Sawyer White and our youngest member his son Damian, with his wife and Damian's mother and Dave Nelson. Sawyer and Damian are the descendants of Simms Brown (1760-1822) who at age 15 enlisted in the South Carolina Militia as a scout, He served in the Spartan Regiment under Brig. Gen. Andrew Pickens and Colonels John Taylor, Jr. and Philemon Waters. He likely fought in a number battles near Newberry County where he lived, many of the major battle in South Carolina were fought in this north central region of South Carolina, Cowpens, Kings Mountain, Ninety-Six, and Camden

Ryan in descendant of Sgt. Nathan Kinney, 11th Connecticut Militia Regt. and Emeric of Colonel Johannes Knickerbocker, commander of the 14th Albany Militia Regiment



Sgt. Nathan Kinney (1750-1798) served in the 11th Connecticut Militia Regt, Capt Zabadiah Ingall's Co.,commanded by Col. Ebenezer Williams. This regiment was commanded initially by Israel Putnam who was promoted to Maj. General in the Continental Army, the 11th marched to the Siege of Boston in 1775 and fought at Bunker Hill. Williams commanded the regiment from 1776 to his death in 1780. Kinney's name appears on the muster rolls of the 11th in 1776, Westchester Co., N.Y. His enlistment and discharge dates are not known, the 11th fought at the Battle of Brooklyn, the early New Jersey campaign of 1776 and the Battle of Rhode Island in 1778

Emeric du Mas de Paysac is descendant of Col. Johannes Knickerbocker, who commanded the 14th Regiment of the Albany Co. Militia. The 14th Regiment was in Brig. Gen Abraham Ten Broeck's Albany Co. Militia Brigade at 2nd Saratoga (Bemis Heights) on the left wing. Col. Knickerbocker and his son of the name a private in his regiment were both wounded in action, he was also present at Burgoyne's Surrender.

Additionally, Emeric is also eligible through Col. Zebulon Butler, through whom his uncle and a number of cousins have joined the

French SAR society. Butler was a Connecticut Line Colonel who was command at Forty Fort during the Wyoming Valley Massacre in Pennsylvania in 1778, he additionally commanded troops in the retaliatory Sullivan's Expedition against the Iroquois in 1779. He is also a descendant of Comfort Sands, one of five patriot brothers of Sands' Point, now Nassau Co., NY, Comfort was a member of New York Sons of Liberty who with Isaac Sears led the raid on the Arsenal at City Hall in 1775 and also an early militia soldier and paymaster of New York troops.

The Battle of Brooklyn lost a true friend this past May 17th. Dave Elligers was the long serving President of the Friends of Historic New Utrecht, he was found deceased in the work shed at the cemetery by the volunteers who had arrived to take part in the "Spring Clean Up" under Dave's supervision. He was a retired attorney and local historian and was descended from some of the early founding Dutch families of New Utrecht. Norm Goben, Mike Grillo, George Tonkin and I go back quite a few years with Dave through participating in the annual "Liberty Weekend" and being a part of the Friends of New Utrecht historic lecture program, additionally he was always a big help to Jerry and John Meekins in finding patriot graves to be marked in the New Utrecht Cemetery. Dave always loved telling the history and story of "New Utrecht Liberty Pole" and how it was the last thing the British saw as they evacuated New York in 1783 and sailed back to England. You will be sorely missed, RIP Dave.





This regiment was raised in June and July of 1775 from riflemen on the Pennsylvania frontier and the first non-New England troops to reach Boston after Bunker Hill.
