#### The Importance of a Graduation Coach


The role of a graduation coach extends beyond academic support to include social, emotional, and career guidance. Ways a graduation coach may be utilized are:

- Personalized support and motivation
- 2. Addressing academic struggles
- 3. Developing study skills and time management
- 4. Addressing behavioral and social challenges
- 5. Encouraging college and career readiness
- 6. Identifying at-risk students early
- 7. Promoting a positive school culture
- 8. Encouraging students in the monitoring of graduation plans


#### Graduation Data

- Approximately 79% graduation rate




#### Search and Rescue
