Welcome to the 13th Annual Dunn County Open Class Show

Gather up your handiwork, baking, photos, and garden items and bring it to Open Class. We look forward to seeing you there.

- All entries must be the handwork of the exhibitor and have been completed in 2020 - 2021.
- Exhibits must be registered on Fri. morning 9-12 pm, at the High Plains Community Center.
- Judging will be from 12pm until 1pm on Friday.
- Exhibitors may enter items in the following Divisions:
 1. **P - Pre-school Division** - (5 years old & under)
 2. **C - Children Division** - (6 - 11 years old)
 3. **Y - Youth Division** - (12 - 18 years old)
 4. **A - Adult Division** - (18 years and over)
- All exhibits will receive a premium. Top exhibits will receive a superior ribbon or rosette.
- Unlimited entries of exhibits in each Class. Such as Class 5, Lot X a person may bring in stems from Dahlias, Roses, Gladiolus, herbs, Marigold, Petunias, Snapdragons, Sunflowers, Wild flowers, Zinnias and misc. cut flowers.

Class 1 Food & Nutrition Area

All Food Exhibits **MUST** have the recipe attached.

Display on a sturdy paper plate placed inside a clear, re-closable plastic bag. Do not seal with tape or staples. All food items should be safe to eat without refrigeration. Exhibits will be judged on flavor, texture, crumb and appearance. No commercial cake, cookie or any other commercial mixes are allowed.

- Lot A - Yeast & Quick Breads
- Lot B - Baked Cakes
- Lot C - Fried Cakes
- Lot D - Pies
- Lot E - Cookies & Bars
- Lot F - Candy & Snacks

The two approved canning methods are boiling water bath canning for high acid foods and steam-pressure canning for low acid foods. Use standard canning jars with two-piece vacuum caps for all home canned foods. Canned foods must have been prepared within a one year period to judging date and must be properly vacuum sealed. Method of preservation, length of processing time and pounds of pressure used must follow USDA guidelines (product name, date of preparation and processing time must be stated on the label).

- Lot G - Canned or Dried Fruit
- Lot H - Canned or Dried Vegetables
- Lot I - Canned or Dried Meat
- Lot J - Jellies, Jams & Preserves
- Lot K - Pickles, Relish & Salsa

Class 2 Needlework Area

All needlework must be clean. Needlework exhibits will be judged on appearance, choice of materials, workmanship and finishing. Items constructed from a kit need to be specified as such.
Lot L - Hand needle/fabric work
Lot M - Machine Made Items
Lot N - Crochet, Knit or Tatted Item
Lot O - Dolls & Toys
Lot P - Quilted Item
(specify if someone else quilted)
Lot Q - Other

Class 3 Arts, Crafts, and Small Photography Area

Arts & Crafts Exhibits and Drawing & Painting will be judged on general appearance, structural and decorative design and workmanship. If constructed from a kit, please specify
Lot R - Arts & Crafts
Lot S - Drawing & Painting
Lot T - Any Picture
Lot U - Photo Story (3 or more photos)

Class 4 Gardening Area

Gardening exhibits will be judged on appearance (preparation for display): uniformity in shape, size and color. All exhibits must be grown by exhibitor. Display on a sturdy plate.
Lot V - Vegetables

Lot X - Flowers & Plants

Class 5 Crop Production Area

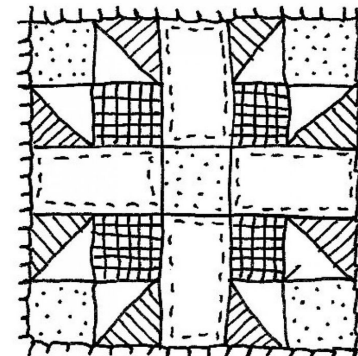
