact that you and a lot of your crew, including your editor and composer, were also first-timers helped create something different from a lot of other movies?

Absolutely, yeah. It's something I'm kind of worried [about]. It's so easy to unlearn, like why some people have only one good record, or something like that. You don't know how hard it is until you're finished. You can exploit yourself, not knowing how hard it is. The danger is if you become to wary afterwards, too exhausted to do it again. But that resourcefulness when you have limited means, when you're starting out, you're proving yourself. You're outside society. In the middle of the summer in Baltimore, this was all I had sometimes. I look back on that really fondly.

Running Wild, Wheelies to the Wind

They gather usually once a week on dirt bikes of all varieties, cruising down the road, engines revved, wheelies popped as they turn the streets of Baltimore into an urban playground. They are called the 12 o'clock boys, and they are the subject of a new documentary of the same name opening Friday. They are also seen as a menace by some in the city's Police Department and as a danger by some residents.

For the film, the director Lotfy Nathan documented the group on and off for several years, ultimately framing its adventures through the eyes of one young rider, Pug, who admires the group so much he wants to join.

The rides are seen from handlebars or from overhead. There are hand-held shots and virtuosic, slow-motion footage of wheelies so vertical they reach 12 o'clock on a virtual dial. Mr. Nathan tried to capture the riders' exhilaration, even with sometimes dangerous methods.

"Looking back, I probably wouldn't put myself in a lot of the situations that I did," he said during an interview in New York. "I was exploring the city, and there was an adrenaline rush with the whole thing."

The film began as a project in 2007, while he was a student at Maryland Institute College of Art. He witnessed the riders a few times, saw them as a mystery and thought he might film the effort of finding them.

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"I just went out onto the street and asked, 'Who are these guys?' As soon as I asked, people had something to say about the group."

He was initially intimidated. "I'd heard all of these speculative things, like people saying that they're drug dealers or a gang or something like that," Mr. Nathan said, but added, "They were really just a bunch of kids showing off and trying to have fun."





Mr. Nathan wanted to record the aesthetic quality of the ride experience, and that goal morphed into a larger story about how the riders feel they are perceived and how some of them see riding as an alternative to drug dealing or other criminal paths.

"When I first started explaining the project to people, I wanted to bring on board, I would say 'we.' But there really wasn't a 'we' for a long time. It was just me."

Friends helped out occasionally, but the turning point came when he contacted a faction, the Wildout Wheelie Boyz, whose videos have a large audience on YouTube.

One member, Steven, helped Mr. Nathan get a better vantage point. "I took him to the action, showed him who to record and a different way of recording," said Steven, who would not disclose his last name in an interview or in the film out of identity-theft concerns, speaking by phone from Baltimore. He drove Mr. Nathan in a truck among the bikes and encouraged him to thrust himself farther into the action. One such effort involved Mr. Nathan's hanging out the window while Steven held on to him. "Our footage looks like it's from a bike," Steven said. "It's raw, and it's upfront ground zero."




Dirt-bike riders on the streets of Baltimore. Noah Rabinowitz/12 O'Clock Boys

As the project grew and added crew members, the shots became more elaborate and artful. The cameraman John Benam brought his experience with National Geographic Television and Film, as well as a camera that could record a high number of frames per second to create dreamlike slow-motion images.

Using bungee cords, the crew strapped Mr. Benam inside a metal cage in the back of a truck while, Steven navigated the vehicle among the bikers.

But that wasn't the only challenge. There was also the police. In one sequence, helicopters hover and patrol cars monitor a group ride but refrain from a high-speed engagement. While the riders' activity — obstructing traffic, say — might be illegal, the police, the movie claims, have been told not to engage in high-speed chases.

Asked for an assessment of the riders, Eric Kowalczyk, director of media relations for the Baltimore Police Department, said: "If people want to ride dirt bikes, if they are registered — which they have every opportunity to do — they're licensed, they're insured and they're riding in a safe manner, we're absolutely going to support the lawful activities of any group around any associations."

Mr. Nathan certainly had his own run-ins with the law.

