#### Education Director's Report

The Summer Olympics are underway in Tokyo, but with quite a bit of uncertainty due to the Covid-19 virus. Two thoughts that hit home are that we will no longer see glimpses of Brother Rome Milan, our Sokol historian from Fort Worth, holding up the USA flag in the spectator's seats at the gymnastics events. So frequently on camera, NBC once issued a challenge to viewers to "Find This Man Everyday" during their Olympic broadcasts. Sadly, Rome succumbed to ALS this past April. The other connection Sokol has with the Olympics is in the origins of the Olympics of the Modern Era, as I heard Bro. Rome explain a few years ago.

- 1862 The Sokol physical fitness organization was founded by Dr. Miroslav Tyrš and Jindrich Fügner. At first only men participated, but apparatus was a part of the program from the start: pommel horse, a real horse, rings, horizontal bar and parallel bars.
- 1882 The first Sokol gathering "Slet" for physical games and competitions in Prague drew 700 participants.
- 1889 Members of Prague Sokol participated in the World's Fair in Paris, creating interest among the French for the Czech culture.
- 1891 The second Sokol Slet in Prague had more than 2,400 participants and 7,000 spectators. French Baron Pierre de Coubertin attended as a spectator. This grand international event, sparked his vision to create a similar international event for all sports, and thus the idea of a Modern Olympic Games was born. During the mid-1800s, a number of small local competitive games calling themselves Olympics were being organized throughout Europe, but were nowhere near the magnitude of the 1891 Slet that proved so inspirational.
- 1895 The third Slet brought together 5,000 participants including adolescents and non-Czech foreign nationals and more than 30,000 spectators.
- 1896 The games of the First Olympiad of the Modern Era were held in Athens, Greece.
- 1901 Women were included for the first time as participants in the Sokol Slet. Women's gymnastics events were not a part of the Olympics until 1928. The American Sokol was a pioneer of Women's Modern Rhythmic Gymnastics, which became an Olympic event for the first time in 1984.

While the Sokol program is based fundamentally on general fitness for people of all ages to improve health, fitness level and overall well-being, there are Olympians in our ranks. These are a notable few:

- Sister Mildred Prchal introduced rhythmic gymnastics into women's training after studying this new concept in Prague and Paris in the 1920s.
- Brother Frank Kriz, Sokol New York, won a gold medal in the long horse vault at the 1924 Olympics in Paris. He was also a member of the US team in 1920 and 1928. The 1924 US team also included these Sokol men: Bros. Rudolf Novak, Sokol Cedar Rapids; Frank Safanda, DA Sokol New York; and Edward Knourek, Chicago.
- Sister Laddie Hniz Bakanic, Sokol New York, was a member of the US Olympics Gymnastic team for the 1948 London games.
- Sister Marie Provaznikova, who defected during the 1948 London Olympics and immigrated to the United States, became president of Sokol New York and taught gymnastics for most of her life.
- Bro. Jim Hartung, Sokol Omaha, was a member of the 1984 US Olympics Gymnastic team, which won the Gold.
- Sister Pauline Gardiner Milan, now manager of Sokol Fort Worth gymnastics, competed in the 1964 Tokyo Olympics on the New Zealand team. She was also on the staff of the 1984 Olympic Games in Los Angeles.

#### Bernice Hamilton 1934-2021

Sokol lost a long-time dedicated member on July 16, 2021. You might say Bernice Hamilton was born into the Sokol life. Her Grandfather, Alois Jurcik, was known as the Father of Sokol in Texas. He was one of the founders of Sokol KHB in 1908 and our first President serving from 1908 to 1910. Her Father, Charlie A. Jurcik, was President 1965 to 1968.

Bernice began Sokol gymnastics as a little girl and as an adult was an instructor. Her children continued the Sokol gymnastics tradition and later became instructors.

She served many rolls in Sokol KHB including helping with bingo, Kitchen Chair, Treasurer, and Financial Secretary to name a few. She was the Southern District Treasurer for 20 years.

Helping in the kitchen was probably one of her favorite things to do however she always had time to take off her apron and take a spin or two on the dance floor. She was known for leading the kitchen crew in making Kolaches for the Polka Festival for many years. About three years ago father time caught up with her hampering her kitchen endurance.

At a Sokol volleyball tournament, Bernice met a young man, Harrell Hamilton, when she bounced a ball off his head. They fell in love and married on August 29, 1953.

Bernice Frances Jurcik Hamilton was born in the town of West to Charlie A. Jurcik and Annastazie Elleven on March 21, 1934.

She is survived by her children Stuart and Margie Hamilton, Mark Hamilton, Becky and Bill Snodgrass, and Tracy and Raymond Toupal, Brother Charles L. Jurcik and wife Rose, Sister Jeanette Zajic and husband John, 14 grandkids and their spouses, 28 great-grandkids, 2 great-great -grandkids and much-loved daughter in law Dee Dee Hamilton.

Bernice was preceded in death by her parents, husband Harrell L. Hamilton, son Lee Hamilton, daughter-in-law Carolyn, and great-grandson Cole L. Hamilton.
