- 4. Gary Lane has secured permission at Trinity Church in Manhattan to mark ten patriot graves in their historical churchyard this summer, this a good stroke of

fortune, this will be a major National 250<sup>th</sup> Event with the President General and Historian General are likely to be in attendance, as it stands now this will take place this August the 17<sup>th</sup>. Three preeminent Founding Fathers are being honored are Alexander Hamilton, Francis Lewis and Hugh Williamson (see complete list of patriots to be honored in GG #13)

# GREEN-WOOD CEMETERY RAWLEY AMERICAN LEGION POST 1636 250<sup>th</sup> HISTORIC SIGN, LIBERTY TREE and PLAQUE DEDICATION APRIL 12<sup>th</sup>, 2025 BROOKLYN

The Battle of Brooklyn Chapter hosted this major 250<sup>th</sup> Anniversary event we were joined the 1<sup>st</sup> New York Continental Chapter, National and Regional officers, about twenty compatriots in all. Green-Wood Cemetery the final resting place of over sixty Revolutionary War soldiers and patriots and American Legion Post 1636 are both within the heart of the site of the Battle of Brooklyn.(See GG #13 for additional information on the installation and historical background on this event.)

First, a 250<sup>th</sup> marker was unveiled by Joe Vermaelen, NSSAR VP General-North Atlantic, Dave Nelson and Green-Wood Historian Jeff Richman. The Color Guard was

commanded by Robert Meyer, NSSAR Vice Color Guard Commander, which consisted of Battle of Brooklyn compatriots, Dave Nelson, Norm Goben, Brian Ante, Gene Hough. David Peters, associates Mike Grillo Sr. and Jr., Jim Sarlo, George Tonkin and the Boy Scouts of Troop 237 and the JROTC of Ft. Hamilton HS. The Color Guard led the crowd numbering nearly one hundred to the cemetery Chapel. The program was led by chapter Pres. David Nelson and invocation and closing prayers by Chaplain Rev. Evan Cummings.

- Wreathes were laid by state and local ESSSAR officers, DAR, CAR, New York Sons of the Revolution, American Legion, and the Knights of Columbus, also represented was the Society of Old Brooklynites.

These troops were part of Gen. Stirling's Brigade, Smallwood's Maryland 400, Haslet's Delaware Bn, Mile's and Atlee's Pennsylvania State Rifle Regt, the Pennsylvania Flying Camp and Militia Bns. of Lancaster, Berks and Northampton Counties and Huntington's 17<sup>th</sup> Connecticut Continentals of Parson's Brigade who were cut off from the retreat at Battle Hill, taken as POWs at the site of the Liberty Tree planting.





### 250<sup>th</sup> Anniversary, 18 April 1775-2025 Paul Revere's Ride and the Battle of Lexington and Concord Staten Island Reformed Church

The Battle of Brooklyn Chapter commemorated the 250<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Paul Revere's Ride and the Battle of Lexington and Concord, the beginning of the American Revolutionary War, we were joined by the DAR and Friends of the Reformed Church. This "Two Lights' event was a national event with many SAR and DAR chapters involved. Dave Nelson spoke on the historical background of Revere's Ride and read from Henry Wadsworth Longfellow's classic poem and I spoke on the Penobscot Expedition where Longfellow's grandfather Brig. 


