Liberty Pole Day 1 June 2024 New Utrecht Reformed Church

The New Utrecht Liberty Pole

"The church grounds are easily identifiable from miles around by the 106' tall Liberty Pole on its front lawn. The New Utrecht Liberty Pole is the sixth one erected in succession on the church grounds. A bronze tablet at the site is inscribed with the following:

"This Liberty Pole marks the spot over which the American flag first waved in the town of New Utrecht. The original pole was erected by our forefathers at the Evacuation of the British, November 1783, amid the firing of cannons and demonstration of joy." This an annual event at New Utrecht, historian Dave Elligers gave a talk on the history the New Utrecht Liberty Pole. Norman Goben and I gave short presentation on the "Dress of the Riflemen" focusing on the "Hunting Shirt". I spoke on the 1st Continentals aka 1st Pa. and their march from Boston, encampment at Brooklyn and skirmishes with the Hessian Jaegger Corp at Flatbush on the days leading up the Battle of Brooklyn. Norm finished up with a presentation of the "Defenses of New York Harbor,1776", focusing primarily the on Lower Manhattan, Brooklyn, and the British flotilla and landing at Gravesend from Staten Island prior to the battle. George Tonkin was also in attendance dressed as one of Glover's "Marbleheaders", also a big salute to George for mowing the knee high grass at the cemetery. In the fall I will be giving a more comprehensive lecture on the "Riflemen in Continental Army" at New Utrecht.

Last year's event was great success with SAR compatriots from as far a Kentucky, Maryland and Virginia attending as well many local members



Last Year's Event DAR and SAR




Last Year's SAR Color Guard, Musket Squad and Maryland National Guard



ONE LAST THING

I came across this vintage print in a thrift store and recognized the artist as Arthur Szyk (1894-1951) it shows George Washington as a Mason. Syzyk

was Polish born Jewish illustrator trained the "illuminate Medieval manuscript style" He was best known for anti-Nazi cartoons, Judaica and book illustrations but also did quite a few illustrations of American patriotic themes such of this one of George Washington. He fled Europe in 1940 and settled in the U.S.

"Another great historical series Szyk created was Washington and his Times, which he began in Paris in 1930. The series, which included 38 <u>watercolours</u>, depicted the events of the <u>American Revolutionary War</u> and was a tribute to the first president of the United States and the American nation in general. The series was presented at an exhibition at the <u>Library of Congress</u> in Washington, D.C. in 1934. It brought another decoration to Szyk – this time the George Washington Bicentennial Medal from the American government. [18][19] "
