Providing Firewood for the Winter

A cold breeze is in the air, leaves are tumbling from the trees and swirling in the air.

The distant and ever present sounds of explosions in the distance remind us that the war is ongoing.

So many of the people we relate to have family members who are either fighting or have been killed in the three and a half years since the full scale invasion. Their stories remind us of the uncertainty and pain so many people in this nation are feeling. I know it's an often mentioned request, but pray for peace. Our only hope is in God and His Kingdom, not the empty promises of politicians.

We have received requests for firewood from people living near the front lines. Many people relied on natural gas for heating prior to the war and a lot of the areas near the front have had this infrastructure destroyed.

We are especially concerned about those who have been displaced and haven't been able to prepare for winter, the elderly who are living on a pension which often amounts to less than \$100 a month, and those who are disabled and unable to work.

The poor economy, the dry summer in southern Ukraine and uncertainty about the future have made it very difficult for many people and we would like to help the most vulnerable folks stay warm this winter.

We humbly ask, if you feel led, to donate funds for firewood. We are very grateful for your support and I wish we could pass on all the many thanks and smiles of appreciation from the people your contribution has helped!

The plans are to continue the work into next year. There is still a lot of work to do especially with the ongoing war and random shelling. It is a way to be the hands and feet of Jesus and to reach the people's spiritual needs. We invite your intercession in prayer for us that we can show love to the hurting people.
