SITE CLEARING OF WATER TREATMENT PLANT

On behalf of the City of Sugar Land, CH2M HILL wishes to notify you that site clearing will begin at the water treatment plant located at the corner of Voss and Burney Roads this week. There will be increased truck traffic starting in early May, as debris will need to be hauled from the site. This will go on for approximately two to three weeks. Traffic will be monitored during periods of increased volume to determine if additional control measures are necessary.

SUGAR LAND ENHANCES SOLID WASTE AND RECYCLING AT LOWER COST TO RESIDENTS

A new solid waste and recycling program will enhance services and save City residents \$800,000 annually.

Sugar Land City Council approved a 10-year contract with Republic Services at an initial monthly rate of \$15.77, a decrease from the scheduled 2012 rate of \$18.62. New service will begin on Dec. 5.

Households in Sugar Land currently provided service by Republic Services will receive automated garbage collection twice per week, automated recycling collection once per week, green waste collection once per week, bulky waste collection once per month and an on-call collection service.

Current curbside recycling will be expanded to include all colors of glass bottles and jars. The addition of a green waste program ensures all green waste -- grass clippings, leaves, brush, tree limbs, etc. -- will be taken to a composting facility and recycled into mulch or compost rather than sent to a landfill.

Also new for every household will be a 95-gallon garbage cart and a 65-gallon recycling cart, though larger or smaller cart sizes may be requested by June 30 if preferred.

Automated curbside collection contributes to the neighborhood's appearance (as residents are issued carts with wheels and lids that have a uniform appearance) and more efficient operations that results in savings to residents. The program also utilizes carts that provide for a reduction in litter, odors and problems associated with animals and insects.

A test of the program in several Sugar Land neighborhoods resulted in a 260 percent increase in recycling, a benefit that results in less trash in area landfills.

Initial educational events pertaining to the new program will be held from 8-10 a.m. on May 21 at Eldridge Park, 2511 Eldridge Road, and June 4 at Lost Creek Park, 3703 Lost Creek Blvd. Information regarding the new program will also be mailed to Sugar Land residents. 

BEAT THE HEAT OF SUMMER!

"It's a sure sign of summer if the chair gets up when you do". -Walter Winchell

Summer defined - in meteorology, summer is defined by convention as the whole months of June, July and August in the Northern hemisphere and the whole months of December, January and February in the Southern hemisphere. The first day of summer in the Northern hemisphere is June 21st. Most of the time it is the warmest season of the year, occurring between spring and autumn and constituting June, July, and August in the Northern Hemisphere.

With the temperatures climbing higher as we get closer to the summer season following are some tips on what you can due to beat the heat this summer.

- 1) Get a programmable thermostat to control your home's temperature. It allows for cooling when you need it.
- 2) Curb the humidity, a dehumidifier can take that sticky humidity out of the indoor air and can be set to a humidity level for custom comfort.
- 3) Block the sun; use blinds and drapery to block the hot rays of the sun. Keep them drawn during the day, especially at peak sunshine hours. Car window tint on the glass of your front door will help cut out the sun. You can purchase the nonglue stick on kind at any auto store.
- 4) Keep the air moving, ceiling fans can not only

make a room feel cooler via air circulation but they can also reduce how often you need to turn on the air conditioning.

- 5) Swap the light bulbs. Fluorescent lights are already known for their energy efficiency, but did you know that when lit the fluorescent bulb does not "heat" up the way an incandescent bulb does? Replace all your incandescent bulbs for fluorescent to save on energy bills as well.
- 6) Check around your windows and doors, inspect calking and insulation to make sure that air is not coming in from window and door areas. Re-caulk if needed



and replace any door insulation if necessary.

7) Cook outdoors. Try to use your barbecue as much as possible in the good weather months. It will eliminate the heating-up effect a stove or oven can have on your home.

Thanks to Home Depot for some great ideas. When the summer heat is on you can still keep your indoor cool!

LTC Pistone received his Bachelor of Business Administration Degree from Texas A&M University, College Station, Texas. In May 1985, he received his commission and the designation of Distinguished Military Graduate.

Upon graduation from the Field Artillery Officer Basic Course, LTC Pistone accepted an assignment in the United States Army Reserve as a Platoon Leader in the 192d Supply Company. In December 1991, he transferred to the 348th Transportation Battalion (Terminal) where he held a variety of staff positions. He was the Battalion S4 from December 1991 to December 1994 and the Battalion S1 from

December 1994 to April 1996. He was selected for command and served as the 441st Transportation (Cargo Transfer) Commander from April 1996 to June 1998. In 1998, he joined the 75th Division (Exercise) as the G4 Transportation Plans Officer. He served in that position from June 1998 to March 2005. Lightning Safety Awareness Week: June 15-19

Lightning can be a beautiful, awe-inspiring spectacle and, as most know, it can also be deadly. The National Weather Service provides these reminders to substantially reduce your risk if you are outside in a thunderstorm.

- * If you drive into a thunderstorm, slow down and use extra caution. Pull off the road into a safe area, DO NOT leave the vehicle during the storm
- * If you are at a beach or a lake where no safe building is nearby, go to your car. Wait 30 minutes until after the last thunder before
- * If you are stranded outside while camping or hiking, on a motorcycle or a bicycle, avoid open fields, the top of a hill or a ridge top.
- * Stay away from tall, isolated trees. In a woods, stand near smaller trees
- *Stay away from water, wet items like rope, and metal objects like golf clubs.