"Dealing with the police, I had to be really adaptive," he said. "One day, I would play a naïve college kid who didn't know any better. The next day, maybe I would say I was with HBO documentary films." Mr. Nathan and Steven received court summonses for "filming illegal activity," but Mr. Nathan said they were thrown out.

Biking-group dangers were catapulted into the spotlight in New York City last fall when motorcyclists chased down and beat a driver after he struck one of them, and an ex-policeman and a rider in the film recall the death of a rider in a street accident.

Mr. Nathan said he had mixed feelings about the 12 o'clock boys. He spent time filming a family who lost a relative to an accident with the riders, and, he said, it gave him a different perspective.

"The dangers of the group itself was always very apparent to me, and I would feel conflicted about it," he said. "I never wanted to make an issue film. I wanted to make something that felt personal." He said he filmed interviews with the police and city council members as well as with those who find the dirt bike riders a public threat, but that footage did not make it in.


"Ultimately, I felt that stuff is understood. You can watch the news and get the police perspective." He includes sound bites from radio shows and television news that offer criticism, but in interviews, he decided to focus on the riders' lives.

"That was more valuable to an audience, because it is harder to find out."


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

Short Synopsis

Pug, a thirteen year old boy living on a dangerous Westside block of Baltimore, has one goal in mind: to join the 12 O'Clock Boys; the notorious urban dirt-bike group. Converging from all parts of the inner city, they invade the streets and clash with police, who are forbidden to chase the bikes for fear of endangering the public. Pug looks to the pack for mentorship, spurred by their dangerous lifestyle and deep bonds. He narrates their world as if explaining a dreamscape—an action-packed world full of power and freedom. The film captures this world with unprecedented intimacy as the riders themselves guide us into a culture few get to access. The film presents the pivotal years of change in a boy's life growing up in one of the most dangerous and economically depressed cities in the United States.

The Story

Pug, a wisecracking thirteen year old living on a dangerous Westside block in Baltimore, has one goal in mind: to join the 12 O'Clock Boys, the notorious urban dirt-bike group (riding off-road motorbikes and four-wheelers). Converging from all parts of the inner city, they disregard traffic laws, roadblocks, and the police, who are a constant presence, yet are forbidden to chase the bikes for fear of endangering the public.

Pug's admiration for the riders falls sharply into focus with the death of his older brother—his last remaining paternal figure. Left to his own devices, and at constant odds with his mother Coco, Pug looks to the pack as a means of expression and mentorship, spurred by their dangerous and rebellious lifestyle. Pugs guides us through the treacherous streets of Baltimore as he searches to define himself and join the pack.

Pug's journey is interspersed with the revelation of the group as a whole. He narrates their world as if explaining a dreamscape—an action-packed world full of power and freedom captured with unprecedented intimacy as the riders themselves guide us into a culture few get to access. The founders of the pack share their motivations and self-define what it means to be a rider. As characters like Bam and Shawn Sean reminisce about their first experiences on bikes as children, we gain an understanding of the point of entry to this "group" and the important role it plays in their lives.

Juxtaposed against the sensationalized depiction of the dirt bike riders are the sobering and sometimes fatal consequences of their renegade sport. Pug characterizes the end of the age of innocence for children growing up in Baltimore; his youth and vulnerability show on his face, yet equally transparent are his efforts to imitate his hard-edge community.

Throughout the film, Pug tries to find a way in. Coco, frustrated to the brink with his recklessness, considers dropping him off at the police station. But Pug thrives on the chaos. He gets closer and closer to the action with every scene, honing his wheelie skills, searching for his own bike, and even witnessing a particularly brutal encounter as the police swarm the riders.

Background

The 12 O'Clock Boys are the renegade dirt-bike group of Baltimore. They take to the streets on Sundays, in packs of up to 100 off-road and ATV vehicles, converging from all parts of the inner city. Although they parade through the city at high speeds, brazenly disregarding traffic laws, the police are forbidden to chase the bikes for fear of endangering the public. This creates a catand-mouse game with law enforcement who employ helicopters and technology to try to suppress the dirt bike movement. The bikers revel in taunting the police. The urban dirt bike phenomenon has grown in recent years—Philadelphia and New York and other cities also have factions—but the most high octane and irreverent riders are indisputably represented in Baltimore's 12 O'Clock Boys.


