@ What Is It?

History Hunt For Me[™] is a dynamic, 2-hour (per program module), interactive educational <u>platform</u> created by Gather Place Museum and supported by an America250PA Semiquincentennial Grant. Designed to bring American history to life, this experience blends inquiry-based learning, multimedia resources, and historical interpretation to engage students and lifelong learners alike.

Participants work collaboratively to solve clue-based worksheets, scan QR codes to access digital content, interact with life-size cutouts of historic figures, and meet live interpreters portraying iconic changemakers.

Available for scheduling and set-up at your location or on-site at Gather Place Museum in Yardley, Bucks County, PA.
