Bishop Samuel Provoost (1742-1815)

A little aside on Bishop Provost he was the nephew of Gen. William "Lord Stirling" Alexander and son of Stirling's ½ brother John Provoost, their mother who married twice was Mary nee Spratt Provoost Alexander. Samuel Provost was ordained to the Anglican priesthood in 1766 and was appointed Associate Rector at Trinity Church, his outspoken Whig politics rubbed the Loyalist vestry the wrong way and he was dismissed in the early 1770s. After the war and British occupation in 1784 he was appointed Rector at Trinity and consecrated Bishop of New York in 1786.

GENERALOGY CORNER

Revolutionary War Vocabulary You may across these ranks and designations in your research

Spy- When one thinks of a spy, they might think Hercules Mulligan, Robert Townsend's Culper or Mersereau brother's spy rings and with clandestine intelligence gathering. It can also refer to scouts and rangers who gathered intelligence on British troop or their allied Indian movements. They were often local militiamen that "who knew the lay of the land" as in the case of James Fitz Randolph in New Jersey (see James Longstreet). They usually worked in small squads of a few soldiers and watched known points of traverse, river fords and ferries, roads and trails or gaps and passes in mountains, Two noted Indian Spies were Capt. Sam Brady of the 8th Pa. and Capt. John Montour, a Metis who commanded a company of allied Delaware scouts, both attached to the Western Dept under Col. Brodhead. Indians spies dressed in Native American style, if noticed from distance they would seem to be Indians. Surveyor is a similar term applied to militiamen or sailors involved in coastal defense who watched the coast, bays and ports for British naval and merchant ship movements

Captain Lieutenant- This rank was a carryover rank from the British Army command structure and was used by some regiments in the Continental Army or Militia. A Captain Lieutenant was in between a 1st Lieutenant and Captain in rank, his duties were the command of a Colonel's 1st company, he ran the companies administrative duties on the day to day basis and in the Colonel's absence. Captain's duties and 1st Lieutenants pay. Caleb Brewster of the Culper spy ring courier held this rank in the 4th New York Regiment.

Lieutenant Colonel Commandant – This was a term adopted later about 1780 in the Continental Army and Militia. This was a senior Lt. Colonel that

commanded a regiment. In the British command structure a Colonel often commanded a regiment made up of two battalions commanded by two Lt. Colonels, about twice the size of an American regiment commanded by a Colonel, in oter words a British Battalion was about the size of an Contiental regiment This designation was used to facilitate in prisoner of war exchanges of Colonels and Lt. Colonels. In the 1780 organization of the Pennsylvania Militia redesignated all their Colonels to Lt. Colonels in command of battalions.