For many of the Baltimore youth, the dirt bike community represents a way of edification and mentorship in a city that otherwise has few resources and promise for children. In a neighborhood rampant with drugs and violence, the dirt bike pack seems to be a way of escape.

Director's Statement - Lotfy Nathan

I was attending college in Baltimore and would see the dirt bike pack zoom by once in a while. Neither I nor anyone else in the protected bubble I was living in knew what they were about. I asked around and found that they congregated at Druid Hill Park on Sundays. I went there not knowing what to expect, but found that the riders were very receptive. I made some friends and went from there. Within about a year I was able to get in position to capture some very dynamic action coverage of the riders, thanks to a faction of the group called the WOWBOYZ, who I approached through YouTube after seeing how well they were able to keep up with the pack. They were veterans of the group, and they knew how to negotiate the chaos of following the group. In 2010 I met Pug and knew immediately that there was something very telling in his character, a young boy on the cusp of joining the group.

Filmmaker Lotfy Nathan Discusses the Cast of Characters

Pug: I met Pug as he was turning thirteen. I was introduced to him in early 2010 as I was filming the 12 O'Clock Boys. He was rather soft spoken at the time, though he seemed to be taking note and emulating the manner of the older men around him. Pug, who was riding his little four-wheeler in a field near his house immediately stood out to me. He seemed to embody the character of a lot of kids in Baltimore. He was at the end of an age of innocence and would have to declare the kind of person he was going to be in his environment very soon. In the years that followed, I witnessed Pug gravitate more and more to dirt bike riders, and even as he opened up to me, I saw that he was developing a harder shell. Pug is an extremely intelligent and witty child. His sensibility has been cultivated by living in a community that forced him to come to grips with harsh realities that many people go their whole lives without seeing. He is simply obsessed with riding a dirt bike. For him it is the ultimate validation.





Coco: Pug's mother, Coco, has lived in Baltimore all of her life. At 38 years old, she has found herself a single mother with five kids, struggling against the odds. During the course of production, her eldest son, Tibba, has an asthma attack and dies. Coco finds purpose in becoming a registered nurse, but her path as a single mother of four children isn't any easier. Coco has a very strong personality and needs every bit of it to raise her children with the constant challenges of day-to-day living in inner city Baltimore.



Steven AKA Moe: Steven grew up in circumstances similar to Pug's. His father was never around. He was raised in part by the streets, with a mother who tried her best to keep him on track. He worked his way out of the inner city, and now lives in the county in a nice home with a stable job as a longshoreman at the Baltimore harbor. His son, Steven Jr., attends a private school and has things Steven didn't have as a kid. Still, he believes that it's important for his son to see how the hood functions, and where his roots are. He sees dirt bike riding as a positive outlet for children growing up in Baltimore and

brings his son out every Sunday to watch the pack's parade. He also sees something in Pug and helps him explore the dirt bike world by taking him to safe open spaces to practice his riding.

Lotfy Nathan, 26, is a fellow of the Garrett Scott Foundation, IFP Lab, IFP Spotlight, and a recipient of the Grainger Marburg Grant. His first film: "12 O'Clock Boys" has had preview screenings at Lincoln Center, IFC Center, Rooftop film festival, and Full Frame Festival. He was recently accepted to the Columbia University MFA Film Program.



Gentlemen:

I represent Taje Monbo who was the who own the copyright in the motion picture entitled "12 O'Clock Boyz." My clients registered their copyright on August 24, 2001 (Reg. No. PAu 002610236). I understand that Oscilloscope, Inc. d/b/a Oscilloscope Laboratories ("Oscilloscope") is the distributor of the film entitled "12 O'Clock Boys," and that the film was produced, and is owned, by The Red Gap Film Group, LLC ("Red Gap").

"12 O'Clock Boyz" is a legendary motion picture that was released in 2001, documenting the exploits of young African-American dirt bike riders in Baltimore, Maryland. The title of the film is a phrase coined by Mr. Monbo to describe the way in which riders would elevate the front of their bikes and ride only on the back wheels until their bikes would be perpendicular to the road or in the "12 O'Clock" position. Mr. Monbo subsequently released the second in a series of 12 O'Clock Boyz films titled "The Paparazzi Edition."

