Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jesus beginning His ministry in Galilee of the Gentiles, fulfilling prophecy about light in darkness, calling fishermen disciples (« fishers of People »), and proclaiming the « Kingdom of Heaven is near », calling for repentance and a radical shift in life, leaving behind old patterns (nets) for a new way of following Him, bringing healing, and casting a new light on God's presence among all people. It's a call to leave comfort zones for a challenging yet hopeful life of discipleship, reflecting God's light by living differently and gathering others.

January 25th: Sunday of the Word of God and Christian Unity Week

This Sunday invites us to deepen our love for **the Word of God** while also renewing our commitment to **Christian unity**. Both celebrations flow from the same divine source: God's living Word, which calls all believers into communion with Him and with one another.

In the Gospel for this Sunday (Matthew 4:12–23), Jesus proclaims, “*Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!*” and calls His first disciples to follow Him. This moment marks the beginning of their shared journey — a journey shaped by hearing, responding to, and living out the Word. As the disciples leave behind their nets, they manifest their willingness to let go of their past divisions and personal agendas, so as to walk together in Christ's light.

As we conclude today the **Week of Prayer for Christian Unity**, we are reminded that the Word of God does not belong to one denomination, community, or tradition alone. It is a gift meant to unite us, to draw Christians beyond differences toward the one faith, one hope, and one baptism that we share (Eph 4:4–6). Listening to Scripture together allows us to hear God's voice calling us not to rivalry or exclusion, but to reconciliation and mutual love.

Pope Francis established the **Sunday of the Word of God** in 2019 to help us rediscover the transformative power of Scripture in our lives and communities. When we allow God's living Word takes root in our hearts, it breaks down barriers of ignorance, prejudice, and indifference. It truly becomes the seed of unity — for the light of God's Word shines on all who seek truth and peace. It is a gift given in order to be shared.

As we celebrate today both the **Sunday of the Word of God** and the end of the **Week of Prayer for Christian Unity**, let us pray that the Scriptures will awaken in us a deeper longing for unity and a renewed zeal for evangelization. May we listen together to the Word, walk together in faith, and witness together to Christ, the Living Word who makes us one.
