Thanks for your support. Here are a few highlights from 2021.

Strategic Highlights

2021 was a difficult year for the Kool Boiz Foundation along with most of the world as we struggled to emerge from the global pandemic. Despite fundraising and program challenges, we still managed to execute using technology and the power of our people. Our Promising Men Mentoring program in partnership with the United Way of Youngstown and the Mahoning Valley started back up in-person with 30 mentees. We pivoted and launched a new monthly Virtual Empowerment Series. We selected one more Kool Boiz Foundation \$4,000 scholarship scholar. We also launched our B.E.L.L. Mentoring Program.

Financial Highlights

I'm pleased to say the Kool Boiz Foundation increased our fundraising efforts versus prior year. In 2020 we raised \$42,636 towards our programs and expenses. We've successfully increased our revenue to \$67,074 in 2021.

Event Highlights

The 3rd Annual Cigars and Sundresses event was a hit again. We moved the event outdoors and raised \$4,500. Our 5th Annual Holiday Party with a Purpose was also a huge success, raising nearly \$4,000.

Looking Ahead

New programs and events are on the horizon as we continue to expand and grow our operations. We secured an office downtown Youngstown where we will begin hosting additional programs. We are also launching a new \$2,000 scholarship program for non-college goers.

We sincerely thank you for your continued support and partnership.

KBF COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS

Kool Boiz Foundation \$4,000 College Scholarship Award

The Kool Boiz Foundation College Scholarships are awarded to African American males who plan to attend an accredited 2- or 4-year college or university. To apply, applicants must be a resident of Youngstown, be a graduating high school senior, and have a minimum 3.0 GPA. The Kool Boiz Foundation College Scholarship is a \$1,000 4-year renewable



scholarship (total award is \$4,000). Award recipients must maintain a 2.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale and be enrolled as a full-time student at an accredited 2- or 4-year college or university. Scholarship funds are paid directly to the college or university on the student's behalf and are paid in two installments.

In 2021, the Kool Boiz Foundation awarded one new college scholarship, our seventh scholarship awarded. Tarren Amill, a graduate of Cardinal Mooney High School was awarded this year's \$4,000 scholarship. Tarren is now attending the University of Cincinnati.

Kool Boiz Foundation \$2,000 Trade School/Non-Credit Scholarship Award

New for 2022, the Kool Boiz Foundation will award a \$2,000 scholarship to an African American male planning enroll in a skilled trade or credential program. The criteria for this scholarship will be the same as our College Scholarship. Applicants must be a resident of Youngstown, be a graduating high school senior, and have a minimum 3.0 GPA. This scholarship is for students who plan to earn a skilled trade or credential program (for example, barber school, welding, manufacturing, IT coding, etc.). The scholarship is a one-time award, up to \$2,000 not to exceed the cost of the program, including exam, fees, and credentialing. Scholarship awards for credential programs are paid directly to the program on the student's behalf for credential or certification programs with proof of billing. One-half will be paid at the start of the program and one-half will be paid at the midpoint.

KBF PROMISING MEN MENTORING

2021 Promising Men Mentoring Details



The Kool Boiz Foundation in partnership with the United Way of Youngstown and the Mahoning Valley continues to empower boys and young men of color through our Promising Men Mentoring Program. The program is designed to help young men increase their educational skills, social skills, and leadership skills. In 2021, we resumed in person mentoring sessions at Youngstown Community School with 30

mentees in grades 6th, 7th and 8th. Now in its fourth year, the Promising Men Mentoring program has increased participation rates every year from 10 in 2018, 20 in 2019 and 2020, to 30 in 2021.

Mentoring Makes a Difference

Our mentoring program aims to change the mindsets and behaviors of the young men we serve and help them achieve success in all aspects of their lives. Research shows that youth who have high levels of developmental assistance achieve more and are involved in fewer high-risk behaviors. According to the National Cares Mentoring



Movement, when young people are mentored well, 98% stay in school; 98% do not become teen parents; 85% do not use drugs; and 98% avoid gang participation.

2021 Young Men's Empowerment Conference and Series Details



Our first annual Kool Boiz Foundation Young
Men's Empowerment Conference was held
Saturday, November 9, 2019, at Eastern
Gateway Community College in Youngstown,
Ohio. Unfortunately, our 2020 and 2021
conferences were both cancelled due to Covid19. In response to this temporary setback, the
Empowerment Conference Committee launched

The Kool

Boiz Foundation's Young Men's Virtual
Empowerment Conference Series. This series is a
2-hour virtual empowerment mini-conference held
via Zoom on the fourth Saturday of each month.
These conferences started in February with 21



participants and was held every month except November. The conferences are free for participants and incorporate a point system that rewards participates based on their monthly attendance and engagement. In 2021, the conferences averaged 15 participants per month with a total of 48 different boys and young men of color participating.

2021 Kool Boiz Foundation Cigars and Sundresses Fundraiser



The third annual Cigars and Sundresses Fundraiser was held Saturday, August 14, 2021, at The Soap Gallery in downtown Youngstown. The goal of this event is to continue raising money for our mentoring programs, scholarship fund, and empowerment conference. Over 120 people participated in the event, raising a net amount of \$4,450. The event featured live entertainment by The Michael Austin Project and was presented in partnership with The Havana House, and A&C Beverage. This year's