When my clients learned that Oscilloscope had released a film titled "12 O'Clock Boys," they watched it and were surprised to find that the film not only is a documentary about Baltimore dirt bike riders who tilt their bikes into the "12 O'Clock" position, but that the film contains significant excerpts and clips from their original "12 O'Clock Boyz" motion picture. At about seventeen minutes into "The 12 O'Clock Boys," the original title from my clients' film appears on screen:

The title is followed by 15 to 20 excerpts copied from the original film. These clips include shots of PeeWee, Nephew Fred, Weedy, Shorty and Silly as well as scenes of bike-riding exploits, interviews with riders and other commentators, a scene of dirt bikes being washed and even the shot of a young woman being spanked on the backside as she walks away. My clients were not advised that any of these 15 or 20 clips from their film were being used in "12 O'Clock Boys" and did not give permission for their use.

The use of film segments from "12 O'Clock Boyz" (the "Copyrighted Work") in "12 O'Clock Boys" is an infringement of my clients exclusive rights under 17 U.S.C. § 106 to reproduce the Copyrighted Work and to prepare derivative works based upon the Copyrighted Work. The release and distribution of "12 O'Clock Boys" containing clips from "12 O'Clock Boyz" infringes my clients' exclusive rights to distribute copies of the Copyrighted Work and to perform the Copyrighted Work publicly. The remedies available to my clients for these infringements include their actual damages and any additional profits made by Red Gap and Oscilloscope or statutory damages up to \$150,000 as well as injunctive relief, attorneys' fees and costs.

Mr. Monbo is not only the copyright owner of "12 O'Clock Boyz," but he also appeared in the film as an actor. At least two of the segments taken from his motion picture that are shown in "12 O'Clock Boys" feature Mr. Monbo being interviewed. He did not grant permission, nor has he been compensated, for the use of his image and likeness in "12 O'Clock Boys."

The use of the phrase "12 O'Clock Boys" as the title of the Red Gap film constitutes trademark infringement and unfair competition under the Lanham Act. Although trademark rights may not attach to the title of a single creative work, in this case "12 O'Clock Boyz" has been used as the title of an ongoing series of creative works evidenced by the release of a second 12 O'Clock Boyz film, and the phrase has acquired secondary meaning. In addition, the mark has been used by my clients in connection with the sale of sound recordings and clothing. Moreover, the use of the clip "12 O'Clock Boyz, Inc. presents The Official 12 O'Clock Boyz" in the Red Gap film creates the false impression that there is an endorsement by my clients of the new Red Gap film or an affiliation between the original film and the Red Gap film.

Red Gap did not clear, or license the rights to, any of the clips from my clients' film before using them in "12 O'Clock Boys" despite the fact that an online search of the Copyright Office database shows that "12 O'Clock Boyz" was registered in 2001, and that my clients are the copyright owners. The right to use the title "12 O'Clock Boys," and to use the images of Mr. Monbo, were similarly not obtained before the release of "12 O'Clock Boys." Mr. Monbo nevertheless would like to reach an amicable resolution in this matter. They would be



willing to agree to appropriate compensation and proper attribution for the use of their title and clips and for the use of Mr. Monbo's image.

A fair and reasonable license fee under all of the circumstances is serious of any and all gross revenue derived from domestic and foreign exploitation of "12 O'Clock Boys" including theatrical performances, home market performances and all other forms of electronic transmission from the date of release in perpetuity. In addition, for all future uses of "12 O'Clock Boys," we would expect the film to include appropriate credits for the original film and for Mr. Monbo's appearance. If these deal points are acceptable, please send me a detailed accounting of gross receipts to date and the draft of an agreement providing for future payments.

This firm represents Oscilloscope Pictures, Inc. ("Oscilloscope"). Oscilloscope acquired certain distribution rights to the motion picture "12 O'Clock Boys" (the "Picture") from Red Gap Film Group, LLC (the "Licensor") pursuant to a distribution agreement dated as of April 3, 2012 (the "Distribution Agreement"). The Distribution Agreement was validly entered and remains in full force and effect.

