HOW TO PAINT LIKE THE PROS

A successful do-it-yourself painting project takes more than the right tools and a steady hand. Follow these tips and tricks to make your walls look like they were painted by a pro.



Preparation

- Take your time. That's what the professionals do. Remember that proper prepping and cleanup can take longer than the actual painting.
- Use rubber-backed drop cloths to cover your floors. Old bed sheets and canvas cloths don't give complete protection.
- Store all hardware from outlets and switch plates in a baggie, and label with masking tape.
- When filling cracks in the baseboard with caulk, cut the tip of the tube smaller than you think it should be. Too much caulk can make a mess.
- Invest in high-quality woven roller covers. The cheap ones will leave fuzz on your wall and need to be replaced more frequently.
- To make a perfectly straight line with tape, invest in a tape machine.
- For an extra-professional touch, smooth down drywall no matter what shape it's in with a drywall pole sander. If your walls are plaster, gently sand the necessary areas with a dry sanding sponge.
- Don't forgo primer. A good primer will seal stains, establish an even base and ensure that the topcoat goes on smoothly.

Painting

- Don't open your paint can with a screwdriver, as it can damage the lid. Instead, use a lid opener. Many hardware stores will give these away for free when you purchase paint.
- Always stir the paint with a long wooden stick (usually available at the store for free) until all the sediment on the bottom has been mixed in.
- Use a nail to tap four small, evenly spaced holes in the lip well of a paint can. This will allow extra paint that's trapped in the rim to drip down.
- Don't submerge a brush into the paint more than one-third of the way, or you'll clog the base of the bristles, making clean up more difficult.
- Apply a coat of paint to the backside of the light switch plate in the room. After it dries, jot down all the project details date, paint brand, name, number of gallons required, number of coats applied and any other relevant information.

Clean up

- Don't waste time cleaning if you're going to be painting the next day. Place rollers and brushes in Ziploc or plastic bags and store them in the fridge. Make sure you allow them to return to room temperature before reusing.
- If the store didn't do this for you, dab some paint on the lid to help you identify the color later. Write the name and number of the paint on the lid with a marker.

TAKING CARE OF YOUR HOME'S FOUNDATION

With the past years drought and this year's rain it is important for you to inspect your homes foundation for any potential problems. By following an easy check list you can identify a potential problem before they become a very costly repair.



First check the exterior of your home for indications of the following:

- $\sqrt{\text{Doors that will not open or close properly}}$
- $\sqrt{\text{Gaps at the corner of fascia trim}}$
- √ Diagonal cracks in the wall at corners of doors and windows
- √ Gaps between the garage door and the pavement at either side of the garage door
- √ Windows that are hard to open and close
- $\sqrt{\text{Cracks in the exposed grade beam of the house}}$
- √ Cracks in bricks and mortar

Check the interior for indications of the following:

- √ Unlevel Floors
- $\sqrt{\text{Large cracks in the concrete slab}}$
- √ Gaps above kitchen cabinets
- ✓ Cabinet doors that will not stay shut
- ✓ Diagonal cracks in the wall at corners of doors and windows
- $\sqrt{\text{Curling}}$ and tearing of existing sheetrock repairs
- √ Leaks and cracks in and around the fireplace

Exterior or interior indications of foundation problems could be caused by either settlement or upheaval.

Note that some damage is strictly "cosmetic" damage that does not interfere with the foundation's load bearing capacity. These "cosmetic" items could be cracks in floor tiles, cracks in sheetrock, etc. A qualified foundation repair contractor or a structural engineer can help you determine if the problems you are faced with are cosmetic or will require foundation repair.

Tips for Maintaining a Foundation

In dry periods the soil adjacent to the foundation should be watered to maintain constant moisture. Proper watering is critical as the purpose is to keep the soil water content next to and under the foundation at approximately the same moisture content. The use of a soaker hose is most often the best solution and the soaker hose should be used 24" to 36" from the house. Don't wait too long before watering. If cracks have already occurred in the soil, in many cases starting a watering program at this time is too late.

Drainage- it is very important that ground surface water drains away from the foundation. Surface water should never be allowed to collect around the foundation. Annually inspect the ground from the foundation out at least five feet immediately following a rainstorm. If there is water ponding against the foundation this situation must be corrected by re-grading the area. Downspouts

should be directed away from the house and the water should discharge 3-4' away from the house at a minimum.

Vegetation- Understand the types of trees you have planted near your home. Certain trees have extensive shallow root systems that remove water from the soil. It is suggested that trees be planted no closer than their ultimate height. Plants with large, shallow root systems can grow under a shallow foundation and, as the roots grow in diameter, produce an upheaval in the foundation beam

Observation- during times of excessive moisture changes you must inspect your foundation and note movement signs that signal a

problem. Don't let early warning signs go unnoticed. Call an expert and find out if you have a problem that should be corrected. Not all problems are disastrous. They may only be a signal of something that can be corrected with increased watering or root barriers at a tree. **Acting early can save you money.**

CERTAINTY OF UNCERTAINTY IN 2012

How did your stock portfolio perform in 2011? How has it performed since 1999? Was it a frustrating experience? Most mutual fund accounts had a very small growth in value. The 2 major stock indexes DJIA and S&P 500 Index were unchanged.

For 2012, the level of uncertainty is very high. Growth in USA and Europe is expected to be 2%. A wave of baby boomers is entering the retirement phase. US debt is at an all-time high and growing by the hour. Will USA be in the same league as the PIIGS countries (Portugal, Italy, Ireland, Greece, and Spain)? The Debt to GDP ratio for all these countries is very high. 70% of GDP in the US is consumption.

If consumption slows, the economic recovery will slow down. If crude oil prices go up, it will slow the growth. Stocks of major banks have lost 80% value in 5 years. Technology stocks also have lost a lot of value since 1999.

The first decade of this century is considered the lost decade. Will we have a repeat performance for the second decade?

How can we make sound investment decisions with such lack of visibility? Investing in stocks could be a double-edged sword.



time to be cautious and conservative. Interest rates paid by bank accounts and CDs are at an all-time low. Interest rates for annuities have also dropped. In the past 10-12 years, Indexed Annuities have performed better than mutual funds and CDs.

We can still get 3% interest in short term fixed annuities. When CDs come up for renewal, consider fixed annuities. They are very safe. Annuity accounts are protected by the Texas Life and Health Insurance Guarantee Association. The cap for the total amount of assessment for each account was \$100,000. In April 2011, the governor signed Texas Bill SB 567. The bill raises the amount of the cap from \$100,000 to \$250,000.


