Oakley Park Museum was completed by Capt. Daniel Byrd Jr. in 1835 and opened as a museum in 1941 and is on the National Register of Historic places. The house was most famously home to General Martin Gary, CSA, a powerful influence during reconstruction. Displays include American History from The War of 1812 up to the Spanish American War.