It has come to our attention that you have alleged trademark infringement to various of Oscilloscope's sub-licensees and distribution partners. Oscilloscope steadfastly denies this allegation. Prior to the release of the Picture, extensive copyright and trademark searches were conducted and no references to your alleged trademark were uncovered. Further, it is patently clear from the materials you have provided that your trademark was registered long after the production of the film, the entering into of the Distribution Agreement, and the commercial release of the Picture. The release was well-publicized, yet you have never come forward with respect to the alleged infringement.

As your registration was made after the release, and subsequent to appropriate and customary measures being taken to diligence third party rights, the burden is on you to prove the existence of the trademark and no such evidence has been put forth, and certainly not in the appropriate manner and forum.

Oscilloscope takes your actions very seriously. Your actions have interfered with Oscilloscope's business and constitutes interference with contract. Oscilloscope is suffering damages to its financial performance as well as to its reputation with longstanding business relationships. Oscilloscope intends to hold you, your affiliates and your representatives liable to the fullest extent of the law for such interference and for your reckless conduct, all of which has been used intentionally as a tool to extract a settlement. No settlement will be forthcoming. We hereby demand that you immediately cease and desist from all actions in connection with the Picture and that, within three (3) business days of the date hereinabove stated, provide written assurance to all third parties that you have previously contacted relinquishing your claim of infringement, asserting in no uncertain terms that Oscilloscope has the valid right, title and interest to license the Picture, and making clear that there has been no violation of any

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third party right, with copies to Oscilloscope and this firm. In the event you do not comply, Oscilloscope will hold you responsible for all damages suffered and will seek its remedies, at law and at equity, to the fullest possible extent.

The foregoing is not intended to be a full statement of the facts or the law in this matter, and is without prejudice to any rights, remedies or recourse Oscilloscope may possess at law or at equity, all of which are specifically reserved.





Five Questions with 12 O'Clock Boys Director Lotfy Nathan



12 O'Clock Boys, Lotfy Nathan, SXSW Film Festival 2013 Sometimes a story is too compelling not to tell, and that certainly was the case when first-time filmmaker Lotfy Nathan came across the 12 O'Clock Boys — a dirt bike street gang which terrorizes the police, who are forbidden to chase them — while a student in Baltimore. Immersing himself in the world of the riders, Nathan found a protagonist for his documentary in the precocious Pug, a 13-year-old self-professed "man" whose dearest dream is to become a member of the gang. Part coming-of-age movie, part gripping, real-life action film, Nathan's debut — which went through the IFP Documentary Labs in 2011 — has its world premiere at SXSW tomorrow. Prior to that screening, Nathan spoke to Filmmaker about the experiences and challenges of making 12 O'Clock Boys.

Filmmaker: How did you first come into contact with the world and characters depicted in the film?

Nathan: I was attending college in Baltimore and would see the dirt bike pack zoom by once in a while. Neither I nor anyone else

by Lauren Wissot in Directors, Interviews Jul 22, 2019 in the protected bubble I was living in knew what they were about. I asked around and found that they congregated at Druid Hill Park on Sundays. I went there not knowing what to expect, but found that the riders were very receptive. I made some friends and went from there. Within about a year I was able to get in position to capture some very dynamic action coverage of the riders, thanks to a faction of the group called the WOWBOYZ. In 2010 I met Pug and knew immediately that there was something very telling in his character, a young boy on the cusp of joining the group.

Filmmaker: Was it difficult for you to gain access and win the trust of the people you were filming?

Nathan: There are different levels of trust, of course. It was easy enough to go and film the pack on the periphery, though I think it took the whole length of time that I filmed for the riders to see what I was trying to do as a whole. I was lucky to have met WowBoyz_StevenHonda early on. He was the one that really brought me into the mix and vouched for me. I think the best way to "win trust" is to just be there and stick around. You become part of the scenery.

As for Pug and his family, they let me in right away. Coco, Pug's mother, was full of hospitality. She's a great cook and she's got her heart on her sleeve. They're all so colorful. Again, by being there and sticking around I think that is the best way to have access.

Filmmaker: What were your aesthetic goals making this film? Did you have any particular touchstones?

