Operation: Ghosts of the Jungle

1. SITUATION

a. Enemy Forces

Opposing forces are simulated and consist of historical scenario-based targets and engagements inspired by Vietnam-era combat environments. Expect unconventional engagements, limited visibility, and problem-solving under pressure.

b. Friendly Forces

Participants include shooters, cadre, and Range Safety Officers (RSOs) operating under Task Force Garrison control.

c. Attachments & Detachments

- RSOs assigned per range
 - Event cadre and scorers
 - NDOW presence for fishing activities (24 April)
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2. MISSION

Task Force Garrison conducts **Ghosts of the Jungle** on **24–25 April** in order to deliver an immersive, historically inspired tactical shooting experience focused on marksmanship, movement, and decision-making under controlled conditions.

3. EXECUTION

a. Commander's Intent

Deliver a safe, disciplined, and immersive event that balances realism with control. Safety is priority one, experience is priority two, performance is priority three. Bring the energy, but keep it inside the guardrails.

b. Concept of Operations

Operations conducted in two phases:

Phase I: Arrival & Preparation (24 April)

- Range open for:
 - Camp setup
 - Weapons zeroing
 - NDOW fishing activities
 - Administrative and prep period
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Phase II: Event Execution (25 April)

Timeline:

- **0700–0800** → Breakfast
 - **0800–0900** → Safety Brief & Opening Remarks
 - **0915–1130** → Event Underway (Morning Rotation)
 - **1130–1230** → Chow
 - **1230–1430** → Event Underway (Afternoon Rotation)
 - **1430–1530** → Open Downtime
 - **1530** → Awards Ceremony
 - **1600+** → Range open for camping and regulated shooting
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c. Tasks to Participants

- Arrive with required gear (reference TaskForceGarrison.org gear list)
- Attend mandatory safety brief
- Follow all RSO commands immediately
- Maintain positive control of weapons at all times
- Execute courses of fire per instructions

Weapons & Ammunition Notes:

- **MACVSOG (RT Idaho) Course** → Weapons and ammunition **provided**
- **Dawn of Tet Course** → Weapons and ammunition **provided**
- **Sniper / Bolt Gun Users:**
 - If using a **provided bolt-action rifle**, bring:
 - **60 rounds of Hornady Precision Hunter 143gr ELD-X (6.5 Creedmoor)**
- Personal weapons must be zeroed prior to event start (24 April strongly recommended)

d. Coordinating Instructions

- Cold range unless directed otherwise
 - Eye and ear protection required on all active ranges
 - Muzzle awareness is mandatory at all times
 - All shooters will immediately obey “CEASE FIRE”
 - Hydration and environmental awareness are individual responsibilities
 - Scoring criteria varies per event (accuracy, intel gathering, and subjective “vibe” elements)
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4. SUSTAINMENT

a. Logistics

- Participants responsible for:
 - Personal weapons (if used)
 - Ammunition (except where provided)
 - Individual gear per gear list
 - Chow provided during designated windows
 - Camping is self-supported
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b. Medical

- Emergency procedures briefed during safety brief
 - RSOs coordinate initial response
 - CASEVAC plan on-site and briefed
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5. COMMAND & SIGNAL

a. Command

- Overall Control: Task Force Garrison
 - Range Master: Identified during safety brief
 - RSOs maintain authority on assigned ranges
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b. Signal

- Primary: Range radios (channel briefed on-site)
 - Emergency: Verbal “CEASE FIRE” and visual signals
 - Immediate compliance required from all personnel
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ENDSTATE

All shooters complete the event safely, experience an immersive operational environment, and walk away with a mix of dirt, brass, and stories that will absolutely grow in the telling.
