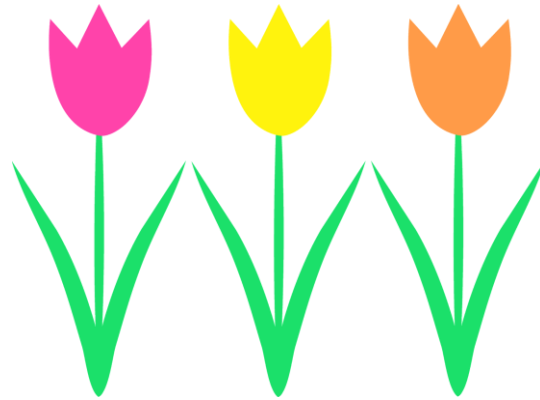


PASTORS MESSAGE:

Reflection for April 27th, 2025

Thomas was a modern man, finding faith hard, like many people today. He was let down by the others who ran away, the leader denied Jesus, his trust in the group of apostles had been abused. That's why we baptise children, because faith grows from the beginning of life.
