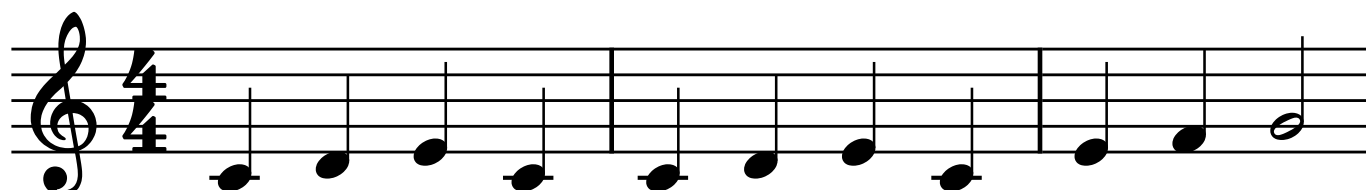

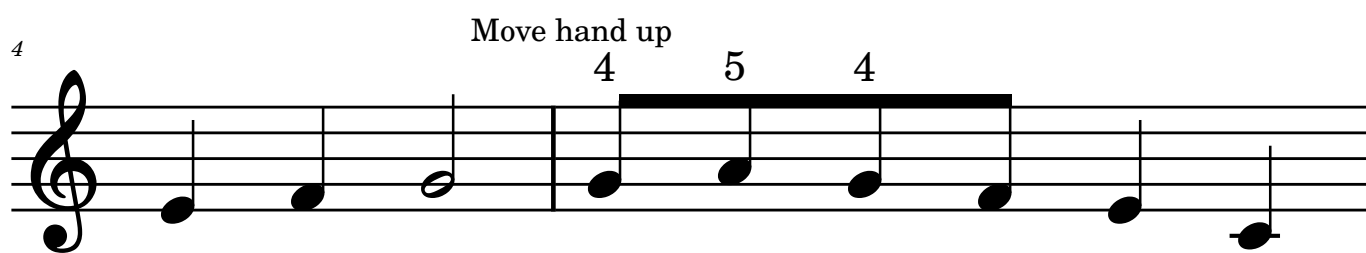

Are you sleep-ing, are you sleep-ing bro-ther John?

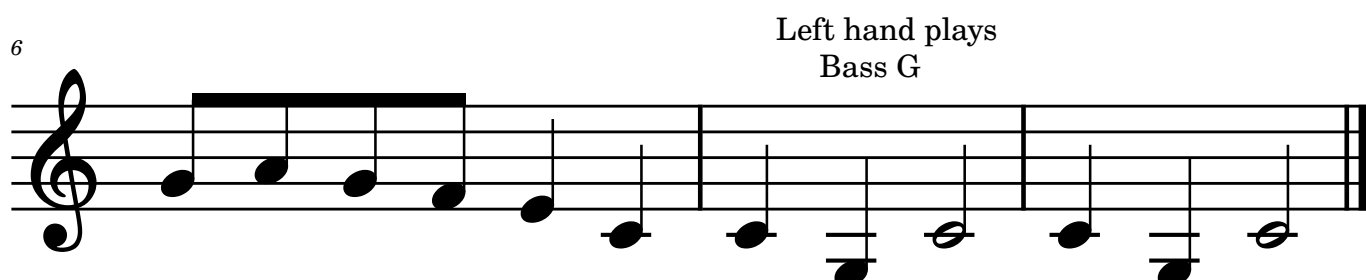