Nathan: At first I wanted to make an action movie. I was getting material that was very animated and exciting. The criminality, the high speed, this is what people seem to register first in seeing the material. It's sensational. At the same time, Pug amidst his family is what makes it and gives it heart. He's the point of entry for an audience. I believe, too, that Pug's example could explain "why" the group exists. Some films I was into while making this one:


Akira, The 400 Blows, My Life as a Dog, The Bicycle Thief, Paris is Burning, 80 blocks from Tiffany's.

Filmmaker: Is there a moment that stands out, for either good or bad reasons, from your time making the film?

Nathan: A great moment was finally seeing the original "12 O'Clock Boyz" VHS street tape. I had heard about it for years, and seen the actual physical tape itself at people's houses on a few occasions still in its wrapping. It was only very recently that Superman, one of the founders of the pack, entrusted me a rare copy of the tape to me to include in the film.

Filmmaker: What was the most significant thing you learned while making this film?

Nathan: "Tomorrow is a day not promised. You could die any minute" – Pug

Seven years ago, as a painting student at the Maryland Institute College of Art in Baltimore, Lotfy Nathan became fascinated by a mysterious gang called the 12 O'Clock Boys.

They were hard to see in action, he said, "but you could hear them a lot."

The rumble of dirt bikes commanding the streets of Baltimore in ritual parades of stunt riding inspired a kind of urban legend. "People thought they were drug dealers, but that didn't make any sense," said Mr. Nathan, who is 27 years old and lives in Williamsburg. "That's the loudest possible way to deliver drugs."

When he finally introduced himself to a crew of the mostly young African-American bikers, and began shooting video of their exploits, Mr. Nathan had no goal beyond making a short art piece. As he got deeper into the scene, however, the project gathered momentum and turned into "12 O'Clock Boys." The film, which opened Friday, captures the rebellious spirit of the bikers, so nicknamed because they tilt the front wheels of their vehicles nearly straight up, like the hands of a clock striking high noon.

While celebrating the visceral excitement of an outlaw sport with crafty photography, the film also observes its dangers to public safety. Police engage the riders in games of cat-and-mouse and attempt to make arrests. Some of the bikers suffer injury or death in accidents, not unlike participants in other extreme sports.

Mr. Nathan, a first-time filmmaker, had a breakthrough in 2010 when he met "Pug," a 12-year-old whose adolescent perceptions shape the story, turning it into a coming-of-age saga. It's not an easy life for a child, but the 12 O'Clock Boys give Pug an ambition.

"You see him becoming a man," Mr. Nathan said. "That age range, from just before puberty, is so significant in Baltimore. You see kids shed their vulnerability and develop a really hard shell. They put it on really fast. They start wearing it before they know what it is."

The senior biker on the scene, a man who only gives his name as Steven, assisted Mr. Nathan throughout the production. "Dirt-biking saved my life," he said during a phone interview. "It gave me something to shoot for."

Now 37, Steven said the bike crews had been riding since the early 1980s but had become more public in recent years. "It was just a thing to do in Baltimore and it grew into this thing we have today. The movie is going to put the true story out there."

Much like the bikers, Mr. Nathan also ran afoul of law enforcement. Early in his efforts, he was charged with filming an illegal activity. "We had to remind them that what we were doing was not illegal," said Eric Blair, who hired Mr. Nathan at his production company in 2009 and became a producer of "12 O'Clock Boys."

Mr. Blair, who had worked on "The Wire" creator David Simon's Baltimore-set shows "Homicide: Life on the Street" and "The Corner," saw the film in a larger cultural context as "another chapter in Baltimore's vibrant history and complex future."

The film's greatest obstacle wasn't dealing with the police or bonding with the bikers—"they were really into talking," Mr. Nathan said—but nailing the majestic slow-motion images of the bikes as they roll in procession. The shots were key because they symbolize the dreamlike quality that being a 12 O'Clock Boy holds for Pug.

"We barely got it," said Mr. Blair, who employed a specially rigged, high-resolution device called a Phantom Camera to capture footage. After much failure and frustration, the crew turned over the truck keys to Steven, who maneuvered the vehicle through the pack of riders to get the film's most spectacular shots.

"If some of the riders had had their way," Mr. Nathan said, smiling, "the film would have been a two-hour wheelie."
