**Become What You Receive**

Over the past few months, a committed group of parish leaders has come together to brainstorm, pray and discern about our priorities as a parish moving forward. We have reflected on what it means to live and witness to our faith in a secular society, to gather as a welcoming and inclusive community, to worship in beauty and truth, and to work together for a more just and loving society.

This has been echoed in the liturgies we have been celebrating. Our faith in the Resurrection reminds us that we are an Easter people: that in Christ and with Christ, we rise to new life. At Pentecost, we proclaimed our identity as a Spirit-filled people, empowered to bear witness to a diversity of gifts in one Spirit. Last Sunday, we were reminded by our guest preacher Fr. Tim Silver that we are created in the image of the Trinity: our God is overflowing communion of love.

Today, as we commemorate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, we celebrate that we are a Eucharistic people. We who receive the Body and Blood of Christ become Christ's Body, broken for others, his Blood poured out in love for all humanity. Today's readings express that profound mystery: Moses reminding the people how a provident God fed them with manna in the wilderness; Paul recalling that we who partake in the one bread and one cup are one in the Body of Christ; Jesus promising the gift of eternal life to those who share in his Body and Blood.

When the faithful approached the altar to receive Holy Communion, the Bishop and theologian St. Augustine would say: "**Receive what you are; become what you receive: the Body of Christ.**" Still to this day, we are a people formed and shaped by the Eucharist. We are his hands, his feet, his presence in the world. As we are transformed into the Body of Christ, we are sent out to transform the world.

Next Sunday, after our special 10.30 Mass, we will gather to celebrate the dozens of volunteers who share their time and talents so generously within our parish: each one unique, precious, and irreplaceable. So let us be transformed ever more surely into the One we receive: for **we are the Body of Christ!**

## **Reflection for Corpus Christi**

The people listening to Jesus did not understand the words, 'I am the living bread that came down from heaven'. When he said, 'unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you', Jesus was not speaking literally but metaphorically. With metaphor, the qualities of one thing, bread and wine, are figuratively carried over to another, flesh and blood. We receive the Body and Blood of Christ in the Eucharist as food for the soul and as a reminder that Jesus shed his blood so that we might abide in him.
